Rule: 5101:2-12-18 Ratio



Code: The program is required to maintain the appropriate staff to child ratio for each group served.

Finding: During the inspection, a ratio of 1 child care staff member(s) for 6 children was determined to have occurred for the infant group when the situation in number(s) 1 below occurred:

1. A child care staff member stepped out of the room.
2. A child care staff member had not arrived at work on time.
3. Children were present who were not scheduled to be there.
4. A child care staff member was unable to work.
5. A child was injured in that group.
6. A child arrived in the group before a second staff member was scheduled to arrive with the group.
7. Two groups were combined, and the program did not follow the ratio for the youngest child in the group.
8. A child was transitioning to the next older age group, and the program did not follow the ratio for the youngest child in the group.
9. Ratio was doubled for more than two hours while children were napping.
10. Ratio was doubled while children were napping for a group that included at least one infant.
11. Ratio was doubled while children were napping and there were not enough staff members in the building to meet staff/child ratio.
12. Ratio was doubled in the school age group to allow access to the program, however, the program does not serve only school age children.
13. Both child care staff members did not have a working communication device when one staff member left the group to allow access to the school age only program.
14. The child care staff member did not return to the group after allowing access to the school age only program.

4. The child's weekly schedule;
5. The time (hours and minutes) of each child's arrival and departure to the program, including transportation by the program.

Information in number 4 must be added to the form used to maintain attendance records. Submit the program's corrective action plan to the Department to verify compliance with the requirements of this rule.

Code: The program is required to provide equipment and materials that are easy to clean.

Finding: During the inspection, it was determined that at least one piece of equipment, furnishings, or material at the program was not constructed of materials to facilitate cleaning and sanitizing as noted in number(s) 1 (tears in pad in infant room and chair foam exposed in SA room) below:

1. The material had a tear;
2. The material was not washable;
3. The material was porous;
4. The surface was cracked;
5. The surface was repaired, but in a manner that still did not facilitate cleaning and sanitizing;
6. Other [].

Equipment, furnishings, and furniture shall be constructed of materials to facilitate cleaning and shall be kept clean and in good repair. Technical assistance was provided at the time of the inspection, and as discussed, please correct this rule noncompliance. Rule: 5101:2-12-13 Sanitary Equipment and Environment

Code: The program is required to have all toilets flushed after use.

Finding: During the inspection, it was determined that toilets were not being flushed after each use in the green restroom. Toilets are required to be flushed after each use. Technical assistance was provided at the time of the inspection, and as discussed, please correct this rule noncompliance. A written response for this rule noncompliance is not required at this time.

Domain: 02 Safe & Sanitary Environment

Rule: 5101:2-12-12 Safe Equipment

Code: The program is required to provide equipment the children may use and is not broken or a hazard.



Finding: During the inspection, the following equipment was determined to be not usable due to breakage or being a hazard in that a large plastic busy block was cracked and had sharp edges.. This equipment must be removed immediately and stored away from the children until being removed or replaced. Submit the program's corrective action plan to the Department to verify compliance with the requirements of this rule.

Rule: 5101:2-12-13 Sanitary Equipment and Environment

Code: The program is required to following the cleaning schedule for equipment.

Finding: During the inspection, it was determined that items designed to be placed in a child's mouth were not being washed and sanitized, as required. Technical assistance was provided at the time of the inspection, and as discussed, please correct this rule noncompliance. A written response for this rule noncompliance is not required at this time.

Domain: 02 Safe & Sanitary Environment

Rule: 5101:2-12-13 Sanitary Equipment and Environment

Code: The program is required to follow the cleaning schedule for equipment.

Finding: During the inspection, it was determined that the program was not providing a clean and healthy environment, furniture, materials and equipment as required by Appendix A, as noted in number(s) 1 below:

1. The changing table was not sanitized after each use;
2. The floors were not being cleaned;
3. The carpets were not vacuumed;
4. The food prep areas were not being cleaned and sanitized before and after food prep;
5. Toilet seat(s), handle(s) and toilet bowl(s) were not being cleaned when visibly soiled and sanitized;
6. Diaper receptacles were not being cleaned and sanitized;
7. Other [].

Furniture, materials and equipment must be maintained according to the cleaning and sanitizing schedule in Appendix A to this rule. Technical assistance was provided at the time of the inspection, and as discussed, please correct this rule noncompliance. A written response for this rule noncompliance is not required at this time.



Domain: 02 Safe & Sanitary Environment

Rule: 5101:2-12-12 Safe Environment

Code: The program is required to provide an environment that protects the children in care from any items and conditions that may threaten their health, safety, and well-being.

