Code: The program is required to retain the completed JFS 01217 "Request For Administration of Medication for Child Care" on file at the program.

Finding: During the inspection, it was determined that the program had administered medication to administer to a child without securing complete written instructions from the parent/guardian on the JFS 01217 "Request For Administration Of Medication For Child Care". The information noted in numbers 7, 8 below was not completed correctly in Box 1 and information noted in numbers 12,13,14 in Box 2 on the JFS 01217 "Request For Administration Of Medication For Child Care":

Provide training to staff responsible for the administration of medication and documentation on the prescribed form. See the Children Record Review for the names of children for whom corrected forms are needed. Submit the program's corrective action plan, which includes the completed JFS 01217 "Request for Administration of Medication for Child Care" for each child needed, and a statement that training was provided, to the Department to verify compliance with the requirements of this rule.

Finding: In review of the children's records, it was determined the JFS 01236 "Child Medical/Physical Care Plan For Child Care" was missing information and/or signatures, as noted in the following number 8 below, as required by the rule:

1. Child's name and date of birth;
2. Name of the condition;
3. Symptoms to watch for and action to be taken if symptoms occur;
4. Activities/foods/environmental conditions to avoid, if applicable;
5. Medical procedures to be followed and expected benefit;
6. Name of any applicable medication;
7. Instructions regarding emergency evacuation, if applicable;
8. Training instructions;
9. Dated signature of parent or certified professional who trained the program staff;
10. Dated signature(s) of child care staff member(s) trained to perform the procedure;
11. Directions regarding additional services, if applicable;



12. Dated signature of parent giving permission to perform the procedure;
13. Dated signature of program administrator;
14. Other [].

Domain: 01 Ratio & Supervision

Rule: 5101:2-12-18 Attendance Records

Code: The program is required to have the information listed in rule on all attendance records.

Finding: During the inspection, it was determined that the attendance records did not include all of the required information listed below:

1. The name of the child;
2. The birth date of the child;
3. The assigned group;
4. The child's weekly schedule;
5. The time (hours and minutes) of each child's arrival and departure to the program, including transportation by the program.

Information in number 5 must be added to the form used to maintain attendance records. Submit the program's corrective action plan to the Department to verify compliance with the requirements of this rule.

Domain: 02 Safe & Sanitary Environment

Rule: 5101:2-12-12 Safe Environment

Code: The program is required to store chemicals in a place that is inaccessible to children.

Finding: During the inspection, a potentially hazardous substance, which was determined to not present a serious risk to a child, was accessible to children as noted in number 1,2,8,9,11 below:

1. Cosmetics; (room 109 desk drawer)
2. Disinfecting wipes; (room 102 low shelf in cabinet)
3. Fish food;



4. Hand lotion;
5. Hand sanitizer (for children under 24 months);
6. Laundry detergent;
7. Powder dish washing soap;
8. Paint cans; (room 100 under unlocked sink)
9. White out; (room 100 drawer near sink; room 104 under unlocked sink)
10. Potting Soil;
11. Other potentially hazardous substance-Odor Eliminator (room 109 desk drawer)

The potentially hazardous substance was determined to be accessible to children in the following areas: classrooms 100, 102, 104, and 109.

Provide staff training. Submit the program's corrective action plan, which includes a statement that the potentially hazardous substance is no longer accessible to children and a statement that training was provided, to the Department to verify compliance with the requirements of this rule.

Corrective Action Plan Due: 02/28/2018

Domain: 04 Indoor/Outdoor Space

Rule: 5101:2-12-11 Outdoor Space Requirements

Code: The program is required to conduct and document quarterly inspections of their outdoor play space.

Finding: During the inspection, it was determined that quarterly inspections of one or more outdoor play area(s) and equipment had not been completed and documented as required, using the JFS 01281 "Child Care Playground Inspection Report" form. Submit the program's corrective action plan to the Department to verify compliance with the requirements of this rule.

Corrective Action Plan Due: 02/28/2018

Domain: 05 Health & Safety

Rule: 5101:2-12-16 Emergency Drills

Code: The program is required to complete fire drills, weather drills, and emergency/lockdown drills appropriately.

Finding: During the inspection, it was determined that the required drills were not completed for item numbers 2 and 3 below:

1. Monthly fire drills;
2. Monthly weather emergency drills (March through September);
3. Quarterly emergency/lockdown drills.



Submit the program's corrective action plan to the Department to verify compliance with the requirements of this rule.

Rule: 5101:2-12-10 Professional Development Requirements

Code: The program staff is required to obtain at least 6 hours of professional development annually.

