Domain: 01 Ratio & Supervision

Rule: 5101:2-12-18 Ratio

<u>Code</u>: The program is required to maintain the appropriate staff to child ratio for each group served.

<u>Finding</u>: During the inspection, a ratio of 1 child care staff member(s) for 11 children was determined to have occurred for the combined infant/toddler/preschoo/schoolage group when the situation in number(s) 1 below occurred:

- 1. A child care staff member stepped out of the room.
- 2. A child care staff member had not arrived at work on time.
- 3. Children were present who were not scheduled to be there.
- 4. A child care staff member was unable to work.
- 5. A child was injured in that group.
- 6. A child arrived in the group before a second staff member was scheduled to arrive with the group.
- 7. Two groups were combined, and the program did not follow the ratio for the youngest child in the group.

- 8. A child was transitioning to the next older age group, and the program did not follow the ratio for the youngest child in the group.
- 9. Ratio was doubled for more than two hours while children were napping.
- 10. Ratio was doubled while children were napping for a group that included at least one infant.
- 11. Ratio was doubled while children were napping and there were not enough staff members in the building to meet staff/child ratio.
- 12. Ratio was doubled in the school age group to allow access to the program, however, the program does not serve only school age children.
- 13. Both child care staff members did not have a working communication device when one staff member left the group to allow access to the school age only program.
- 14. The child care staff member did not return to the group after allowing access to the school age only program.
- 15. Other [].

Additional child care staff members must be hired or current child care staff members must be rescheduled to maintain compliance. Provide staff training. Submit the program's corrective action plan, which includes a statement that training was provided, to the Department to verify compliance with the requirements of this rule.

Domain: 06 Program Information

Rule: 5101:2-12-14 Transportation and Field Trip Procedures

<u>Code</u>: The program is required to have all adults and children on trips wear seat belts, or use child restraints if required by law. The program is required to have only one child in each seat belt and have all children under 12 years of age sit in the back seats of the vehicle. The program is required to have all children sitting in a seat on the vehicle with a seat belt, as opposed to standing or sitting on the floor.

<u>Finding</u>: "During the inspection, it was determined the program did not follow regulations and/or safety precautions when children were transported as noted in number(s) 1 below:

- 1. Seat belts were not used by children in that the child in the middle seat in the second row was not wearing a seatbelt when they pulled away to go to school.
- 2. Child restraint systems were not used.
- 3. Children were riding in seats that were not securely anchored.
- 4. More than one child was strapped in a seat belt.
- 5. A child under the age of twelve years old rode in the front seat of the vehicle.
- 6. At least one child or adult was standing or sitting on the floor in a moving vehicle, in that [].
- 7. Adult(s) in the vehicle failed to wear seat belt(s) Provide staff training.

Submit the program's corrective action plan, which includes assurance that these safety guidelines will be met when children are transported, and a statement that training was provided, to the Department to verify compliance with the requirements of this rule."

Low Risk Non-Compliances

Domain: 01 Ratio & Supervision

Rule: 5101:2-12-19 Supervision

<u>Code</u>: The program staff is required to supervise children in their assigned group by sight and hearing. Supervision includes being near enough to respond and reach children immediately including responding to the child's basic needs and protecting them from harm.

<u>Finding</u>: During the inspection, it was determined that children were not being properly supervised as noted in number(s) 1, 4, 5 below:

- 1. Child(ren) were not within both sight and hearing of a child care staff member during indoor play in that the preschool teacher was assisting a child in the restroom.
- 2. Child(ren) were not within both sight and hearing of a child care staff member during outdoor play.
- 3. Child(ren) were not within both sight and hearing of a child care staff member more than once.
- 4. Staff were not physically present in the space and near enough to respond and reach the child(ren) immediately in that the teacher was assisting a child in the restroom.
- 5. Staff member was on the phone (infant/toddler group).

Children must be supervised according to rule and within both sight and hearing of a child care staff member at all times. Provide staff training. Submit the program's corrective action plan, which includes a statement that training was provided, to the Department to verify compliance with the requirements of this rule.

Domain: 01 Ratio & Supervision

Rule: 5101:2-12-18 Attendance Records

<u>Code</u>: The program is required to have a method for tracking the children in each group. The tracking method must be updated throughout the day and kept with the group at all times.

<u>Finding</u>: During the inspection, it was determined that the method for tracking children in each group did not meet the requirements of the rule as noted in number(s) 4 below:

- 1. There was no method in place;
- 2. The method did not include each child's name;
- 3. The method did not include each child's date of birth;



- 4. The tracking method did not remain with the group at all times (schoolagers on van and infant/toddler group when they moved to their classroom);
- 5. The tracking method was not updated throughout the day as children entered or left the group.

