Complaint Allegations

If a program disagrees with a licensing finding, the program may request a review of the finding(s). Rule: 5101:2-12-18 Ratio

Code: The program is required to maintain the appropriate staff to child ratio for each group served.

Allegation: Staff-child ratio requirements are not followed.

Determination: Substantiated

Findings: During the inspection, it was determined that required staff/child ratios were not maintained for different groups on multiple occasions, as noted below:

Child care staff members and the program administrator stated that there have been times when classrooms were over ratio due to limited staffing. During the inspection, children were moved between classrooms to maintain ratio.

Additional staff members must be hired or current Child Care Staff Members must be rescheduled to maintain compliance. Provide staff training. Submit the program's corrective action plan, which includes a statement that training was provided, to the Department to verify compliance with the requirements of this rule.

Domain:01 Ratio & Supervision

Rule: 5101:2-12-19 Supervision

Code: The program staff is required to supervise children in their assigned group by sight and hearing. Supervision includes being near enough to respond and reach children immediately including responding to the child's basic needs and protecting them from harm.

Allegation: During nap time, one child put a tape-like material over another sleeping child's eyes and nose.

Determination: Substantiated

Findings: During the inspection, it was determined that children were not being properly supervised as noted in numbers 4, 5 below:

- 1. Child(ren) were not within both sight and hearing of a child care staff member during indoor play.
- 2. Child(ren) were not within both sight and hearing of a child care staff member during outdoor play.
- 3. Child(ren) were not within both sight and hearing of a child care staff member more than once.
- 4. Staff were not physically present in the space and near enough to respond and reach the child(ren) immediately.
- 5. Other: During nap time, a child was able to peel clear contact paper from a toy shelf and place it over another child's face before the teacher intervened and removed it.

Children must be supervised according to rule and within both sight and hearing of a child care staff member at all times. Provide staff training. Submit the program's corrective action plan, which includes a statement that training was provided, to the Department to verify compliance with the requirements of this rule.
