#### **Summary of Non-Compliances**

Domain: 01 Ratio & Supervision

Rule: 5101:2-12-19 Supervision

<u>Code</u>: The program staff is required to supervise children in their assigned group by sight and hearing. Supervision includes being near enough to respond and reach children immediately and protecting them from harm.



<u>Finding</u>: During the inspection, it was determined that children were left unattended while inside the program as noted in number 2 below:

1. Child was left unattended once.

2. Child(ren) were left unattended more than once when a child was observed coming into Preschool from Pre K with no adult present and when another child was getting a backpack from the Pre K room and no staff were observing her.

- 3. Child(ren) left the group and were unattended.
- 4. Child care staff were using a baby monitor to supervise children.
- 5. Child care staff were using a walkie talkie to supervise children.
- 6. Child care staff were using mirrors to view children in another room.
- 7. Child care staff were using a video camera instead of physically being present in the room.

8. Other [ ].

Children must be supervised and within sight and hearing of a child care staff member at all times. Provide staff training. Submit the program's corrective action plan, which includes a statement that training was provided, to the Department to verify compliance with the requirements of this rule.

Rule: 5101:2-12-25 Medication Administration and Food Supplements

<u>Code</u>: The program is required to use the appropriate form and retain current documentation to administer medications. The program is also required to obtain separate documentation for each medication and child, and retain on file each JFS 01217 "Request for Administration of Medication for Child Care" for at least one year. The program is required to administer medication only if it has the prescription label attached or had written instructions from a licensed physician. The program is also required to have each medication to be administered stored in its original container.

<u>Finding</u>: During the inspection, it was determined the program did not meet the requirement(s) for administering a medication, food supplement or medical food to a child as noted in numbers 1 and 7 below:

- 1. No JFS 01217 "Request for Administration of Medication for Child Care" was on file.
- 2. The child's name was missing on the JFS 01217.
- 3. The child's date of birth was missing on the JFS 01217.
- 4. The child's weight was missing on the JFS 01217.
- 5. The name of the medication was missing on the JFS 01217.
- 6. The exact dose was missing on the JFS 01217.
- 7. The time to administer was missing on the JFS 01217.
- 8. The time period to administer was missing on the JFS 01217.
- 9. The Parent/Guardian's dated signature was missing on the JFS 01217.
- 10. Possible side effects were missing on the JFS 01217.
- 11. Expiration date was missing on the JFS 01217.
- 12. Physician instructions were missing on the JFS 01217.
- 13. Physician's dated signature was missing on the JFS 01217.



- 14. Physician's phone number was missing on the JFS 01217.
- 15. Date medication was administered was missing on the JFS 01217.
- 16. Time medication was administered was missing on the JFS 01217.
- 17. Dosage administered was missing on the JFS 01217.
- 18. Staff member's signature was missing on the JFS 01217.
- 19. A prescription label was not attached to the prescription medication.
- 20. The medication or product, [], was not brought to the program in its original container.
- 21. Parent instructions conflict with either the manufacturer or physician instructions.

Submit the program's corrective action plan, which includes the completed JFS 01217 for each child needed, verification that the prescription label is now attached, and/or verification that the medication or product is now in its original container, and a statement that training was provided, to the Department to verify compliance with the requirements of this rule.

Rule: 5101:2-12-15 Medical/Physical Care Plans

<u>Code</u>: The program is required to have a completed JFS 01236 "Child Medical/Physical Care Plan" on file at the program for any child having a health condition. The program is required to implement and/or follow instructions on the JFS 01236 "Child Medical/Physical Care Plan" for a child with a health condition.

<u>Finding</u>: A written, signed and dated JFS 01236 "Child Medical/Physical Care Plan" must be on file for any child having health conditions which require monitoring for symptoms or a medical procedure be performed at the program. In review of the children's records, it was determined that the required written information was either not on file, implemented or followed, for at least one child indicated on the Children Records Review, as noted in numbers 1,6,8,9,11,13 and 17 below:

- 1. No plan was on file.
- 2. Child's name was missing.
- 3. Child's date of birth was missing.
- 4. Name of the condition was missing.
- 5. Symptoms to watch for were missing.
- 6. Action to be taken if symptoms to occur were missing.
- 7. Activities/foods/environmental conditions to avoid, if applicable, were missing.
- 8. Medical procedures to be followed were missing.
- 9. Expected benefit was missing.
- 10. Name of any applicable medication was missing.
- 11. Medication listed in the procedures to follow was not onsite available to administer as instructed and
- alternate instructions for this situation were not included on the plan.
- 12. Instructions regarding emergency evacuation, if applicable, were missing.
- 13. Training instructions were missing.
- 14. Dated signature of parent or certified professional who trained the program staff was missing.
- 15. Dated signature(s) of child care staff member(s) trained to perform the procedure were missing.
- 16. Directions regarding additional services, if applicable, were missing.