Finding: Children in care shall be protected from any items and conditions which threaten their health, safety, and well-being. During the inspection, it was determined that children were not protected from the following item(s) or condition(s) which may threaten their health, safety, or well-being as noted in the following number(s) 4, 5, and 13 below:

1. Open pull cords that are not closed loop;
2. Telephone cords;
3. Electrical/extension cords attached to an object that would not likely result in a severe injury if pulled;
4. Stacked chairs;
5. Employee(s) purse(s);
6. Diaper bags;
7. Television not securely anchored;
8. Small or lightweight pieces of shelving units are not securely anchored to the wall;
9. Smoke detector needing batteries replaced;
10. Staff member stepped over a barrier/gate while holding a child;
11. Chipping or peeling paint;
12. Emergency exits were blocked by the following classroom furniture: [];
13. Other (molding pulling away from the wall in the SA and preschool room)

Provide staff training. Submit the program's corrective action plan, which includes a statement that training was provided, to the Department to verify compliance with the requirements of this rule.

Domain: 02 Safe & Sanitary Environment

Rule: 5101:2-12-12 Safe Environment

Code: The program is required to label all cleaning and sanitizing supplies.

Finding: During the inspection, it was determined that not all cleaning/sanitizing supplies had been clearly labeled. When cleaning or sanitizing supplies are not stored in their original containers, the container must be labeled with the contents. Technical assistance was provided at the time of the inspection, and as discussed, please correct this rule noncompliance. A written response for this rule noncompliance is not required at this



time.

Domain: 02 Safe & Sanitary Environment

Rule: 5101:2-12-13 Sanitary Equipment and Environment

Code: The program is required to provide a clean restroom with the appropriate materials available.

Finding: During the inspection, it was determined that unsanitary conditions, as noted in the following number(s) 3 (blue), 4, (both), 5 (both), and 8 (both) below:

1. There was no liquid soap;
2. There was no toilet paper;
3. There were no paper towels;
4. The toilet cleaning brush was accessible to the children;
5. The plunger was accessible to the children;
6. The sinks were dirty;
7. The toilets were dirty;
8. The floor was wet;
9. The trash was not emptied from the day before;
10. There was a strong urine odor;
11. Other [].

The restroom(s) must be kept sanitary at all times. Technical assistance was provided at the time of the inspection, and as discussed, please correct this rule noncompliance. A written response for this rule noncompliance is not required at this time.

Domain: 03 Postings & Equipment

Rule: 5101:2-12-17 Materials and Equipment

Code: The program is required to have enough equipment for all children in care.

Finding: During the inspection, it was determined that equipment and materials in the following categories 2,4,10 were not provided in sufficient quantities for children in the preschool classroom, as required by the rule: In addition, the toddler room did not have sufficient materials in 2,7.

1. Art supplies (excludes infants);
2. Manipulative materials and equipment;



3. Blocks;
4. Science-nature equipment (excludes infants);
5. Language arts and auditory materials and equipment;
6. Pretend or dramatic play materials;
7. Music equipment; There was some music in the toddler classroom, but their were no batteries.
8. Transportation materials and equipment;
9. Gross motor equipment;
10. Sensory motor equipment.

Technical assistance was provided at the time of the inspection, and as discussed, please correct this rule noncompliance. A written response for this rule noncompliance is not required at this time.

Domain: 03 Postings & Equipment

Rule: 5101:2-12-17 Daily Schedule

Code: The program is required to have the daily program schedule posted in all required areas.

Finding: During the inspection, it was determined that a copy of the daily program schedule was not posted in the preschool area as required, however, it was a schedule for a different center. Technical assistance was provided at the time of the inspection, and as discussed, please correct this rule noncompliance. A written response for this rule noncompliance is not required at this time.

Domain: 04 Indoor/Outdoor Space

Rule: 5101:2-12-11 Outdoor Space Requirements

Code: The program is required to have an outdoor play space free from general hazards.

Finding: During the inspection, it was determined that the following hazardous conditions existed in the outdoor play area, as noted in number 11 below:

1. There was broken glass;
2. There were tall weeds;
3. There was poison ivy;
4. There were protruding bolts;
5. There were tree branches;
6. There was mold visible;
7. The sandbox was contaminated;



8. There were thistles with pricklers;
9. There were bird droppings;
10. There were bolts with more than two threads exposed along a fence line or gate on a playground;
11. Other: There were toys that are not usable or in parts, that are scattered on the play area..

