Rule: 5101:2-12-15 Medical/Physical Care Plans



<u>Code</u>: The program is required to have a completed JFS 01236 "Child Medical/Physical Care Plan for Child Care" on file at the program for any child having a health condition. The program is required to implement and/or follow instructions on the JFS 01236 for a child with a health condition.

<u>Finding</u>: A written, signed and dated JFS 01236 "Child Medical/Physical Care Plan for Child Care" must be on file for any child having health conditions which require monitoring for symptoms, or a medical procedure be performed, or ongoing administration of medication or medical foods at the program. In review of the children's records, it was determined that the required written information was either not on file, implemented or followed, for at least one child indicated on the Children Records Review, as noted in number 5, 6, 7, (or the box to see Doctors instructions were missing] below:

- 1. No plan was on file.
- 2. Child's name was missing.
- 3. Child's date of birth was missing.

- 18. Printed name(s)/Dated signature(s) of child care staff member(s) trained to perform the procedure were missing.
- 19. Dated signature(s) of administrator was missing.
- 20. Name of any applicable medication was missing.
- 21. Date medication was administered was missing.
- 22. Time medication was administered was missing.
- 23. Dosage administered was missing.
- 24. Signature of staff member who administered the medication was missing.
- 25. Medication listed in the procedures to follow was not onsite available to administer as instructed and alternate instructions for this situation were not included on the plan.
- 26. The plan was not implemented.
- 27. The plan was not able to be implemented due to conflicting information.
- 28. The plan was not followed.

Rule: 5101:2-12-13 Sanitary Equipment and Environment

<u>Code</u>: The program is required to provide a clean restroom with the appropriate materials available.

<u>Finding</u>: During the inspection, it was determined that unsanitary conditions, as noted in number 6 below, were in the children's restroom:

- 1. There was no liquid soap.
- 2. There was no toilet paper.
- 3. There were no paper towels.
- 4. The toilet cleaning brush was accessible to the children.
- 5. The plunger was accessible to the children.
- 6. The toilet(s) were not flushed.
- 7. The trash was not emptied from the day before.
- 8. There was a strong urine odor.
- 9. Other [].

The restroom(s) must be kept sanitary at all times. Technical assistance was provided at the time of the inspection, and as discussed, please correct this rule noncompliance. A written response for this rule noncompliance is not required at this time.

Rule: 5101:2-12-13 Handwashing Requirements

Code: The program is required to have all staff wash their hands as outlined in rule.

<u>Finding</u>: During the inspection, it was determined that at least one staff member with the older toddler group (in restroom did not wash hands after pull up change before assisting another with toileting) and young toddler group (did not wash hands after diaper change) did not wash her hands at the time listed in number 5 below, as required in rule.

1. Upon arrival for the day.

- 2. Prior to departure.
- 3. Upon entry into a classroom.
- 4. After toileting or assisting a child with toileting.
- 5. After each diaper change or pull-up change.
- 6. After contact with bodily fluids or cleaning up spills or objects contaminated with bodily fluids.
- 7. After cleaning or sanitizing or using any chemical products.
- 8. After handling pets, pet cages or other pet objects that have come in contact with the pet.
- 9. Before eating, serving or preparing food or bottles or feeding a child.
- 10. Before and after completing a medical procedure or administering medication.
- 11. When visibly soiled (must use soap and water).
- 12. Other [].

Submit the program's corrective action plan to the Department to verify compliance with the requirements of this rule.

Rule: 5101:2-12-12 Safe Environment

<u>Code</u>: The program is required to provide an environment that protects the children in care from any items and conditions that may threaten their health, safety, and well-being.

<u>Finding</u>: Children in care shall be protected from any items and conditions which threaten their health, safety, and well-being. During the inspection, it was determined that children were not protected from the following item(s) or condition(s) which may threaten their health, safety, or well-being as noted in number 5 below:

- 1. Open pull cords that are not closed loop.
- 2. Telephone cords.
- 3. Electrical/extension cords attached to an object that would not likely result in a severe injury if pulled.
- 4. Stacked chairs.
- 5. Employee(s) purse(s).
- 6. Diaper bags.
- 7. Television not securely anchored.
- 8. Small or lightweight pieces of shelving units are not securely anchored to the wall.
- 9. Smoke detector needing batteries replaced.
- 10. Staff member stepped over a barrier/gate while holding a child.
- 11. Emergency exits were blocked by the following classroom furniture: [].
- 12. Other [].

Provide staff training. Submit the program's corrective action plan, which includes a statement that training was provided, to the Department to verify compliance with the requirements of this rule.

Rule: 5101:2-12-11 Outdoor Play Fall Zones

<u>Code</u>: The program is required to provide adequate fall surface for the outdoor play space.

<u>Finding</u>: During the inspection, it was determined that while there was adequate fall surface material in the outdoor play space, proper distribution had not been maintained under and around equipment as required. Submit the program's corrective action plan, which includes a statement that fall surface material has been properly redistributed, to the Department to verify compliance with the requirements of this rule.

Domain: 05 Health & Safety

Rule: 5101:2-12-22 Safe Food Handling/Storage

<u>Code</u>: The program is required to provide utensils and dishes that are appropriate for the age group served.

<u>Finding</u>: During the inspection it was determined that utensils and/or dishes were not provided in the young toddler group in that no plates/napkins were provided. Children were eating on the floor and only had the floor to place food not able to hold. Technical assistance was provided at the time of the inspection, and as discussed, please correct this rule noncompliance. A written response for this rule noncompliance is required at this time.

Rule: 5101:2-12-22 Meal and Snack Requirements

Code: The program is required to provide food that does not pose as a choking hazard and is appropriate for the

age of the children.

