Domain: 04 Indoor/Outdoor Space

Rule: 5101:2-12-11 Outdoor Play Equipment

<u>Code</u>: The program is required to anchor equipment to the ground as required, to close "S" hooks to prevent the chain from slipping off and prevent strangulation and provide equipment with openings that will not pose a safety risk.

<u>Finding</u>: "During the inspection, it was determined that equipment on the outdoor play space posed an imminent risk of harm to a child as noted in number(s) 7 below:

- 1. The climber was not anchored.
- 2. The swings were not securely anchored.
- 3. The slide was not securely anchored.
- 4. The climbing rope was not securely anchored at both ends.

5. The "S" hooks on the climber were not closed in order to prevent the chain from slipping off the hook and prevent strangulation.

6. The "S" hooks on the swing(s) were not closed in order to prevent the chain from slipping off the hook and prevent strangulation.

7. The climber on SA playground had an opening that was greater than three and one-half inches, but less than nine inches. Equipment openings must be less than 3 1/2 inches or more than 9 inches to avoid the risk of entrapment, in that a portion of barrier material used to prevent a child from falling off the equipment was partially removed from the equipment.

Discontinue the use of this equipment until it has been removed, repaired or replaced. Submit the program's corrective action plan to the Department to verify compliance with the requirements of this rule."

<u>Code</u>: The program is required to use the appropriate form and retain current documentation to administer medications. The program is also required to obtain separate documentation for each medication and child, and retain on file each JFS 01217 "Request for Administration of Medication for Child Care" for at least one year. The program is required to administer medication only if it has the prescription label attached or had written instructions from a licensed physician. The program is also required to have each medication to be administered stored in its original container.

<u>Finding</u>: During the inspection, it was determined the program did not meet the requirement(s) for administering a medication, food supplement or medical food to a child as noted in number(s) 19 below:

1. No JFS 01217 "Request for Administration of Medication for Child Care" was on file.

- 2. The child's name was missing on the JFS 01217.
- 3. The child's date of birth was missing on the JFS 01217.



- 4. The child's weight was missing on the JFS 01217.
- 5. The name of the medication was missing on the JFS 01217.
- 6. The exact dose was missing on the JFS 01217.
- 7. The time to administer was missing on the JFS 01217.
- 8. The time period to administer was missing on the JFS 01217.
- 9. The Parent/Guardian's dated signature was missing on the JFS 01217.
- 10. Possible side effects were missing on the JFS 01217.
- 11. Expiration date was missing on the JFS 01217.
- 12. Physician instructions were missing on the JFS 01217.
- 13. Physician's dated signature was missing on the JFS 01217.
- 14. Physician's phone number was missing on the JFS 01217.
- 15. Date medication was administered was missing on the JFS 01217.
- 16. Time medication was administered was missing on the JFS 01217.
- 17. Dosage administered was missing on the JFS 01217.
- 18. Staff member's signature was missing on the JFS 01217.
- 19. A current prescription label was not attached to the prescription medication.
- 20. The medication or product, [], was not brought to the program in its original container.
- 21. Parent instructions conflict with either the manufacturer or physician instructions.

Submit the program's corrective action plan, which includes the completed JFS 01217 for each child needed, verification that the prescription label is now attached, and/or verification that the medication or product is now in its original container, and a statement that training was provided, to the Department to verify compliance with the requirements of this rule.

<u>Finding</u>: During the inspection, it was determined that a medication, Glycerin, was within the reach of children in the room, in that the bottle was stored in an unlocked cabinet on a low shelf. All medications must be stored out of the reach of children. Create procedures that assure medications will always be inaccessible to children. Provide staff training. Submit the program's corrective action plan, which includes a statement that training was provided, to the Department to verify compliance with the requirements of this rule.

<u>Finding</u>: A written, signed and dated JFS 01236 "Child Medical/Physical Care Plan" must be on file for any child having health conditions which require monitoring for symptoms or a medical procedure be performed at the program. In review of the children's records, it was determined that the required written information was either not on file, implemented or followed, for at least one child indicated on the Children Records Review, as noted in number(s) 10 below:

- 13. Training instructions were missing.
- 14. Dated signature of parent or certified professional who trained the program staff was missing.
- 15. Dated signature(s) of child care staff member(s) trained to perform the procedure were missing.
- 16. Directions regarding additional services, if applicable, were missing.
- 17. Dated signature of parent giving permission to perform the procedure was missing.
- 18. Dated signature of program administrator was missing.
- 19. The plan was not implemented.
- 20. The plan was not able to be implemented due to conflicting information.
- 21. The plan was not followed.

