Rule: 5101:2-12-18 Ratio

Code: The program is required to maintain the appropriate staff to child ratio for each group served.

<u>Finding</u>: During the inspection, required staff/child ratios were not maintained for different groups on multiple occasions, as noted below:

The ratio determined for the Mixed group of older infants and toddlers was 1 Child Care Staff Member(s) for 10 children. Additionally, a ratio of 1 Child Care Staff Member(s) for 16 children was determined for the Mixed group of older toddler, preschool, and Pre-K classrooms.

Additional staff members must be hired or current Child Care Staff Members must be rescheduled to maintain compliance. Provide staff training. Submit the program's corrective action plan, which includes a statement that training was provided, to the Department to verify compliance with the requirements of this rule.

Rule: 5101:2-12-25 Medication Administration and Food Supplements

Code: The program staff is required to administer medication following the instructions on the JFS 01217

"Request for Administrator of Medication for Child Care" form or attached prescription label.

<u>Finding</u>: During the inspection, it was determined the program had administered medication to a child and the written instructions on the JFS 01217 "Request for Administration of Medication for Child Care" form or attached prescription label were not followed as noted in number 1 below:

- 1. Medication had been administered to a child at the center at a different time than directed.
- 2. Medication was administered to a child for a longer or shorter period of time than directed.
- 3. The dose administered did not match the dosage required by the manufacturer's directions.
- 4. The dose administered did not match the dosage required by the written physician's instructions or the prescription label.
- 5. A child was administered the wrong medication provided to the program for that child.
- 6. Other: [].

Provide training to the staff designated to administer medication that the parent's and physician's instructions on the prescribed form, as well as instructions on the prescription label, must be followed to avoid over or under medicating a child. Submit the program's corrective action plan, which includes a statement that training was provided, to the Department to verify compliance with the requirements of this rule.

Rule: 5101:2-12-15 Medical/Physical Care Plans

<u>Code</u>: The program is required to have a completed JFS 01236 "Child Medical/Physical Care Plan" on file at the program for any child having a health condition. The program is required to implement and/or follow instructions on the JFS 01236 "Child Medical/Physical Care Plan" for a child with a health condition.

<u>Finding</u>: A written, signed and dated JFS 01236 "Child Medical/Physical Care Plan" must be on file for any child having health conditions which require monitoring for symptoms or a medical procedure be performed at the program. In review of the children's records, it was determined that the required written information was either not on file, implemented or followed, for at least one child indicated on the Children Records Review, as noted in numbers 1, 9, 11, 17 below:

- 1. No plan was on file.
- 2. Child's name was missing.
- 3. Child's date of birth was missing.
- 4. Name of the condition was missing.
- 5. Symptoms to watch for were missing.
- 6. Action to be taken if symptoms to occur were missing.
- 7. Activities/foods/environmental conditions to avoid, if applicable, were missing.
- 8. Medical procedures to be followed were missing.
- 9. Expected benefit was missing.
- 10. Name of any applicable medication was missing.
- 11. Medication listed in the procedures to follow was not onsite available to administer as instructed and alternate instructions for this situation were not included on the plan.
- 12. Instructions regarding emergency evacuation, if applicable, were missing.
- 13. Training instructions were missing.
- 14. Dated signature of parent or certified professional who trained the program staff was missing.
- 15. Dated signature(s) of child care staff member(s) trained to perform the procedure were missing.
- 16. Directions regarding additional services, if applicable, were missing.
- 17. Dated signature of parent giving permission to perform the procedure was missing.
- 18. Dated signature of program administrator was missing.
- 19. The plan was not implemented.
- 20. The plan was not able to be implemented due to conflicting information.
- 21. The plan was not followed.

Submit the program's corrective action plan, which includes a copy of the completed JFS 01236 "Child Medical/Physical Care Plan", to the Department to verify compliance with the requirements of this rule.

