## Moderate Risk Non-Compliances

#### Domain: 01 Ratio & Supervision

Rule: 5101:2-12-18 Ratio

<u>Code</u>: The program is required to maintain the appropriate staff to child ratio for each group served.

<u>Finding</u>: During the inspection, a ratio of 1 child care staff member for 17 children was determined to have occurred for the Preschool 4 group when the situation in number 15 below occurred:

1. A child care staff member stepped out of the room.

2. A child care staff member had not arrived at work on time.

3. Children were present who were not scheduled to be there.

4. A child care staff member was unable to work.

5. A child was injured in that group.

6. A child arrived in the group before a second staff member was scheduled to arrive with the group.

7. Two groups were combined, and the program did not follow the ratio for the youngest child in the group.

8. A child was transitioning to the next older age group, and the program did not follow the ratio for the youngest child in the group.

9. Ratio was doubled for more than two hours while children were napping.

10. Ratio was doubled while children were napping for a group that included at least one infant.

11. Ratio was doubled while children were napping and there were not enough staff members in the building to meet staff/child ratio.

12. Ratio was doubled in the school age group to allow access to the program, however, the program does not serve only school age children.

13. Both child care staff members did not have a working communication device when one staff member left the group to allow access to the school age only program.

14. The child care staff member did not return to the group after allowing access to the school age only program. 15. Other Staff member walking down hall with 17 children and no other CCSM.

Additional child care staff members must be hired or current child care staff members must be rescheduled to maintain compliance. Provide staff training. Submit the program's corrective action plan, which includes a statement that training was provided, to the Department to verify compliance with the requirements of this rule.



#### Domain: 07 Diapering & Infant Care

Rule: 5101:2-12-20 Cribs

<u>Code</u>: The program is required to place infants in cribs while sleeping.

<u>Finding</u>: During the inspection, it was determined that the equipment in numbers 6,8 below had been used for sleeping infants and did not allow the infant to sleep on a firm mattress:

1. Mesh cribs;

- 2. Play pens;
- 3. Bassinets;
- 4. Cots;
- 5. Car seats;
- 6. Infant swing;
- 7. The floor;
- 8. Infant seats;
- 9. An infant placed in a car seat in a crib;

10. Other [ ].

Infants must be provided with a crib, which meets requirements specified in this rule, for resting and sleeping. Provide staff training. Submit the program's corrective action plan, which includes a statement that staff training was provided, to the Department to verify compliance with the requirements of this rule.

#### Domain: 08 Staff Files

<u>Rule</u>: 5101:2-12-09 Background Check Requirements <u>Code</u>: The program is required to receive a preliminary approval from ODJFS prior to allowing an individual to engage in assigned duties or be near children.

<u>Finding</u>: During the inspection, it was determined that individual had engaged in assigned duties or were near children and preliminary approval from ODJFS was not on file as required. Submit the program's corrective action plan, which includes a statement that the approval is now on file or the individual are no longer engaged in assigned duties and are not near children, to the Department to verify compliance with the requirements of this rule.



#### Low Risk Non-Compliances

#### Domain: 02 Safe & Sanitary Environment

Rule: 5101:2-12-13 Handwashing Requirements

<u>Code</u>: The program is required to have all children wash their hands as outlined in rule.

<u>Finding</u>: During the inspection, it was determined that at least one child in the Toddler 5 group did not wash his or her hands at the time listed in number 3 below, as required in rule.

1. Upon arrival.

- 2. Prior to departure.
- 3. After toileting/diaper change.
- 4. After contact with bodily fluids.
- 5. After returning from outdoor play.

6. After handling pets, pet cages, or other pet objects that have come in contact with the pet, before moving on to another activity.

- 7. Before eating or assisting with food preparation.
- 8. After water activities.
- 9. When visibly soiled (must use soap and water)

10. Other [ ].

Submit the program's corrective action plan to the Department to verify compliance with the requirements of this rule.

#### Domain: 03 Postings & Equipment

Rule: 5101:2-12-16 Medical, Dental, and General Emergency Plan

<u>Code</u>: The program is required to post and implement the JFS 01242 "Medical, Dental, and General Emergency Plan" when necessary.