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- 17. Dated signature of parent giving permission to perform the procedure was missing.
- 18. Dated signature of program administrator was missing.
- 19. The plan was not implemented.
- 20. The plan was not able to be implemented due to conflicting information.
- 21. The plan was not followed.

Submit the program's corrective action plan, which includes a copy of the completed JFS 01236 "Child Medical/Physical Care Plan", to the Department to verify compliance with the requirements of this rule.

#### Low Risk Non-Compliances

Domain: 01 Ratio & Supervision

Rule: 5101:2-12-18 Attendance Records

<u>Code</u>: The program is required to have a method for tracking the children in each group. The tracking method must be updated throughout the day and kept with the group at all times.

<u>Finding</u>: During the inspection, it was determined that the method for tracking children in each group did not meet the requirements of the rule as noted in number 5 below:

- 1. There was no method in place;
- 2. The method did not include each child's name;
- 3. The method did not include each child's date of birth;
- 4. The tracking method did not remain with the group at all times;

5. The tracking method was not updated throughout the day as children entered or left the group. In the Discovery Preschool classroom there were 7 children signed in but only 6 children present.

Submit the program's corrective action plan to the Department to verify compliance with the requirements of this rule.



# Rule: 5101:2-12-18 Attendance Records

<u>Code</u>: The program is required to maintain a record of the arrival and departure of each child. The program is also required to retain the attendance record for a period of one year.

<u>Finding</u>: During the inspection, it was determined the program did not meet the requirements for keeping an attendance record as listed in number 2 below:

- 1. No attendance record was being maintained;
- 2. The attendance record was not being consistently completed in the Infant room.
- 3. The attendance documentation was not kept at the program for a period of one year.

Submit the program's corrective action plan, which includes a statement that training was provided, to the Department to verify compliance with the requirements of this rule.

# Domain: 02 Safe & Sanitary Environment

Rule: 5101:2-12-12 Safe Environment

<u>Code</u>: The program is required to store chemicals in a place that is inaccessible to children.

<u>Finding</u>: During the inspection, a potentially hazardous substance, which was determined to not present a serious risk to a child, was accessible to children as noted in number 11 below:

- 1. Cosmetics;
- 2. Disinfecting wipes;
- 3. Fish food;
- 4. Hand lotion;
- 5. Hand sanitizer (for children under 24 months);
- 6. Laundry detergent;
- 7. Powder dish washing soap;
- 8. Paint cans;
- 9. White out;
- 10. Potting Soil;
- 11. Other potentially hazardous substance: Hair products

The potentially hazardous substance was determined to be accessible to children in the following area: []. Provide staff training. Submit the program's corrective action plan, which includes a statement that the potentially hazardous substance is no longer accessible to children and a statement that training was provided, to the Department to verify compliance with the requirements of this rule.



#### Domain: 02 Safe & Sanitary Environment

Rule: 5101:2-12-13 Handwashing Requirements

<u>Code</u>: The program is required to have all children wash their hands as outlined in rule.

<u>Finding</u>: During the inspection, it was determined that at least one child in the Preschool and Discovery Preschool group did not wash his or her hands at the time listed in number 1 below, as required in rule:

- 1. Upon arrival;
- 2. After toileting/diaper change;
- 3. After contact with bodily fluids;
- 4. After returning from outdoor play;

5. After handling pets, pet cages, or other pet objects that have come in contact with the pet, before moving on to another activity;

- 6. Before eating or assisting with food preparation;
- 7. After water activities;
- 8. When visibly soiled (must use soap and water);
- 9. Other [ ].

Submit the program's corrective action plan to the Department to verify compliance with the requirements of this rule.

Corrective Action Plan Due: 11/27/2021

#### Domain: 02 Safe & Sanitary Environment

<u>Rule</u>: 5101:2-12-13 Sanitary Equipment and Environment <u>Code</u>: The program is required to provide equipment and materials that are easy to clean.