<u>Finding</u>: During the inspection, it was determined that the older toddler group was served sausages, cheese sticks, and cherry tomatoes, which posed a choking hazard/was not appropriate for their age. Technical assistance was provided at the time of the inspection, and as discussed, please correct this rule noncompliance. A written response for this rule noncompliance is not required at this time.

Rule: 5101:2-12-23 Diapering and Toilet Training

Code: The program is required to launder diapers according to manufacturer's guidelines.

<u>Finding</u>: During the inspection, it was determined that the program was not storing or laundering soiled diapers or clothing according to the rule, in that the program did not meet the condition indicated in number 6 below.

- 1. Store for no longer than one day
- 2. Store in an individual covered container or plastic bag away from children's belongings
- 3. Kept out of reach of children
- 4. Store soiled diapers and diapering washcloths laundered by the center in a covered container with sanitizing solution
- 5. Hold soiled diapers to be commercially laundered for no more than seven days
- 6. Store soiled disposable diapers in a plastic-lined covered container not easily accessible to children
- 7. Discard disposable diapers daily or more frequently as needed to eliminate odor
- 8. Launder diapers according to manufacturer's guidelines

Code: The program staff is required to hold the infants or have the infant sitting up while feeding.

<u>Finding</u>: During the inspection, it was determined that an infant was not held or fed sitting up for bottled feedings. Technical assistance was provided at the time of the inspection, and as discussed, please correct the rule noncompliance. A written response for this rule noncompliance is not required at this time.

Rule: 5101:2-12-07 Administrator Responsibilities/Requirements

Code: The program administrator is required to maintain current employee records in the Ohio Professional

Registry.

<u>Finding</u>: During the inspection, it was determined employment records in the Ohio Professional Registry (OPR) were not created or maintained as noted in number 6 below:

- 1. At least one administrator, employee or child care staff member (including substitutes) had not created a profile.
- 2. At least one administrator, employee or child care staff member had not created an employment record for the program on or before their first day of employment.
- 3. At least one administrator, employee or child care staff member had not updated changes to positions or roles within five calendar days of the change.
- 4. The administrator had not assigned at least one employee or child care staff member to the program's organization dashboard.
- 5. At least one individual's schedule was not current.
- 6. At least one individual's position or role did not include an applicable group assignment.
- 7. At least one individual's employment had not been end dated.
- 8. Other: []

Submit the program's corrective action plan to the Department to verify compliance with the requirements of this rule.

Rule: 5101:2-12-08 Medical Statement

<u>Code</u>: The program staff medicals are required to include all information.

<u>Finding</u>: In review of the staff records, it was determined that the medical statements for those employees listed on the Employee Record Chart did not include the required information listed below in number(s) 4 (a-d)

- 1. Date of examination:
- 2. Signature, business address, and telephone number of the licensed physician, physician assistant, advanced practice nurse, certified midwife, or certified nurse practitioner who completed the examination;
- 3. A statement that verifies that the employee is:
- a. Physically fit for employment in a program caring for children;
- b. Immunized against Tetanus, Diphtheria, Pertussis (Tdap);
- c. Immunized against Measles, Mumps, and Rubella (MMR);
- 4. Tuberculosis (TB) screening/test

- a. Documentation of the screening process to determine if the employee resided in a country identified by the World Health Organization as having a high burden of TB and arrived in the United States within the five years preceding the date of application for employment;
- b. Results of a TB test for employees meeting both criteria in 4a;
- c. Results of additional testing for employees with a positive TB test;
- d. Written statement, signed by a representative of the TB control unit, that the employee's TB is no longer infectious or the individual is receiving a TB treatment regimen for employees with a positive TB test.

Submit the program's corrective action plan, which includes a copy of the completed employee medical statement, or TB results/documentation, to the Department to verify compliance with the requirements of this rule.

Rule: 5101:2-12-25 Medication Administration

<u>Code</u>: The program is required to have medication, medical foods and topical products labeled with the child's

name.

<u>Finding</u>: During the inspection, it was determined that a medication, medical food or topical product was at the program which had not been labeled with the child's name. Submit the program's corrective action plan to the Department to verify compliance with the requirements of this rule.

<u>Code</u>: The program is required to have a written disaster plan.

<u>Finding</u>: During the inspection, it was determined the program's written disaster plan did not meet the requirement or was missing the information in number(s) 13 & 14 below:

Procedures:

- 1. The written disaster plan had not been completed
- 2. The plan was not provided to all child care staff and employees
- 3. The plan was not used to respond to an emergency or disaster situation

- 5. Emergency outdoor and indoor lockdown or evacuation due to threats of violence which includes active shooter, bioterrorism or terrorism

- 7. Outbreaks, epidemics or other infectious disease emergencies
- 8. Loss of power, water, or heat
- 9. Other threatening situations that may pose a health or safety hazard to the children in the program Details:
- 10. Shelter in place or evacuation, how the program will care for and account for the children until they can be reunited with the parent
- 11. Assisting infants and children with special needs and/or health conditions
- 12. Emergency contact information for parents and the program
- 13. Procedures for notifying and communicating with parents regarding the location of the children if evacuated

- 14. Procedures for communicating with parents during loss of communications, no phone or internet service available
- 15. The location of supplies and procedures for gathering necessary supplies for staff and children if required to shelter in place
- 16. What to do if a disaster occurs during the transport of children or when on a field trip or routine trip
- 17. Making the plan available to all child care staff members and employees
- 18. Training of staff or reassignment of staff duties as appropriate
- 19. Updating the plan on a yearly basis
- 20. Contact with local emergency management officials