<u>Finding</u>: During the inspection, it was determined the requirements for the JFS 01242 "Medical, Dental, and General Emergency Plan for Child Care" were not followed as noted in number 8 below:

1. The plan was not posted in each classroom.

- 2. The plan was not posted in other spaces used by children.
- 3. The name, address and telephone number of the program were not complete.

4. The location of first aid kit, fire extinguishers and fire alarm system, fire alarm pull stations and electrical circuit box were not complete.



5. The telephone number for emergency squad, fire department, hospital, poison control program, public children services agency, local health department, local emergency management agency, and police department were not complete.

6. Location of children's records was not complete.

7. Emergency information including any medications or supplies needed in the event of an evacuation was not complete.

8. The current version of the prescribed form was not used.

9. The plan was not implemented when necessary in that [ ].

Submit the program's corrective action plan to the Department to verify compliance with the requirements of this rule.

Corrective Action Plan Due: 11/18/2022

## Domain: 03 Postings & Equipment

<u>Rule</u>: 5101:2-12-16 Medical, Dental, and General Emergency Plan <u>Code</u>: The program is required to post the fire and weather plans.

<u>Finding</u>: During the inspection, it was determined that the following information was not posted for item numbers 2,3 below:

1. Fire alert plan, including a diagram indicating evacuation routes.

2. Weather alert plan was missing details for shelter in place.

3. Weather alert plan was missing a diagram indicating evacuation routes.

Submit the program's corrective action plan to the Department to verify compliance with the requirements of this rule.

Corrective Action Plan Due: 11/18/2022

#### Domain: 05 Health & Safety

Rule: 5101:2-12-16 Emergency Drills

<u>Code</u>: The program is required to complete fire drills, weather drills, and emergency/lockdown drills appropriately.

<u>Finding</u>: During the inspection, it was determined that the required drills were not completed for item numbers 2,3 below:



- 1. Monthly fire drills.
- 2. Monthly weather emergency drills (March through September).
- 3. Emergency/lockdown drills in each quarter of the calendar year.

Submit the program's corrective action plan to the Department to verify compliance with the requirements of this rule.

Corrective Action Plan Due: 11/18/2022

#### Domain: 07 Diapering & Infant Care

<u>Rule</u>: 5101:2-12-23 Infant Bottle and Food Preparation <u>Code</u>: The program staff is required to label bottles containing formula or breast milk.

<u>Finding</u>: During the inspection, it was determined that bottles containing breast milk and formula for a particular infant were not labeled with the child's name and date of preparation. Technical assistance was provided at the time of the inspection, and as discussed, please correct this rule noncompliance. A written response for this rule noncompliance is required at this time.

Corrective Action Plan Due: 11/18/2022

#### Domain: 07 Diapering & Infant Care

<u>Rule</u>: 5101:2-12-23 Diapering and Toilet Training <u>Code</u>: The program staff is required to use and discard a separation material between each diaper change.

<u>Finding</u>: During the inspection, it was determined that the staff did not use a separation material between each diaper change, as required by the rule, at the diaper changing station. Submit the program's corrective action plan to the Department to verify compliance with the requirements of this rule.

Corrective Action Plan Due: 11/18/2022

Domain: 07 Diapering & Infant Care Rule: 5101:2-12-20 Cribs



#### <u>Code</u>: The program is required to space cribs two feet apart when in use.

<u>Finding</u>: During the inspection, it was determined that cribs were not two feet apart when in use, as required by this rule. Technical assistance was provided at the time of the inspection, and as discussed, please correct this rule noncompliance. A written response for this rule noncompliance is required at this time.

Corrective Action Plan Due: 11/18/2022

#### Domain: 07 Diapering & Infant Care

Rule: 5101:2-12-20 Cribs

<u>Code</u>: The program is required to provide a safe and sufficient barrier to separate the play and sleeping space.

<u>Finding</u>: During the inspection, it was determined that the barrier between the play and sleeping space did not meet the requirements as noted in number 1 below:

- 1. No barrier had been provided
- 2. The barrier did not prevent the infants from entering the sleeping area.
- 3. The barrier was not safe.
- 4. The barrier was not sturdy.
- 5. The barrier impaired staff's ability to see and hear all sleeping infants in their cribs.
- 6. The barrier was inadequate.
- 7. Other [ ].