Submit the program's corrective action plan to the Department to verify compliance with the requirements of this rule.

Corrective Action Plan Due: 01/02/2022

Domain: 02 Safe & Sanitary Environment

Rule: 5101:2-12-13 Sanitary Equipment and Environment

Code: The program is required to follow the cleaning schedule for equipment.

<u>Finding</u>: During the inspection, it was determined the following equipment, as noted in number(s) 4 below, was not being cleaned with soap and water and/or sanitized monthly, as required:

- 1. Cribs;
- 2. Dress-up clothes and hats;
- 3. Washable toys and equipment;
- 4. Walls visibly soiled (schoolage block area and reading area)

Furniture, materials and equipment must be maintained according to the cleaning and sanitizing schedule in Appendix A to this rule. Technical assistance was provided at the time of the inspection, and as discussed, please correct this rule noncompliance. A written response for this rule noncompliance is not required at this time.

Domain: 02 Safe & Sanitary Environment

Rule: 5101:2-12-13 Sanitary Equipment and Environment

<u>Code</u>: The program is required to follow the cleaning schedule for equipment.

<u>Finding</u>: During the inspection, it was determined that the program was not providing a clean and healthy environment, furniture, materials and equipment as required by Appendix A, as noted in number(s) 9 below:

- 1. The changing table was not sanitized after each use.
- 2. Reusable cloths were not being cleaned daily or when visibly soiled.
- 3. Dividers were not cleaned when visibly soiled.
- 4. The food prep areas were not being cleaned and sanitized before and after food prep.
- 5. The food prep areas were not being cleaned and sanitized between preparing raw and cooked food.

- 6. Toilet seat(s), handle(s) and toilet bowl(s) were not being cleaned when visibly soiled and sanitized.
- 7. The sinks were not clean.
- 8. Diaper receptacles were not being cleaned and sanitized.
- 9. Potty chairs were not emptied and/or cleaned and sanitized after each use.
- 10. Wastebaskets/trash receptacles/rinse buckets were not being cleaned and sanitized when visibly soiled.
- 11. Other [].

Furniture, materials and equipment must be maintained according to the cleaning and sanitizing schedule in Appendix A to this rule. Technical assistance was provided at the time of the inspection, and as discussed, please correct this rule noncompliance. A written response for this rule noncompliance is not required at this time.

Domain: 03 Postings & Equipment

<u>Rule</u>: 5101:2-12-16 Medical, Dental, and General Emergency Plan Code: The program is required to post the fire and weather plans.

<u>Finding</u>: During the inspection, it was determined that the following information was not posted for item number(s) 3 below:

- 1. Fire alert plan, including a diagram indicating evacuation routes.
- 2. Weather alert plan was missing details for [].
- 3. Weather alert plan was missing a diagram indicating evacuation routes.

Submit the program's corrective action plan to the Department to verify compliance with the requirements of this rule.

Corrective Action Plan Due: 01/02/2022

Domain: 04 Indoor/Outdoor Space

Rule: 5101:2-12-11 Outdoor Space Requirements

<u>Code</u>: The program is required to have an outdoor play space free from debris.

<u>Finding</u>: During the inspection, it was determined that the outdoor area was littered with debris. Technical assistance was provided at the time of the inspection, and as discussed, please correct this rule noncompliance. A written response for this rule noncompliance is not required at this time.

Domain: 04 Indoor/Outdoor Space

Rule: 5101:2-12-11 Outdoor Space Requirements

<u>Code</u>: The program is required to have an outdoor play space free from general hazards.

<u>Finding</u>: During the inspection, it was determined that hazardous conditions existed in the outdoor play area, as noted in number(s) 10 below:

- 1. There was broken glass.
- 2. There were tall weeds.
- 3. There was poison ivy.
- 4. There were tree branches.
- 5. There was mold visible.
- 6. There were thistles with prickers.
- 7. There were bird droppings.
- 8. There were bolts with more than two threads exposed along a fence line or gate on a playground.
- 9. The sandbox was contaminated.
- 10. The plastic handle had broken off of one of the riding toys.

Submit the program's corrective action plan to the Department to verify compliance with the requirements of this rule.

Corrective Action Plan Due: 01/02/2022

Domain: 05 Health & Safety

Rule: 5101:2-12-22 Fluid Milk Requirements

<u>Code</u>: The program is required to obtain written documentation when serving substitutions for fluid milk.