Submit the program's corrective action plan to the Department to verify compliance with the requirements of this rule.

Domain: 05 Health & Safety

Rule: 5101:2-12-16 First Aid/Standard Precautions

Code: The program is required to properly store first aid supplies according to the requirements in rule.

Finding: During the inspection, it was determined that items were stored in the first aid kit that were not marked with a name. The first aid kit had Benadryl and Neosporin with no name on it.

Technical assistance was provided at the time of the inspection, and as discussed, please correct this rule noncompliance. A written response for this rule noncompliance is not required at this time.

Domain: 05 Health & Safety

Rule: 5101:2-12-16 First Aid/Standard Precautions

Code: The program is required to have all the required items in the first aid kit.

Finding: During the inspection, it was determined that the program did not have a first aid kit onsite as required, that included all items listed in the appendix A of the rule. The kit(s) were missing the item(s) listed in number(s) 8 and 13 below:

1. One roll of hypoallergenic first-aid tape;
2. Individually wrapped sterile gauze squares in assorted sizes;
3. Sterile adhesive bandages in assorted sizes;
4. Tweezers;
5. Gauze rolled bandage;
6. Triangular bandage;
7. Rounded end scissors;
8. Tooth preservation system or fresh chilled liquid milk in which to transport a lost permanent tooth, including a written reference indicating location of the refrigerator/freezer where milk is stored if a tooth preservation



- system is not part of the first aid kit (for programs serving school age children only);
9. A working digital thermometer;
 10. Disposable non-latex gloves;
 11. A working flashlight;
 12. An instant cold pack that has not been activated or ice, including a written reference indicating location of the refrigerator/freezer where the ice is stored if an instant cold pack is not part of the first aid kit;
 13. Sealable leak-proof plastic bags in assorted sizes or double bagged plastic bags that can be securely tied for materials soiled with blood or bodily fluids;
 14. Pocket mask or face shield, appropriate for all ages of children in care, for cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR) administration;
 15. Soap or waterless sanitizer (field trip or transporting away from the program only);
 16. Bottled water (field trip or transporting away from the program only).

Technical assistance was provided at the time of the inspection, and as discussed, please correct this rule noncompliance. A written response for this rule noncompliance is not required at this time.

Domain: 05 Health & Safety

Rule: 5101:2-12-22 Meal and Snack Requirements

Code: The program is required to have the current menu posted with dates.

Finding: During the inspection, it was determined that the program's weekly menu was not currently dated as required. Technical assistance was provided at the time of the inspection, and as discussed, please correct this rule noncompliance. A written response for this rule noncompliance is not required at this time.

Domain: 06 Program Information

Rule: 5101:2-12-21 Evening and Overnight Care

Code: The program is required to provide children with hygiene items.

Finding: "During the inspection, it was determined that the children were not provided with the following items 1,2,3 below as required:

1. A clean, individual, individually labeled washcloths.
2. Towels.
3. Toothbrushes.

Technical assistance was provided at the time of the inspection, and as discussed, please correct this rule



noncompliance. A written response for this rule noncompliance is not required at this time."

Domain: 07 Diapering & Infant Care

Rule: 5101:2-12-23 Infant Daily Care

Code: The program is required to provide infant daily care that meets the requirements of the rule.

Finding: During the inspection, it was determined that the program's infant daily care did not meet the requirements of this rule as noted in number 1 below:

1. Infants could not safely and comfortably sit, crawl, toddle, or walk and play according to the infant's stage of development; there were too many bouncies, infant seats that were not being used, but were kept in the older infant play area.
2. Infants were not removed from the crib, swing, infant seat, exercise seat or other equipment throughout the day for individual attention;
3. Each non-crawling infant was not provided the opportunity for tummy time each day;
4. Other [].

Provide staff training. Submit the program's corrective action plan, which includes a statement that training was provided, to the Department to verify compliance with the requirements of this rule.

Corrective Action Plan Due: 06/15/2019

Domain: 07 Diapering & Infant Care

Rule: 5101:2-12-23 Infant Bottle and Food Preparation

Code: The program staff is required to label bottles containing formula or breast milk.

Finding: During the inspection, it was determined that bottles containing formula for a particular infant were not labeled with the date of preparation. Technical assistance was provided at the time of the inspection, and as discussed, please correct this rule noncompliance. A written response for this rule noncompliance is not required at this time.



Domain: 07 Diapering & Infant Care

Rule: 5101:2-12-20 Cribs

Code: The program is required to provide a safe and sufficient barrier to separate the play and sleeping space.

