Domain: 01 Ratio & Supervision

<u>Rule</u>: 5101:2-12-18 Ratio

<u>Code</u>: The program is required to maintain the appropriate staff to child ratio for each group served.

<u>Finding</u>: During the inspection, a ratio of 1 child care staff member for 22 children was determined to have occurred for the school-age group when the situation in number 15 below occurred:

- 1. A child care staff member stepped out of the room.
- 2. A child care staff member had not arrived at work on time.
- 3. Children were present who were not scheduled to be there.
- 4. A child care staff member was unable to work.
- 5. A child was injured in that group.
- 6. A child arrived in the group before a second staff member was scheduled to arrive with the group.



7. Two groups were combined, and the program did not follow the ratio for the youngest child in the group.

8. A child was transitioning to the next older age group, and the program did not follow the ratio for the youngest child in the group.

9. Ratio was doubled for more than two hours while children were napping.

10. Ratio was doubled while children were napping for a group that included at least one infant.

11. Ratio was doubled while children were napping and there were not enough staff members in the building to meet staff/child ratio.

12. Ratio was doubled in the school age group to allow access to the program, however, the program does not serve only school age children.

13. Both child care staff members did not have a working communication device when one staff member left the group to allow access to the school age only program.

14. The child care staff member did not return to the group after allowing access to the school age only program.

15. Other [a staff member went inside the building when the the group of school age children were on the outdoor play space].

Additional child care staff members must be hired or current child care staff members must be rescheduled to maintain compliance. Provide staff training. Submit the program's corrective action plan, which includes a statement that training was provided, to the Department to verify compliance with the requirements of this rule.

<u>Finding</u>: During the inspection, it was determined that a medication, Auvi-Q, was within the reach of children. The medication was stored in a child's bookbag on the ground on the outdoor play space and was within reach of children. All medications must be stored out of the reach of children. Create procedures that assure medications will always be inaccessible to children. Provide staff training. Submit the program's corrective action plan, which includes a statement that training was provided, to the Department to verify compliance with the requirements of this rule.

<u>Finding</u>: A written, signed and dated JFS 01236 "Child Medical/Physical Care Plan" must be on file for any child having health conditions which require monitoring for symptoms or a medical procedure be performed at the program. In review of the children's records, it was determined that the required written information was either not on file, implemented or followed, for at least one child indicated on the Children Records Review, as noted in number 9 below:

- 1. No plan was on file.
- 2. Child's name was missing.
- 3. Child's date of birth was missing.
- 4. Name of the condition was missing.
- 5. Symptoms to watch for were missing.
- 6. Action to be taken if symptoms to occur were missing.

- 13. Training instructions were missing.
- 14. Dated signature of parent or certified professional who trained the program staff was missing.
- 15. Dated signature(s) of child care staff member(s) trained to perform the procedure were missing.
- 16. Directions regarding additional services, if applicable, were missing.
- 17. Dated signature of parent giving permission to perform the procedure was missing.
- 18. Dated signature of program administrator was missing.
- 19. The plan was not implemented.
- 20. The plan was not able to be implemented due to conflicting information.
- 21. The plan was not followed.

<u>Code</u>: The program is required to have a method for tracking the children in each group. The tracking method must be updated throughout the day and kept with the group at all times.

<u>Finding</u>: During the inspection, it was determined that the method for tracking children in each group did not meet the requirements of the rule as noted in number 1 below:

- 1. There was no method in place;
- 2. The method did not include each child's name;
- 3. The method did not include each child's date of birth;
- 4. The tracking method did not remain with the group at all times;
- 5. The tracking method was not updated throughout the day as children entered or left the group.

Submit the program's corrective action plan to the Department to verify compliance with the requirements of this rule.

<u>Code</u>: The program is required to post the staff to child ratios, age grouping, and maximum group size appendix in a noticeable area in the program.

<u>Finding</u>: During the inspection it was determined that Appendix A of this rule, "Staff/Child Ratios, Age Grouping and Maximum Group Size", was not posted in a noticeable area in the program. Technical assistance was provided at the time of the inspection, and as discussed, please correct this rule noncompliance. A written response for this rule noncompliance is not required at this time.

<u>Rule</u>: 5101:2-12-16 Medical, Dental, and General Emergency Plan <u>Code</u>: The program is required to post and implement the JFS 01242 "Medical, Dental, and General Emergency Plan" when necessary.