Submit the program's corrective action plan, which includes a copy of the completed JFS 01236 "Child Medical/Physical Care Plan", to the Department to verify compliance with the requirements of this rule.

Low Risk Non-Compliances



Domain: 02 Safe & Sanitary Environment

Rule: 5101:2-12-12 Safe Environment

<u>Code</u>: The program is required to label all cleaning and sanitizing supplies.

<u>Finding</u>: During the inspection, it was determined that not all cleaning/sanitizing supplies had been clearly labeled. When cleaning or sanitizing supplies are not stored in their original containers, the container must be labeled with the contents. Technical assistance was provided at the time of the inspection, and as discussed, please correct this rule noncompliance. A written response for this rule noncompliance is not required at this time.

Domain: 02 Safe & Sanitary Environment

<u>Rule</u>: 5101:2-12-13 Sanitary Equipment and Environment <u>Code</u>: The program is required to provide equipment and materials that are easy to clean.

<u>Finding</u>: During the inspection, it was determined that at least one piece of equipment, furnishings, or material at the program(red cushions on bench in SA room) was not constructed of materials to facilitate cleaning and sanitizing as noted in number(s) 4 below:

- 1. The material had a tear;
- 2. The material was not washable;
- 3. The material was porous;
- 4. The surface was cracked;
- 5. The surface was repaired, but in a manner that still did not facilitate cleaning and sanitizing;
- 6. Other [].

Equipment, furnishings, and furniture shall be constructed of materials to facilitate cleaning and shall be kept clean and in good repair. Technical assistance was provided at the time of the inspection, and as discussed, please correct this rule noncompliance. A written response for this rule noncompliance is not required at this time.

<u>Rule</u>: 5101:2-12-16 Medical, Dental, and General Emergency Plan <u>Code</u>: The program is required to post and implement the JFS 01242 "Medical, Dental, and General Emergency Plan" when necessary.



<u>Finding</u>: During the inspection, it was determined the requirements for the JFS 01242 "Medical, Dental, and General Emergency Plan for Child Care" were not followed as noted in number(s) 2 below, in that page 2 of the plan was not posted:

1. The plan was not posted by each telephone.

- 2. The plan was not posted in each classroom.
- 3. The plan was not posted in other spaces used by children.
- 4. The name, address and telephone number of the program were not complete.

5. The location of first aid kit, fire extinguishers and fire alarm system, fire alarm pull stations and electrical circuit box were not complete.

6. The telephone number for emergency squad, fire department, hospital, poison control program, public children services agency, local health department, local emergency management agency, and police department were not complete.

7. Location of children's records was not complete.

8. Emergency information including any medications or supplies needed in the event of an evacuation was not complete.

9. The current version of the prescribed form was not used.

10. The plan was not implemented when necessary in that [].

Submit the program's corrective action plan to the Department to verify compliance with the requirements of this rule.

Rule: 5101:2-12-11 Outdoor Play Fall Zones

<u>Code</u>: The program is required to provide adequate fall surface for the outdoor play space.

<u>Finding</u>: During the inspection, it was determined that while there was adequate fall surface material in the outdoor play space (school age playground), proper distribution had not been maintained under and around equipment as required. Submit the program's corrective action plan, which includes a statement that fall surface material has been properly redistributed, to the Department to verify compliance with the requirements of this rule.

<u>Code</u>: The program is required to provide a barrier on equipment that is 30 inches or more from the ground to prevent falling.

<u>Finding</u>: During the inspection, it was determined that the toddler climber and school age climber was 30 inches or more from the ground and did not have a protective barrier as required, that would prevent a child from falling off this piece of equipment. In order to prevent a fall, discontinue use of this equipment until a barrier has been installed. Submit the program's corrective action plan, which includes a statement verifying a protective barrier has been installed or that the equipment will no longer be used, to the Department to verify compliance with the requirements of this rule.

Domain: 04 Indoor/Outdoor Space

Rule: 5101:2-12-11 Outdoor Play Equipment

<u>Code</u>: The program is required to provide equipment that does not pose a safety risk.