Domain: 09 Children's Files

Rule: 5101:2-12-15 Medical/Physical Care Plans

<u>Code</u>: The program is required to have staff trained to perform the procedures on the JFS 01236 "Child Medical/Physical Care Plan" present at the program when the child requiring the procedure is onsite. The program staff that are trained to perform the procedures listed on the JFS 01236 "Child Medical/Physical Care Plan" are to be the only staff permitted to perform the procedures.

<u>Finding</u>: During the inspection, it was determined a child with a condition that required a medical/physical care plan had been present and the program did not meet the requirement(s) noted in numbers 2, 4 below:

- 1. None of the child care staff members trained in the procedures on the medical/physical care plan were onsite when a child requiring the plan was present.
- 2. Child care staff members trained in the procedures on the medical/physical care plan were not scheduled to be present the entire the time the child requiring the plan was onsite.
- 3. None of the child care staff members trained in the procedures on the medical/physical care plan accompanied the child requiring the plan during a trip.
- 4. A child care staff member who had not been trained in the procedures on the medical/physical care plan performed the procedure.
- 5. Other: [].

Provide staff training. Submit the program's corrective action plan, which includes a statement that training was provided, to the Department to verify compliance with the requirements of this rule.

Low Risk Non-Compliances

Domain: 00 License & Approvals

Rule: 5101:2-12-02 Current Information

<u>Code</u>: The rule requires the program to request an administrator amendment within five days of the administrator's last day and qualifications submitted within thirty days.

<u>Finding</u>: During the inspection, it was determined that a change of administrator had been made and the owner or administrator had failed to provide notification of this change to the Department within five days and/or submit qualifications for the new administrator within 30 days. A license is only valid for the licensee, administrator, address and license capacity designated on the license. Program submitted the request during the licensing inspection. Technical assistance was provided, and as discussed, submit the request to amend the license and any required documentation, if applicable, through the licensing system, OCLQS.

Domain: 01 Ratio & Supervision

Rule: 5101:2-12-19 Supervision

<u>Code</u>: The program staff is required to supervise children in their assigned group by sight and hearing. Supervision includes being near enough to respond and reach children immediately including responding to the child's basic needs and protecting them from harm.

<u>Finding</u>: During the inspection, it was determined that children were not being properly supervised as noted in number 5 below:

- 1. Child(ren) were not within both sight and hearing of a child care staff member during indoor play.
- 2. Child(ren) were not within both sight and hearing of a child care staff member during outdoor play.
- 3. Child(ren) were not within both sight and hearing of a child care staff member more than once.
- 4. Staff were not physically present in the space and near enough to respond and reach the child(ren) immediately.
- 5. Other: child in the Frogs room had their head entirely covered by a blanket and their face was not visible to the child care staff member.

Children must be supervised according to rule and within both sight and hearing of a child care staff member at all times. Provide staff training. Submit the program's corrective action plan, which includes a statement that training was provided, to the Department to verify compliance with the requirements of this rule.

Corrective Action Plan Due: 10/07/2021

Domain: 02 Safe & Sanitary Environment

Rule: 5101:2-12-12 Safe Environment

Code: The program is required to have all surge protectors and outlets covered.

<u>Finding</u>: During the inspection, it was determined that 1 surge protectors/outlets did not have childproof receptacle covers in the Pre-K room. The program must have safety covers on all electrical outlets, including power strips and surge protectors, which are within the reach of the children. Technical assistance was provided at the time of the inspection, and as discussed, please correct this rule noncompliance. A written response for this rule noncompliance is not required at this time.

Domain: 02 Safe & Sanitary Environment

Rule: 5101:2-12-13 Handwashing Requirements

<u>Code</u>: The program is required to have all staff wash their hands as outlined in rule.

<u>Finding</u>: During the inspection, it was determined that at least one staff member with the Infant group did not wash his or her hands at the time listed in number 5 below, as required in rule:

- 1. Upon arrival for the day;
- 2. After breaks;
- 3. Upon returning from outside;
- 4. After toileting or assisting a child with toileting;
- 5. After each diaper change or pull-up change;
- 6. After contact with bodily fluids or cleaning up spills or objects contaminated with bodily fluids;
- 7. After cleaning or sanitizing or using any chemical products;
- 8. After handling pets, pet cages or other pet objects that have come in contact with the pet;
- 9. Before eating, serving or preparing food or bottles or feeding a child;
- 10. Before and after completing a medical procedure or administering medication;
- 11. When visibly soiled (must use soap and water);
- 12. Other [].