Finding: In review of the staff records, it was determined that Child Care Staff Members had not completed at least 6 hours of professional development annually, as required by this rule. Refer to the Employee Record Chart for the name(s) of the Child Care Staff Member(s) who must complete additional professional development hours. Submit the program's corrective action plan to the Department to verify compliance with the requirements of this rule.

Corrective Action Plan Due: 02/28/2018

Domain: 08 Staff Files

Rule: 5101:2-12-10 Health Training Requirements

Code: The program is required to have staff complete the required one hour prescribed Child Abuse training.

Finding: In review of the staff records, it was determined that the requirement for the ODJFS one-hour prescribed Child Abuse Training was not met as noted in number 3 below:

1. The training was not completed within sixty days of hire;
2. The training expired, as it is only valid for two years;
3. Not all administrators, Child Care Staff Members, and substitutes have completed the training.

Refer to the Employee Record Chart for the name(s) of the Child Care Staff Member(s) who must complete the ODJFS one-hour prescribed Child Abuse Training. Submit the program's corrective action plan to the Department to verify compliance with the requirements of this rule.

Rule: 5101:2-12-10 Health Training Requirements

Code: The program is required to maintain a staff schedule with coverage of the required health trainings.

Finding: In review of the staff records, it was determined that at least one Child Care Staff Member with currently valid training in CPR was not present/scheduled to be present during all center hours of operation as required, for the following reason as noted in number 1 below:

1. The training taken by staff present/scheduled had expired;
2. Child Care Staff Members scheduled during this time had not taken CPR;
3. A trained Child Care Staff Member was not present in each building used by children;
4. A Child Care Staff Member scheduled at this time did not have verification of completion of CPR;
5. The training taken by staff did not include all age groups the program serves.

Submit the program's corrective action plan, which includes verification of complete coverage for CPR training, to the Department to verify compliance with the requirements of this rule.

Corrective Action Plan Due: 02/28/2018

Domain: 09 Children's Files

Rule: 5101:2-12-25 Medication Administration and Food Supplements

Code: The program is required to use the appropriate form and retain current documentation to administer medications. The program is also required to obtain separate documentation for each medication and child, and retain on file each JFS 01217 "Request for Administration of Medication for Child Care" for at least one year.

Finding: During the inspection, it was determined the program did not meet the requirements for the JFS 01217 "Request for Administration of Medication for Child Care" as noted in numbers 1, and 4 below:

1. The program used an old version of the JFS 01217;
2. The signature date on the JFS 01217 exceeded more than 12 months;
3. The time period to administer the medication on the JFS 01217 was exceeded;
4. The JFS 01217 included more than one medication;
5. The JFS 01217 included more than one child's name;
6. The JFS 01217 was not on file for one year.

Submit the program's corrective action plan to the Department to verify compliance with the requirements of this rule.

Rule: 5101:2-12-15 Child Medical and Enrollment Records

Code: The program is required to have a completed medical statement on file at the program for each child enrolled.

Finding: Information that must be complete on each child's medical statement includes:

1. Child's name and date of birth;
2. The date of the medical examination;
3. A statement that the child has been examined and is in suitable condition for participation in group care;
4. The signature, business address and telephone number of the physician, physician's assistant (PA), advance practice nurse (APN) or certified nurse practitioner (CNP) who examined the child;
5. A record of immunizations the child has had specifying month, day and year;
6. A statement from the physician, PA, APN, or CNP that the child has been immunized or is in the process of being immunized against the diseases required by division 5104.014 of the Revised Code and found in appendix A to this rule;
7. A statement from the child's parent or guardian that he or she has declined to have the child immunized against the disease for reasons of conscience, including religious convictions.

In review of 25% of the children's records, it was determined that the medical statements for children listed on the Children Record Review were missing the required information in number 4 above. Technical assistance was provided at the time of the inspection, and as discussed, please correct this rule noncompliance. A written response for this rule noncompliance is not required at this time.

Rule: 5101:2-12-15 Child Medical and Enrollment Records

Code: The program is required to have a completed JFS 01234 "Child Enrollment and Health Information For Child Care" on file for each child enrolled.

Finding: In review of 25% of the children's records, it was determined that information had not been secured from the parent/guardian on the JFS 01234 "Child Enrollment and Health Information For Child Care", as required, for the items in numbers 1(s) [] below:

1. Complete parent information;
2. Complete emergency contact information;
3. Complete physician information;
4. Information regarding the parent list;
5. Health information;
6. Additional information for all boxes checked "yes";



7. Emergency transportation information;
8. Parent/guardian's signature;
9. Diapering Statement;
10. Acknowledgement of Policies and Procedures.

Technical assistance was provided at the time of the inspection, and as discussed, please correct this rule noncompliance. A written response for this rule noncompliance is not required at this time.