<u>Finding</u>: During the inspection, it was determined that outdoor play equipment (green slide on toddler climber, rails, bolts on toddler climber, fall surface on school age playground, rails, bolts on school age climber) was unsafe as noted in number(s) 1,2,3,6,9,10 below:

- 1. There was rust exposed;
- 2. There was protruding bolts, nails;
- 3. There were cracks;
- 4. There were holes;
- 5. There was splintering wood;
- 6. There were sharp edges or points;
- 7. There were lead hazards;
- 8. There were toxic substances;
- 9. There were tripping hazards;
- 10. There was chipped and/or peeling paint;
- 11. Other [].

Submit the program's corrective action plan to the Department to verify compliance with the requirements of this rule.

Rule: 5101:2-12-16 First Aid/Standard Precautions

<u>Code</u>: The program is required to have a first aid kit onsite.

<u>Finding</u>: During the inspection, it was determined the program was missing required items listed in appendix A of this rule, that are to be contained in a first aid kit (vehicle), as noted in number(s) 9 below, in that the Toothsaver kit had expired:

- 1. The program did not have a first aid kit [onsite, on the vehicle, on a field trip].
- 2. One roll of hypoallergenic first-aid tape.
- 3. Individually wrapped sterile gauze squares in assorted sizes.
- 4. Sterile adhesive bandages in assorted sizes.
- 5. Tweezers.
- 6. Gauze rolled bandage.
- 7. Triangular bandage.
- 8. Rounded end scissors.

9. Tooth preservation system or fresh chilled liquid milk in which to transport a lost permanent tooth, including a written reference indicating location of the refrigerator/freezer where milk is stored if a tooth preservation system is not part of the first aid kit (for programs serving school age children only).

- 10. A working digital thermometer.
- 11. Disposable non-latex gloves.
- 12. A working flashlight.

13. An instant cold pack that has not been activated or ice, including a written reference indicating location of the refrigerator/freezer where the ice is stored if an instant cold pack is not part of the first aid kit.

14. Sealable leak-proof plastic bags in assorted sizes or double bagged plastic bags that can be securely tied for materials soiled with blood or bodily fluids.

15. Pocket mask or face shield, appropriate for all ages of children in care, for cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR) administration.

16. Soap or waterless sanitizer (field trip or transporting away from the program only).

17. Bottled water (field trip or transporting away from the program only).

18. The program did not have a system to replace items as they were used, expired, damaged or sterile packages were opened.

Technical assistance was provided at the time of the inspection, and as discussed, please correct this rule noncompliance. A written response for this rule noncompliance is not required at this time.

Domain: 08 Staff Files

Rule: 5101:2-12-10 Health Training Requirements

<u>Code</u>: The program is required to have staff complete the required one hour prescribed Child Abuse training.

<u>Finding</u>: In review of the staff records, it was determined that the requirement for the ODJFS one-hour prescribed Child Abuse Training was not met as noted in number(s) 2 below:

1. The training was not completed within sixty days of hire;

2. The training expired, as it is only valid for two years;



3. Not all administrators, Child Care Staff Members, and substitutes have completed the training.

<u>Finding</u>: In review of the staff records, it was determined that completed medical examination statement(s) for the employee(s) listed on the Employee Record Chart was not on file, as required by this rule. Submit the program's corrective action plan, which includes a copy of the completed employee medical statement, to verify compliance with the requirements of this rule.

<u>Code</u>: The program administrator is required to maintain current employee records in the Ohio Professional Registry.

<u>Finding</u>: During the inspection, it was determined employment records were not entered or updated within five calendar days of the change in the Ohio Professional Registry (OPR) as noted in number(s) 3,4,5 below:

1. At least one administrator, employee or child care staff member (including substitutes) had not created an employment record in the OPR for the program.

2. The administrator had not assigned at least one employee or child care staff member to the program's organization dashboard in the OPR.

- 3. At least one individual's schedule was not current.
- 4. At least one individual's position or role was not current.
- 5. At least one individual's employment had not been end dated.
- 6. Other: []

- 5. The JFS 01217 included more than one medication.

- 7. The JFS 01217 was not on file for one year.
- 8. The prescription label was not current.

8. Medical(s) were missing a statement from the physician, PA, APN, or CNP that the child has been immunized or is in the process of being immunized against the diseases required by division 5104.014 of the Revised Code and found in appendix A to this rule

9. Medical(s) were missing a statement from the child's parent or guardian that he or she has declined to have the child immunized against the disease for reasons of

conscience, including religious convictions
