Complaint Allegations

Domain:01 Ratio & Supervision

Rule: 5101:2-12-19 Supervision

Code: The program staff is required to supervise children in their assigned group by sight and hearing. Supervision includes being near enough to respond and reach children immediately including responding to the child's basic needs and protecting them from harm.

Allegation: Caller alleged that child was inadequately supervised in that staff were unaware the infant was bit and were not near enough to respond in a timely manner.

Determination: Substantiated

Findings: During the inspection, it was determined that children were not being properly supervised as noted in number(s) 4 below:

- 1. Child(ren) were not within both sight and hearing of a child care staff member during indoor play.
- 2. Child(ren) were not within both sight and hearing of a child care staff member during outdoor play.
- 3. Child(ren) were not within both sight and hearing of a child care staff member more than once.

Staff were not physically present in the space and near enough to respond and reach the child(ren) immediately. Observed during the inspection when both CCSM's were on one side of the wall while infants in infant seats and cribs were on the other side of the wall. Determined during interviews that CCSM were unaware that the non-mobile infant was bit.

Children must be supervised according to rule and within both sight and hearing of a child care staff member at all times. Provide staff training. Submit the program's corrective action plan, which includes a statement that training was provided, to the Department to verify compliance with the requirements of this rule.