Domain: 09 Children's Files

Rule: 5101:2-12-15 Child Medical and Enrollment Records

Code: The program is required to have a completed and signed JFS 01234 "Child Enrollment and Health Information For Child Care" on file for each child enrolled.

Finding: In review of 25% of the children's records, it was determined that the required JFS 01234 "Child Enrollment and Health Information For Child Care" had not been reviewed and signed by the administrator, as required. Technical assistance was provided at the time of the inspection, and as discussed, please correct this rule noncompliance. A written response for this rule noncompliance is not required at this time.

Domain: 10 Written Policies & Procedures

Rule: 5101:2-12-16 Written Disaster Plan

Code: The program is required to have a written disaster plan completed.

Finding: During the inspection, it was determined the program's written disaster plan provided to all child care staff and employees was missing the information in numbers 10,11,16 and incomplete for numbers 1,2,3, below:

Procedures:

1. Weather emergencies and natural disasters which include severe thunderstorms, tornadoes, flash flooding, major snowfall, blizzards, ice storms or earthquakes;
2. Emergency outdoor and indoor lockdown or evacuation due to threats of violence which includes active shooter, bioterrorism or terrorism;
3. Emergency or disaster evacuations due to hazardous materials and spills, gas leaks or bomb threats;
4. Outbreaks, epidemics or other infectious disease emergencies;
5. Loss of power, water, or heat;
6. Other threatening situations that may pose a health or safety hazard to the children in the program.



Details:

7. Shelter in place or evacuation, how the program will care for and account for the children until they can be reunited with the parent;
8. Assisting infants and children with special needs and/or health conditions;
9. Emergency contact information for parents and the program;
10. Procedures for notifying and communicating with parents regarding the location of the children if evacuated;
11. Procedures for communicating with parents during loss of communications, no phone or internet service available;
12. The location of supplies and procedures for gathering necessary supplies for staff and children if required to shelter in place;
13. What to do if a disaster occurs during the transport of children or when on a field trip or routine trip;
14. Training of staff or reassignment of staff duties as appropriate;
15. Updating the plan on a yearly basis;
16. Contact with local emergency management officials.

Add the missing information to the disaster plan. Submit the program's corrective action plan, which includes the missing information, to the Department to verify compliance with the requirements of this rule.

Domain: 10 Written Policies & Procedures

Rule: 5101:2-12-07 Written Program Policies and Procedures

Code: The program's policies and procedures are required to include all topics outlined in rule.

Finding: During the inspection, it was determined the program's written policies and procedures provided to the parents/guardians and employees was missing or incomplete for item numbers 6,13,20,22,26 below:

General Information

1. Program name, address, email address and telephone number;
2. Description of the program's program philosophy;
3. Days and hours of operation, scheduled closings and basic daily schedule;
4. Staff/child ratios and group size;
5. Meals and snacks provided;
6. Outdoor play, including limitations placed on outdoor play due to weather or safety issues. Considerations may include but are not limited to temperature, humidity, wind chill, ozone levels, pollen count, lightning, rain or ice;
7. Opportunities for parent involvement in program activities;
8. Opportunities for parents to meet with teachers regarding their child;
9. Payment schedule, overtime charges and registration fees as applicable;
10. Supports for onsite breastfeeding or pumping for mothers who wish to do so (if the program serves infants or toddlers).

Program Policies and Procedures



11. Enrollment including required enrollment information;
12. Enrollment of children without immunizations;
13. Attendance including procedures for arrival and departure, the program's absent day policy, releasing child to persons other than the parent, releasing a child according to a custody agreement and follow up when a child scheduled to arrive from another program or activity does not arrive;
14. Supervision and child guidance;
15. Parent provided food and program-wide dietary policy, if applicable. If all of the food is parent provided, the policy shall also include if the program supplements food when the parent does not provide sufficient food for the day;
16. Management of illness including isolation precautions, symptoms for discharge and return and notification of parent of ill child;
17. Summary of procedures taken in the event of an emergency, serious illness or injury;
18. Administration of medication including food supplements, modified diets and whether school age children are permitted to carry their own medication and ointments;
19. Transportation for trips and emergencies;
20. Water activities/swimming;
21. Infant care, if applicable, including frequency of diaper checks;
22. Napping and Resting;
23. Evening and overnight care, if applicable;
24. Policy on operation and/or closing due to weather, school delays or closings and any other factors;
25. Policy on when the program will require disenrollment of a child;
26. Procedure for parents or employees to follow when needing assistance in resolving problems related to the child care program;
27. Policy on whether or not the program will provide child care services to children whose parents refuse to grant consent for transportation to the source of emergency treatment;
28. Policy on whether the program conducts formal assessments on enrolled children and if the program reports child level data to ODJFS pursuant to 5101:2-17-02 of the Administrative Code.