<u>Finding</u>: During the inspection, it was determined the requirements for the JFS 01242 "Medical, Dental, and General Emergency Plan for Child Care" were not followed as noted in number 6 below:

- 1. The plan was not posted by each telephone.
- 2. The plan was not posted in each classroom.
- 3. The plan was not posted in other spaces used by children.
- 4. The name, address and telephone number of the program were not complete.

5. The location of first aid kit, fire extinguishers and fire alarm system, fire alarm pull stations and electrical circuit box were not complete.

6. The telephone number for emergency squad, fire department, hospital, poison control program, public children services agency, local health department, local emergency management agency, and police department were not complete.

7. Location of children's records was not complete.

8. Emergency information including any medications or supplies needed in the event of an evacuation was not complete.

9. The current version of the prescribed form was not used.

10. The plan was not implemented when necessary in that [].

<u>Code</u>: The program is required to provide equipment that does not pose a safety risk.

<u>Finding</u>: During the inspection, it was determined that outdoor play equipment was unsafe as noted in number 11 below:

- 1. There was rust exposed;
- 2. There was protruding bolts;
- 3. There were cracks;
- 4. There were holes;
- 5. There was splintering wood;
- 6. There were sharp edges or points;
- 7. There were lead hazards;
- 8. There were toxic substances;
- 9. There were tripping hazards;
- 10. There was chipped and/or peeling paint;

11. Other [the circular play pit had a liner on the border that was partally detached, a tripping hazard].

Submit the program's corrective action plan to the Department to verify compliance with the requirements of this rule.

<u>Rule</u>: 5101:2-12-11 Outdoor Space Requirements <u>Code</u>: The program is required to have an outdoor play space free from general hazards.

<u>Finding</u>: During the inspection, it was determined that the following hazardous conditions existed in the outdoor play area, as noted in number 10 below:

- 1. There was broken glass.
- 2. There were tall weeds.
- 3. There was poison ivy.
- 4. There were tree branches.
- 5. There was mold visible.
- 6. There were thistles with prickers.
- 7. There were bird droppings.
- 8. There were bolts with more than two threads exposed along a fence line or gate on a playground.
- 9. The sandbox was contaminated.

10. Other [protruding bolts were observed on the border surrounding the protective surface of the climber]. Submit the program's corrective action plan to the Department to verify compliance with the requirements of this rule.

<u>Rule</u>: 5101:2-12-16 First Aid/Standard Precautions <u>Code</u>: The program is required to have a first aid kit onsite.

<u>Finding</u>: During the inspection, it was determined the program was missing required items listed in appendix A of this rule, that are to be contained in a first aid kit, as noted in number 5, 10, 12, 16, 17 below:

1. The program did not have a first aid kit [onsite, on the vehicle, on a field trip].

2. One roll of hypoallergenic first-aid tape.

3. Individually wrapped sterile gauze squares in assorted sizes.

4. Sterile adhesive bandages in assorted sizes.

5. Tweezers.

6. Gauze rolled bandage.

7. Triangular bandage.

8. Rounded end scissors.

9. Tooth preservation system or fresh chilled liquid milk in which to transport a lost permanent tooth, including a written reference indicating location of the refrigerator/freezer where milk is stored if a tooth preservation system is not part of the first aid kit (for programs serving school age children only).

10. A working digital thermometer.

11. Disposable non-latex gloves.

12. A working flashlight.

13. An instant cold pack that has not been activated or ice, including a written reference indicating location of the refrigerator/freezer where the ice is stored if an instant cold pack is not part of the first aid kit.

14. Sealable leak-proof plastic bags in assorted sizes or double bagged plastic bags that can be securely tied for materials soiled with blood or bodily fluids.

15. Pocket mask or face shield, appropriate for all ages of children in care, for cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR) administration.

16. Soap or waterless sanitizer (field trip or transporting away from the program only).

17. Bottled water (field trip or transporting away from the program only).

18. The program did not have a system to replace items as they were used, expired, damaged or sterile packages were opened.

Technical assistance was provided at the time of the inspection, and as discussed, please correct this rule noncompliance. A written response for this rule noncompliance is not required at this time.

Rule: 5101:2-12-16 First Aid/Standard Precautions



<u>Code</u>: The program is required to have the appropriate number of first aid kits for the program.

