Finding: During the inspection, it was determined that the playground did not have adequate fall surface under and around equipment as noted in number(s) 2 below:

1. No fall surface;
2. Adequate fall surface to soften the impact of a fall; (left side of building playground and back playground where large blocks are)
3. Adequate fall surface to soften the impact of a fall that extended the length of the required fall zone;

With any equipment designed for climbing, swinging, bouncing, or sliding, that is over twelve inches in height, resilient material, as specified in Appendix A, needs to be added in order to protect children in the event of a fall. 2. The material was not washable;
3. The material was porous;
4. The surface was cracked; (Preschool 1 vinyl on bean bag)
5. The surface was repaired, but in a manner that still did not facilitate cleaning and sanitizing;

Equipment, furnishings, and furniture shall be constructed of materials to facilitate cleaning and shall be kept clean and in good repair. Code: The program is required to provide an environment that protects the children in care from any items and conditions that may threaten their health, safety, and well-being.

Finding: Children in care shall be protected from any items and conditions which threaten their health, safety, and well-being. During the inspection, it was determined that at least one area of the program (Infant C - yellow wall) or at least one piece of equipment had chipping or peeling paint. Technical assistance was provided at the time of the inspection, and as discussed, please correct this rule noncompliance. A written response for this rule noncompliance is not required at this time.

Rule: 5101:2-12-13 Sanitary Equipment and Environment



Code: The program is required to provide a clean restroom with the appropriate materials available.

Finding: During the inspection, it was determined that unsanitary conditions, as noted in number(s) 6 below, were in the Schoolage Classroom restroom:

1. There was no liquid soap.
2. There was no toilet paper.
3. There were no paper towels.
4. The toilet cleaning brush was accessible to the children.
5. The plunger was accessible to the children.
6. The toilet(s) were not flushed.
7. The trash was not emptied from the day before.
8. There was a strong urine odor.
9. Other: The toilet was visually soiled.