<u>Finding</u>: During the inspection, it was determined that required documentation for substitutions for fluid milk was not on file as noted in number(s) 3 below:

- 1. Written instructions from a licensed physician, physician's assistant, or certified nurse practitioner when infants up to 12 months of age are served anything other than formula or breast milk.
- 2. Written instructions from a licensed physician, physician's assistant, or certified nurse practitioner when infants and toddlers 12 months of age up to 24 months of age are served anything other than unflavored whole homogenized vitamin D fortified cow's milk, breast milk, or non-cow milk substitution that is nutritionally equivalent to milk.
- 3. Written instructions from a licensed physician, physician's assistant, or certified nurse practitioner when toddlers and children 24 months of age and older are served anything other than unflavored one per cent milk

that is vitamin A and D fortified, unflavored fat free or skim milk that is vitamin A and D fortified, or non-cow milk substitutions that are nutritionally equivalent to milk (program had 2% milk).

4. Written parental consent for non-cow milk substitutions that are nutritionally equivalent to milk for children 12 months of age and older.

Technical assistance was provided at the time of the inspection, and as discussed, please correct this rule noncompliance. A written response for this rule noncompliance is not required at this time.

Domain: 05 Health & Safety

Rule: 5101:2-12-16 Emergency Drills

<u>Code</u>: The program is required to complete fire drills, weather drills, and emergency/lockdown drills appropriately.

<u>Finding</u>: During the inspection, it was determined that the required drills were not completed for item number(s) 1 below:

- 1. Monthly fire drills (no documentation for November).
- 2. Monthly weather emergency drills (March through September).
- 3. Emergency/lockdown drills in each quarter of the calendar year.

Submit the program's corrective action plan to the Department to verify compliance with the requirements of this rule.

Domain: 08 Staff Files

Rule: 5101:2-12-07 Administrator Responsibilities/Requirements

<u>Code</u>: The program administrator is required to maintain current employee records in the Ohio Professional Registry.

<u>Finding</u>: During the inspection, it was determined employment records in the Ohio Professional Registry (OPR) were not created or maintained as noted in number(s) 8 below:

- 1. At least one administrator, employee or child care staff member (including substitutes) had not created a profile.
- 2. At least one administrator, employee or child care staff member had not created an employment record for the program on or before their first day of employment.

- 3. At least one administrator, employee or child care staff member had not updated changes to positions or roles within five calendar days of the change.
- 4. The administrator had not assigned at least one employee or child care staff member to the program's organization dashboard.
- 5. At least one individual's schedule was not current.
- 6. At least one individual's position or role did not include an applicable group assignment.
- 7. At least one individual's employment had not been end dated.
- 8. No schedules had been entered for staff.

Submit the program's corrective action plan to the Department to verify compliance with the requirements of this rule.

Corrective Action Plan Due: 01/02/2022

Domain: 08 Staff Files

Rule: 5101:2-12-08 Medical Statement

<u>Code</u>: The program staff medicals are required to include all information.

<u>Finding</u>: In review of the staff records, it was determined that the medical statements for those employees listed on the Employee Record Chart did not include the required information listed below in number(s) 3 c:

- 1. Date of examination;
- 2. Signature, business address, and telephone number of the licensed physician, physician assistant, advanced practice nurse, certified midwife, or certified nurse practitioner who completed the examination;
- 3. A statement that verifies that the employee is:
- a. Physically fit for employment in a program caring for children;
- b. Immunized against Tetanus, Diphtheria, Pertussis (Tdap);
- c. Immunized against Measles, Mumps, and Rubella (MMR);
- 4. Tuberculosis (TB) screening/test
- a. Documentation of the screening process to determine if the employee resided in a country identified by the World Health Organization as having a high burden of TB and arrived in the United States within the five years preceding the date of application for employment;
- b. Results of a TB test for employees meeting both criteria in 4a;
- c. Results of additional testing for employees with a positive TB test;
- d. Written statement, signed by a representative of the TB control unit, that the employee's TB is no longer infectious or the individual is receiving a TB treatment regimen for employees with a positive TB test.

Submit the program's corrective action plan, which includes a copy of the completed employee medical statement, or TB results/documentation, to the Department to verify compliance with the requirements of this rule.

Domain: 08 Staff Files

Rule: 5101:2-12-10 Professional Development Requirements

<u>Code</u>: The program is required to ensure child care staff members, including substitutes used more than ninety days annually, obtain at least 6 hours of professional development each state fiscal year.

<u>Finding</u>: In review of the staff records, it was determined that at least one child care staff member did not meet the annual professional development requirement as noted in number(s) 1 below:

- 1. The child care staff member(s) had not completed at least six hours of professional development.
- 2. Documentation did not demonstrate the person who provided the training met the trainer qualifications as stated in the rule.
- 3. Training topic did not meet the requirements listed in appendix A of this rule.
- 4. Documentation of training did not meet the requirements of this rule.
- 5. The substitute(s) had been used more than ninety days annually between July first and June thirtieth and had not completed at least six hours of professional development
- 6. Other [].

Submit the program's corrective action plan to the Department to verify compliance with the requirements of this rule.