Submit the program's corrective action plan to the Department to verify compliance with the requirements of this rule.

Domain: 02 Safe & Sanitary Environment

Rule: 5101:2-12-12 Safe Environment

<u>Code</u>: The program is required to provide toys that are not small enough to be a choking hazard for infants and toddlers.

<u>Finding</u>: During the inspection, it was determined there were toys or other items, small enough to be swallowed present, in the space where infants and/or toddlers were in care. Wheels and an axle came apart from a wooden car and was observed in the play area on the carpet which was small enough to be swallowed and posed a choking hazard. Technical assistance was provided at the time of the inspection, and as discussed, please correct this rule noncompliance. A written response for this rule noncompliance is not required at this time.

Domain: 02 Safe & Sanitary Environment

Rule: 5101:2-12-13 Sanitary Equipment and Environment

<u>Code</u>: The program is required to use an appropriate germicidal solution to sanitize equipment.

<u>Finding</u>: During the inspection, it was determined that an appropriate germicidal solution was not used to sanitize after each diaper change as required by Appendix A of this rule, as noted in number 3 below:

- 1. The manufacturer's directions were not followed;
- 2. The solution used was not a commercial product registered by the United States Environmental Protection Agency as a sanitizer;
- 3. Other: sanitizing solution was available; however, it was not being used between diaper changes

Submit the program's corrective action plan to the Department to verify compliance with the requirements of this rule.

Domain: 02 Safe & Sanitary Environment

Rule: 5101:2-12-13 Handwashing Requirements

<u>Code</u>: The program is required to have all children wash their hands as outlined in rule.

<u>Finding</u>: During the inspection, it was determined that at least one child in the Infant group did not wash his or her hands at the time listed in number 2 below, as required in rule:

- 1. Upon arrival;
- 2. After toileting/diaper change;
- 3. After contact with bodily fluids;
- 4. After returning from outdoor play;
- 5. After handling pets, pet cages, or other pet objects that have come in contact with the pet, before moving on to another activity;
- 6. Before eating or assisting with food preparation;
- 7. After water activities;
- 8. When visibly soiled (must use soap and water);
- 9. Other [].

Submit the program's corrective action plan to the Department to verify compliance with the requirements of this rule.

Corrective Action Plan Due: 10/07/2021

Domain: 03 Postings & Equipment

Rule: 5101:2-12-17 Materials and Equipment

<u>Code</u>: The program is required to have enough equipment for all children in care.

<u>Finding</u>: During the inspection, it was determined that equipment and materials in the following categories 3 were not provided in sufficient quantities for children in the Infant classroom, as required by the rule:

- 1. Art supplies (excludes infants);
- 2. Manipulative materials and equipment;
- 3. Blocks;
- 4. Science-nature equipment (excludes infants);
- 5. Language arts and auditory materials and equipment;
- 6. Pretend or dramatic play materials;
- 7. Music equipment;
- 8. Transportation materials and equipment;
- 9. Gross motor equipment;
- 10. Sensory motor equipment.

Technical assistance was provided at the time of the inspection, and as discussed, please correct this rule noncompliance. A written response for this rule noncompliance is not required at this time.

Domain: 07 Diapering & Infant Care

Rule: 5101:2-12-23 Infant Bottle and Food Preparation

Code: The program staff is required to label bottles containing formula or breast milk.

<u>Finding</u>: During the inspection, it was determined that bottles containing formula for a particular infant were not labeled with the child's name and date of preparation. Technical assistance was provided at the time of the inspection, and as discussed, please correct this rule noncompliance. A written response for this rule noncompliance is not required at this time.

Domain: 07 Diapering & Infant Care

Rule: 5101:2-12-23 Infant Bottle and Food Preparation

<u>Code</u>: The program is required to obtain written instructions from parents regarding feeding their infant.