<u>Finding</u>: During the inspection, it was determined that at least one piece of equipment, furnishings, or material at the program was not constructed of materials to facilitate cleaning and sanitizing as noted in number 6 below:

- 1. The material had a tear;
- 2. The material was not washable;
- 3. The material was porous;
- 4. The surface was cracked;
- 5. The surface was repaired, but in a manner that still did not facilitate cleaning and sanitizing;

6. Other: Baseboard was peeling off the bottom of the changing table in the Discovery Preschool Room, leaving a surface that could not be easily cleaned and sanitized.

Equipment, furnishings, and furniture shall be constructed of materials to facilitate cleaning and shall be kept clean and in good repair. Technical assistance was provided at the time of the inspection, and as discussed,



please correct this rule noncompliance. A written response for this rule noncompliance is not required at this time.

#### Domain: 02 Safe & Sanitary Environment

Rule: 5101:2-12-13 Sanitary Equipment and Environment

<u>Code</u>: The program is required to provide a clean restroom with the appropriate materials available.

<u>Finding</u>: During the inspection, it was determined that unsanitary conditions, as noted in number 4 below, were underneath the changing table in the Discovery Preschool room:

- 1. There was no liquid soap.
- 2. There was no toilet paper.
- 3. There were no paper towels.
- 4. The toilet cleaning brush was accessible to the children.
- 5. The plunger was accessible to the children.
- 6. The toilet(s) were not flushed.
- 7. The trash was not emptied from the day before.
- 8. There was a strong urine odor.
- 9. Other [ ].

The restroom(s) must be kept sanitary at all times. Technical assistance was provided at the time of the inspection, and as discussed, please correct this rule noncompliance. A written response for this rule noncompliance is not required at this time.

#### Domain: 02 Safe & Sanitary Environment

Rule: 5101:2-12-13 Sanitary Equipment and Environment

<u>Code</u>: The program is required to clean equipment throughout the day if dirty or soiled.

<u>Finding</u>: During the inspection, it was determined that the following equipment was unclean or soiled during daily use:

- \* The computer table in the Preschool Room
- \* The transportation rug in the Preschool Room
- \* The wall vents in the Pre-K and School Age Rooms
- \* The trash receptacle at the end of the changing table in the Discovery Preschool room
- \* The trash can located in the Discovery Preschool restroom



#### \* The sink in the staff bathroom

Technical assistance was provided at the time of the inspection, and as discussed, please correct this rule noncompliance. A written response for this rule noncompliance is not required at this time.

# Domain: 02 Safe & Sanitary Environment

Rule: 5101:2-12-13 Sanitary Equipment and Environment

<u>Code</u>: The program is required to follow the cleaning schedule for equipment.

Finding: During the inspection, it was determined that the children's individual blankets and belongings were stored in an unsanitary manner in the Preschool room. Children's belongings need to be stored in a sanitary manner to prevent the spread of germs. Technical assistance was provided at the time of the inspection, and as discussed, please correct this rule noncompliance. A written response for this rule noncompliance is not required at this time.

# Domain: 05 Health & Safety

Rule: 5101:2-12-22 Fluid Milk Requirements

Code: The program is required to obtain documentation from a licensed physician if a child over 24 months of age is to be served anything other than one percent or skim milk that is Vitamin A and D fortified.

Finding: During the inspection, it was determined that there was no documentation from a licensed physician, physician's assistant, or certified nurse practitioner as required by the rule, when children over 24 months of age were served anything other than one percent or skim milk that is Vitamin A and D fortified. Technical assistance was provided at the time of the inspection, and as discussed, please correct this rule noncompliance. A written response for this rule noncompliance is not required at this time.

# Domain: 05 Health & Safety

Rule: 5101:2-12-22 Fluid Milk Requirements



<u>Code</u>: The program is required to obtain parental consent to serve a child over 12 months of age a non-cow milk substitute.

<u>Finding</u>: During the inspection, it was determined that there was no written parental consent to serve a child over twelve months of age a non-cow milk substitution. Technical assistance was provided at the time of the inspection, and as discussed, please correct this rule noncompliance. A written response for this rule noncompliance is not required at this time.

#### Domain: 05 Health & Safety

<u>Rule</u>: 5101:2-12-22 Meal and Snack Requirements <u>Code</u>: The program is requird to have the current menu posted with dates.