Technical assistance was provided at the time of the inspection, and as discussed, please correct this rule noncompliance. A written response for this rule noncompliance is required at this time.

Rule: 5101:2-12-08 Medical Statement

<u>Code</u>: The program staff medicals are required to be completed and on file at the program.

<u>Finding</u>: In review of the staff records, it was determined a completed medical examination statement for the employees listed on the Employee Record Chart was not on file, as required by this rule. Submit the program's corrective action plan, which includes a copy of the completed employee medical statement, to verify compliance with the requirements of this rule.

#### Domain: 08 Staff Files

Rule: 5101:2-12-07 Administrator Responsibilities/Requirements

<u>Code</u>: The program administrator is required to maintain current employee records in the Ohio Professional Registry.

<u>Finding</u>: During the inspection, it was determined employment records in the Ohio Professional Registry (OPR) were not created or maintained as noted in numbers 2, 4, 5, and 6 below:

1. At least one administrator, employee or child care staff member (including substitutes) had not created a profile.

2. At least one administrator, employee or child care staff member had not created an employment record for the program on or before their first day of employment.

3. At least one administrator, employee or child care staff member had not updated changes to positions or roles within five calendar days of the change.

4. The administrator had not assigned at least one employee or child care staff member to the program's organization dashboard.

5. At least one individual's schedule was not current.

6. At least one individual's position or role did not include an applicable group assignment.

7. At least one individual's employment had not been end dated.

8. Other: [ ]

Submit the program's corrective action plan to the Department to verify compliance with the requirements of this rule.

#### Domain: 08 Staff Files

Rule: 5101:2-12-08 Medical Statement

<u>Code</u>: The program staff medicals are required to include all information.

<u>Finding</u>: In review of the staff records, it was determined that the medical statements for those employees listed on the Employee Record Chart did not include the required information listed below in numbers 1 and 4.

1. Date of examination;



2. Signature, business address, and telephone number of the licensed physician, physician assistant, advanced practice nurse, certified midwife, or certified nurse practitioner who completed the examination;

- 3. A statement that verifies that the employee is:
- a. Physically fit for employment in a program caring for children;
- b. Immunized against Tetanus, Diphtheria, Pertussis (Tdap);
- c. Immunized against Measles, Mumps, and Rubella (MMR);
- 4. Tuberculosis (TB) screening/test

a. Documentation of the screening process to determine if the employee resided in a country identified by the World Health Organization as having a high burden of TB and arrived in the United States within the five years preceding the date of application for employment;

- b. Results of a TB test for employees meeting both criteria in 4a;
- c. Results of additional testing for employees with a positive TB test;

d. Written statement, signed by a representative of the TB control unit, that the employee's TB is no longer infectious or the individual is receiving a TB treatment regimen for employees with a positive TB test.

Submit the program's corrective action plan, which includes a copy of the completed employee medical statement, or TB results/documentation, to the Department to verify compliance with the requirements of this rule.

Corrective Action Plan Due: 11/18/2022

#### Domain: 08 Staff Files

Rule: 5101:2-12-10 Professional Development Requirements

<u>Code</u>: The program is required to ensure child care staff members, including substitutes used more than ninety days annually, obtain at least 6 hours of professional development each state fiscal year.

<u>Finding</u>: In review of the staff records, it was determined that at least one child care staff member did not meet the annual professional development requirement as noted in number 1 below:

1. The child care staff members had not completed at least six hours of professional development.

2. Documentation did not demonstrate the person who provided the training met the trainer qualifications as stated in the rule.

- 3. Training topic did not meet the requirements listed in appendix A of this rule.
- 4. Documentation of training did not meet the requirements of this rule.

5. The substitute(s) had been used more than ninety days annually between July first and June thirtieth and had not completed at least six hours of professional development

6. Other [ ].

Submit the program's corrective action plan to the Department to verify compliance with the requirements of this rule.