<u>Finding</u>: During the inspection, it was determined that the first aid supplies were not stored according to the requirements listed in item number 1 below:

1. Stored in a clearly marked container.

2. Stored in an unlocked container.

3. Stored out of the reach of children.

4. In each building.

5. On each floor.

6 For every 75 children in attendance.

<u>Rule</u>: 5101:2-12-16 Management of Communicable Disease <u>Code</u>: The program is required to post the JFS 08087 "Ohio Department of Health Communicable Disease Chart."

<u>Finding</u>: During the inspection, it was determined that the JFS 08087 "Ohio Communicable Disease Chart" was not posted as required, as indicated in number 1 below:

- 1. The chart was not posted.
- 2. In a location readily available to program staff and parents.
- 3. The posted chart was not the current version.

Technical assistance was provided at the time of inspection, and as discussed, please correct this rule noncompliance. A written response for this rule noncompliance is not required at this time.

Domain: 05 Health & Safety

Rule: 5101:2-12-22 Safe Food Handling/Storage

<u>Code</u>: The program is required to refrain from serving food on bare tables and to remove, clean, and sanitize highchair trays when food is served directly on the tray.



<u>Finding</u>: During the inspection, it was determined that the program did not implement safe food handling when serving food as noted in number 1 below:

1. Food was served on bare tables for the school-age group.

2. Food was served directly on highchair trays, and the trays were not removed, cleaned, and sanitized between use for the [] group.

Technical assistance was provided at the time of the inspection, and as discussed, please correct this rule noncompliance. A written response for this rule noncompliance is not required at this time.

Domain: 06 Program Information

<u>Rule</u>: 5101:2-12-24 Swimming and Water Safety Requirements <u>Code</u>: The program is required to obtain parental permission before a swimming activity.

<u>Finding</u>: In the review of the program's records, it was determined that the written parental permission for children to participate in swimming activities was missing the required information indicated in numbers 1, 2, 4 below:

- 1. The child's name and date of birth;
- 2. Statement indicating whether the child is a non-swimmer or capable of swimming;
- 3. Location of the water activities or swimming site by water of eighteen or more inches in depth;
- 4. A statement of whether or not the program is providing additional adults or Child Care Staff Members above the licensing ratio requirements for this activity;
- 5. A signature and date from the parent indicating permission for the activity.

Technical assistance was provided at the time of the inspection, and as discussed, please correct this rule noncompliance. A written response for this rule noncompliance is not required at this time.

Domain: 06 Program Information

<u>Rule</u>: 5101:2-12-14 Transportation and Field Trip Procedures <u>Code</u>: The program is required to have staff trained in CPR, First Aid, and Communicable Diseases on all trips.

<u>Finding</u>: During the inspection, it was determined that a person trained in cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR), first aid and management of communicable disease, had not been present for number 1 below as required by the rule:



- 1. In the vehicle for routine trips;
- 2. In the vehicle for field trips;
- 3. At the destination on all field trips.

Secure current training for the area needed or restructure the staff who are currently trained on the vehicle during routine trips and field trips. Submit the program's corrective action plan to the Department to verify compliance with the requirements of this rule.

Rule: 5101:2-12-08 Medical Statement

<u>Code</u>: The program staff medicals are required to include all information.

<u>Finding</u>: In review of the staff records, it was determined that the medical statements for those employees listed on the Employee Record Chart did not include the required information listed below in number(s) 4a.

1. Date of examination;

2. Signature, business address, and telephone number of the licensed physician, physician assistant, advanced practice nurse, certified midwife, or certified nurse practitioner who completed the examination;

- 3. A statement that verifies that the employee is:
- a. Physically fit for employment in a program caring for children;
- b. Immunized against Tetanus, Diphtheria, Pertussis (Tdap);
- c. Immunized against Measles, Mumps, and Rubella (MMR);
- 4. Tuberculosis (TB) screening/test

a. Documentation of the screening process to determine if the employee resided in a country identified by the World Health Organization as having a high burden of TB and arrived in the United States within the five years preceding the date of application for employment;

- b. Results of a TB test for employees meeting both criteria in 4a;
- c. Results of additional testing for employees with a positive TB test;

d. Written statement, signed by a representative of the TB control unit, that the employee's TB is no longer infectious or the individual is receiving a TB treatment regimen for employees with a positive TB test.

Submit the program's corrective action plan, which includes a copy of the completed employee medical statement, or TB results/documentation, to the Department to verify compliance with the requirements of this rule.