<u>Finding</u>: During the inspection, it was determined that the program's weekly menu was not currently dated as required.. Although Week 1-Week 4 is posted there is no indication as to what week was currently being served. Technical assistance was provided at the time of the inspection, and as discussed, please correct this rule noncompliance. A written response for this rule noncompliance is not required at this time.

#### Domain: 05 Health & Safety

Rule: 5101:2-12-16 Emergency Drills

<u>Code</u>: The program is required to complete fire drills, weather drills, and emergency/lockdown drills appropriately.

<u>Finding</u>: During the inspection, it was determined that the required drills were not completed in the month of July for item number 1 and 2 below:

1. Monthly fire drills;

- 2. Monthly weather emergency drills (March through September);
- 3. Quarterly emergency/lockdown drills.

Submit the program's corrective action plan to the Department to verify compliance with the requirements of this rule.



#### Domain: 05 Health & Safety

<u>Rule</u>: 5101:2-12-16 First Aid/Standard Precautions <u>Code</u>: The program is required to have a first aid kit onsite.

<u>Finding</u>: During the inspection, it was determined the program was missing required items listed in appendix A of this rule, that are to be contained in a first aid kit, as noted in number(s) 9 below:

- 1. The program did not have a first aid kit [onsite, on the vehicle, on a field trip].
- 2. One roll of hypoallergenic first-aid tape.
- 3. Individually wrapped sterile gauze squares in assorted sizes.
- 4. Sterile adhesive bandages in assorted sizes.

5. Tweezers.

- 6. Gauze rolled bandage.
- 7. Triangular bandage.

8. Rounded end scissors.

9. Tooth preservation system or fresh chilled liquid milk in which to transport a lost permanent tooth, including a written reference indicating location of the refrigerator/freezer where milk is stored if a tooth preservation system is not part of the first aid kit on the bus.

10. A working digital thermometer.

11. Disposable non-latex gloves.

12. A working flashlight.

13. An instant cold pack that has not been activated or ice, including a written reference indicating location of the refrigerator/freezer where the ice is stored if an instant cold pack is not part of the first aid kit.

14. Sealable leak-proof plastic bags in assorted sizes or double bagged plastic bags that can be securely tied for materials soiled with blood or bodily fluids.

15. Pocket mask or face shield, appropriate for all ages of children in care, for cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR) administration.

- 16. Soap or waterless sanitizer (field trip or transporting away from the program only).
- 17. Bottled water (field trip or transporting away from the program only).

18. The program did not have a system to replace items as they were used, expired, damaged or sterile packages were opened.

Technical assistance was provided at the time of the inspection, and as discussed, please correct this rule noncompliance. A written response for this rule noncompliance is not required at this time.

#### **Domain: 06 Program Information**

Rule: 5101:2-12-14 Transportation and Field Trip Procedures

<u>Code</u>: The program is required to have staff trained in CPR, First Aid, and Communicable Diseases on all trips.



<u>Finding</u>: During the inspection, it was determined that a person trained in cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR), first aid and management of communicable disease, had not been present for number 1 below as required by the rule:

1. In the vehicle for routine trips;

- 2. In the vehicle for field trips;
- 3. At the destination on all field trips.

Secure current training for the area needed or restructure the staff who are currently trained on the vehicle during routine trips and field trips. Submit the program's corrective action plan to the Department to verify compliance with the requirements of this rule.

Corrective Action Plan Due: 11/27/2021

#### Domain: 06 Program Information

<u>Rule</u>: 5101:2-12-14 Transportation - Driver Requirements Code: The program is required to have all drivers transporting children complete the driver training.

<u>Finding</u>: During the inspection, it was determined that at least one employee who is responsible for transporting children did not have documentation of completion of the prescribed driver training as noted in number 3 below:

- 1. No documentation on file
- 2. Incomplete documentation
- 3. Documentation not annually updated

Please refer to the Employee Record Chart which indicates any driver needing current documentation of completion of this training. Complete the training as discussed. Submit the program's corrective action plan, which includes a statement that training was provided, to the Department to verify compliance with the requirements of this rule.

#### Domain: 07 Diapering & Infant Care

Rule: 5101:2-12-20 Cribs

<u>Code</u>: The program is required to space cribs two feet apart when in use.



<u>Finding</u>: During the inspection, it was determined that cribs were not two feet apart when in use, as required by this rule. Technical assistance was provided at the time of the inspection, and as discussed, please correct this rule noncompliance. A written response for this rule noncompliance is not required at this time.