Finding: During the inspection, it was determined that the barrier between the play and sleeping space did not meet the requirements as noted in number(s) 2 below;

1. No barrier had been provided
2. The barrier did not prevent the infants from entering the sleeping area.
3. The barrier was not safe.
4. The barrier was not sturdy.
5. The barrier impaired staff's ability to see and hear all sleeping infants in their cribs.
6. The barrier was inadequate.
7. Other [].

Technical assistance was provided at the time of the inspection, and as discussed, please correct this rule noncompliance. A written response for this rule noncompliance is not required at this time.

Rule: 5101:2-12-09 Background Check Requirements

Code: Program staff is required to create a profile in the Ohio Professional Registry and submit background checks to ODJFS.

Finding: In review of the staff records, it was determined that an owner, administrator or individual did not complete the requirements of this rule as noted in number(s) 2 below:

1. Individuals employed on or after October 29, 2017, did not create a profile in the OPR;
2. Individuals employed prior to October 29, 2017 did not create a profile in the OPR by January 1, 2018;
3. Individuals employed prior to October 29, 2017, did not submit the JFS 01175 "Request for a Background Check for Child Care" to ODJFS by January 1, 2018.

Finding: In review of the staff records, it was determined that at least one Child Care Staff Member with currently valid training in First Aid was not present/scheduled to be present to close as required, for the following reason(s) as noted in number(s) 1 below:

1. The training taken by staff present/scheduled had expired;
2. Child Care Staff Members scheduled during this time had not taken First Aid;
3. A trained Child Care Staff Member was not present in each building used by the program;
4. A Child Care Staff Member scheduled at this time did not have verification of completion of First Aid.

Submit the program's corrective action plan, which includes verification of complete coverage for First Aid training, to the Department to verify compliance with the requirements of this rule.

1. No enrollment form was completed for at least one child

Code: The program is required to have a written disaster plan completed.

Finding: During the inspection, it was determined the program's written disaster plan provided to all child care staff and employees was missing the information in numbers 9-12,15,16, and 17 below:

Procedures:

1. Weather emergencies and natural disasters which include severe thunderstorms, tornadoes, flash flooding, major snowfall, blizzards, ice storms or earthquakes;
2. Emergency outdoor and indoor lockdown or evacuation due to threats of violence which includes active shooter, bioterrorism or terrorism;
3. Emergency or disaster evacuations due to hazardous materials and spills, gas leaks or bomb threats;
4. Outbreaks, epidemics or other infectious disease emergencies;
5. Loss of power, water, or heat;
6. Other threatening situations that may pose a health or safety hazard to the children in the program.

Details:

7. Shelter in place or evacuation, how the program will care for and account for the children until they can be reunited with the parent;
8. Assisting infants and children with special needs and/or health conditions;
9. Emergency contact information for parents and the program;
10. Procedures for notifying and communicating with parents regarding the location of the children if evacuated;
11. Procedures for communicating with parents during loss of communications, no phone or internet service available;
12. The location of supplies and procedures for gathering necessary supplies for staff and children if required to shelter in place;
13. What to do if a disaster occurs during the transport of children or when on a field trip or routine trip;
14. Training of staff or reassignment of staff duties as appropriate;
15. Updating the plan on a yearly basis;
16. Contact with local emergency management officials.
17. The plan included references to Head Start programs and their maintenance team. This part of the plan is not intended for this program.

Add the missing information to the disaster plan. Submit the program's corrective action plan, which includes the missing information, to the Department to verify compliance with the requirements of this rule.

2. Description of the program's program philosophy;
3. Days and hours of operation, scheduled closings and basic daily schedule;
4. Staff/child ratios and group size;
5. Meals and snacks provided;
6. Outdoor play, including limitations placed on outdoor play due to weather or safety issues. Considerations may include but are not limited to temperature, humidity, wind chill, ozone levels, pollen count, lightning, rain or ice;
7. Opportunities for parent involvement in program activities;
8. Opportunities for parents to meet with teachers regarding their child;
9. Payment schedule, overtime charges and registration fees as applicable;
10. Supports for onsite breastfeeding or pumping for mothers who wish to do so (if the program serves infants or toddlers).

Program Policies and Procedures

11. Enrollment including required enrollment information;
12. Enrollment of children without immunizations;
13. Attendance including procedures for arrival and departure, the program's absent day policy, releasing child to persons other than the parent, releasing a child according to a custody agreement and follow up when a child scheduled to arrive from another program or activity does not arrive;