#### Domain: 08 Staff Files

Rule: 5101:2-12-10 Health Training Requirements

<u>Code</u>: The program is required to have all child care staff members complete training in child abuse and neglect recognition and prevention within sixty days of hire. Staff must complete training in first aid and CPR within the first ninety days of hire.

<u>Finding</u>: In review of the staff records, it was determined that at least one child care staff member had not completed required health and safety training as noted in number 2, 5 and 6 below:

- 1. Child abuse and neglect recognition and prevention training was not completed within sixty days of hire.
- 2. First aid training was not completed within ninety days of hire.
- 3. Cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR) training was not completed within ninety days of hire.
- 4. The child abuse and neglect recognition and prevention training was expired.
- 5. The first aid training was expired.
- 6. The CPR training was expired.

Refer to the Employee Record Chart for the name(s) of the child care staff member(s) who must complete the required health and safety training(s). Submit the program's corrective action plan to the Department to verify compliance with the requirements of this rule.

#### **Domain: 08 Staff Files**

<u>Rule</u>: 5101:2-12-08 Orientation Training & Whistle Blower Protection <u>Code</u>: The program is required to have staff complete the online staff orientation training.

<u>Finding</u>: In review of the staff records, it was determined that child care staff member(s) had not completed the online orientation training as noted in numbers 1 and 3 below:

1. Within 30 days of starting employment at the program as a child care staff member.

- 2. No documentation of completing the training after December 31, 2016.
- 3. Completion of the training was not verified in the OPR.

Submit the program's corrective action plan to the Department to verify compliance with the requirements of this rule.



#### Domain: 09 Children's Files

Rule: 5101:2-12-15 Medical/Physical Care Plans

<u>Code</u>: The program is required to ensure that there is at least one child care staff member who has signed the JFS 01236 "Child Medical/Physical Care Plan for Child Care" caring for the child at all times when a child with a health condition is present.

<u>Finding</u>: During the inspection, it was determined a child with a condition that required a JFS 01236 "Child Medical/Physical Care Plan" had been present and the program did not ensure there was at least one child care staff member caring for the child at all times who had signed the JFS 01236 on the child's condition. Provide staff training. Submit the program's corrective action plan, which includes a statement that training was provided, to the Department to verify compliance with the requirements of this rule

11. Attendance including procedures for arrival and departure, the program's absent day policy, releasing child to persons other than the parent, releasing a child according to a custody agreement and follow up when a child scheduled to arrive from another program or activity does not arrive.

12. Supervision of children, including a separate supervision policy for school-age children, if applicable.

- 13. Child guidance.
- 14. Suspension and expulsion.

15. Compliance with the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA), including administering medication to children with disabilities and administering care procedures to children with disabilities.

16. Outdoor play, including limitations placed on outdoor play due to weather or safety issues (considerations may include but are not limited to temperature, humidity, wind chill, ozone levels, pollen count, lightning, rain or ice.)

17. Food and dietary policy, including, information regarding meeting one-third of the child's recommended daily dietary allowance, policy regarding formula, breast milk, meals and snacks, and a policy on providing supplemental food.

18. Management of illness including isolation precautions, symptoms for discharge and return and notification of parent of ill child.

19. Summary of procedures taken in the event of an emergency, serious illness or injury.

20. Administration of medication and topical products including medical foods, modified diets and whether school age children are permitted to carry their own medication and ointments. \*\*\*School Age children

21. Transportation for fieldtrips, routine trips (if applicable) and emergencies, including if the center will provide child care services to children whose parents refuse to grant consent for transportation to the source of emergency treatment.

22. Water activities/swimming.

23. Infant care, if applicable, including feeding, frequency of diaper checks and information about daily activities.

- 24. Sleeping, Napping and Resting.
- 25. Evening and overnight care, if applicable.

26. Policy on hours of operation including closing due to weather, school delays or closings and any other factors.

27. Situations that may require disenrollment of a child, if applicable.

28. Problem or issue resolution for parents or employees to follow when needing assistance in resolving problems related to the child care program.

29. Formal screenings and assessments on enrolled children and if the program reports child level data to ODJFS pursuant to 5101:2-17-02 of the Administrative Code.