# Domain: 07 Diapering & Infant Care

<u>Rule</u>: 5101:2-12-23 Infant Bottle and Food Preparation <u>Code</u>: The program is required to obtain written instructions from parents regarding feeding their infant.

<u>Finding</u>: During the inspection, it was determined that written instructions for feeding the infants noted on the Children Record Review were missing information as noted in number(s) 5 below:

- 1. Written instructions were not on file.
- 2. Type of food and/or formula/breast milk was missing.
- 3. Amount of food and/or formula/breast milk was missing.
- 4. Feeding times or frequency of feedings was missing.
- 5. The written instructions on file had not been updated.

Technical assistance was provided at the time of the inspection, and as discussed, please correct this rule noncompliance. A written response for this rule noncompliance is not required at this time.

#### Domain: 08 Staff Files

Rule: 5101:2-12-08 Medical Statement

<u>Code</u>: The program staff medicals are required to be completed and on file at the program.

<u>Finding</u>: In review of the staff records, it was determined that completed medical examination statement(s) for the employee(s) listed on the Employee Record Chart [was/were] not on file, as required by this rule. Submit the program's corrective action plan, which includes a copy of the completed employee medical statement, to verify compliance with the requirements of this rule.



#### Domain: 08 Staff Files

<u>Rule</u>: 5101:2-12-10 Health Training Requirements <u>Code</u>: The program is required to have staff complete the required one hour prescribed Child Abuse training.

<u>Finding</u>: In review of the staff records, it was determined that the requirement for the ODJFS one-hour prescribed Child Abuse Training was not met as noted in numbers 1 and 2 below:

1. The training was not completed within sixty days of hire;

2. The training expired, as it is only valid for two years;

3. Not all administrators, Child Care Staff Members, and substitutes have completed the training.

Refer to the Employee Record Chart for the name(s) of the Child Care Staff Member(s) who must complete the ODJFS one-hour prescribed Child Abuse Training. Submit the program's corrective action plan to the Department to verify compliance with the requirements of this rule.

<u>Rule</u>: 5101:2-12-10 Professional Development Requirements <u>Code</u>: The program staff is required to obtain at least 6 hours of professional development annually.

<u>Finding</u>: In review of the staff records, it was determined that at least one child care staff member did not meet the annual professional development requirement as noted in number 1 below:

1. The child care staff member(s) had not completed at least 6 hours of professional development.

2. Documentation did not demonstrate the person who provided the training met the trainer qualifications as stated in the rule.

3. Training topic did not meet the requirements listed in appendix A of this rule.

4. Documentation of training did not meet the requirements of this rule.

5. Other [ ].

Submit the program's corrective action plan to the Department to verify compliance with the requirements of this rule.



#### **Domain: 08 Staff Files**

Rule: 5101:2-12-08 Orientation and Staff Records

<u>Code</u>: The program is required to have staff complete the online staff orientation training before they are permitted to have sole responsibility of children.

<u>Finding</u>: During the inspection, it was determined that Child Care Staff Member(s) listed on the Employee Record Chart had sole responsibility of children and had not completed the online orientation, as required by this rule. Submit the program's corrective action plan to the Department to verify compliance with the requirements of this rule.

Corrective Action Plan Due: 11/27/2021

Domain: 08 Staff Files

<u>Rule</u>: 5101:2-12-08 Orientation and Staff Records <u>Code</u>: The program is required to have staff complete the online staff orientation training.

<u>Finding</u>: In review of the staff records, it was determined that child care staff member(s) had not completed the online orientation training as noted in number 1 below:

1. Within 30 days of starting employment at the program as a child care staff member.

2. No documentation of completing the training after December 31, 2016.

Submit the program's corrective action plan to the Department to verify compliance with the requirements of this rule.

Corrective Action Plan Due: 11/27/2021

#### Domain: 09 Children's Files

<u>Rule</u>: 5101:2-12-15 Child Medical and Enrollment Records <u>Code</u>: The program is required to have a completed medical on file at the program for each child enrolled.

<u>Finding</u>: In review of 25% of the children's records, it was determined that completed medical statements were not on file, as required, for children listed on the JFS Children's Record Review For Child Care as indicated in numbers 1 and 2 below:

1. No medical was on file for at least one child

2. Medical(s) on file were not updated every 13 months

3. Medical(s) were missing child's name and date of birth



4. Medical(s) were missing the date of the medical examination

5. Medical(s) were missing a statement that the child has been examined and is in suitable condition for participation in group care