<u>Finding</u>: During the inspection, it was determined that written instructions for feeding the infants noted on the Children Record Review were missing information as noted in number 1 below:

- 1. Written instructions were not on file.
- 2. Type of food and/or formula/breast milk was missing.
- 3. Amount of food and/or formula/breast milk was missing.
- 4. Feeding times or frequency of feedings was missing.
- 5. The written instructions on file had not been updated.

Technical assistance was provided at the time of the inspection, and as discussed, please correct this rule noncompliance. A written response for this rule noncompliance is not required at this time.

Domain: 07 Diapering & Infant Care

Rule: 5101:2-12-20 Cribs

<u>Code</u>: The program staff is required to remove any items listed in rule that obstruct the staff's view of the infant

from cribs.

<u>Finding</u>: During the inspection, it was determined that a child had been placed in a crib with an object which could obstruct a child care staff member's view of the infant, but is not likely to create a potential suffocation risk, as indicated in number 4 below:

- 1. Busy box or other toy attached to the side of the crib.
- 2. A blanket hanging over the side of the crib.
- 3. Stuffed animal that is not large/soft enough that it could conform to the shape of the child's face.
- 4. Pacifier which is attached to a ribbon or string, but the ribbon or string is not around the child's neck.
- 5. Other [].

Provide staff training. Submit the program's corrective action plan, which includes a statement that training was provided, to the Department to verify compliance with the requirements of this rule.

Corrective Action Plan Due: 10/07/2021

Domain: 08 Staff Files

Rule: 5101:2-12-08 Medical Statement

Code: The program staff medicals are required to include all information.

<u>Finding</u>: In review of the staff records, it was determined that the medical statements for those employees listed on the Employee Record Chart did not include the required information listed below in numbers 3c and 4a.

1. Date of examination;

- 2. Signature, business address, and telephone number of the licensed physician, physician assistant, advanced practice nurse, certified midwife, or certified nurse practitioner who completed the examination;
- 3. A statement that verifies that the employee is:
- a. Physically fit for employment in a program caring for children;
- b. Immunized against Tetanus, Diphtheria, Pertussis (Tdap);
- c. Immunized against Measles, Mumps, and Rubella (MMR);
- 4. Tuberculosis (TB) screening/test
- a. Documentation of the screening process to determine if the employee resided in a country identified by the World Health Organization as having a high burden of TB and arrived in the United States within the five years preceding the date of application for employment;
- b. Results of a TB test for employees meeting both criteria in 4a;
- c. Results of additional testing for employees with a positive TB test;
- d. Written statement, signed by a representative of the TB control unit, that the employee's TB is no longer infectious or the individual is receiving a TB treatment regimen for employees with a positive TB test.

Submit the program's corrective action plan, which includes a copy of the completed employee medical statement, or TB results/documentation, to the Department to verify compliance with the requirements of this rule.

Domain: 09 Children's Files

Rule: 5101:2-12-25 Medication Administration and Food Supplements

<u>Code</u>: The program is required to refrain from administering the first dose of a medication to a child.

<u>Finding</u>: During the inspection, it was determined that a child had not received the first dose or application prior to the program administering a dose or applying the product for any non-emergency medication, food supplement, medical food and/or topical product. Submit the program's corrective action plan to the Department to verify compliance with the requirements of this rule.

Corrective Action Plan Due: 10/07/2021

Domain: 09 Children's Files

Rule: 5101:2-12-25 Medication Administration and Food Supplements

<u>Code</u>: The program is required to use the appropriate form and retain current documentation to administer medications. The program is also required to obtain separate documentation for each medication and child, and retain on file each JFS 01217 "Request for Administration of Medication for Child Care" for at least one year.

<u>Finding</u>: During the inspection, it was determined the program did not meet the requirements for the JFS 01217 "Request for Administration of Medication for Child Care" as noted in numbers 1, 2 below:

- 1. The JFS 01217 was missing or incomplete for a topical product, food supplement, medical food.
- 2. The program used an old version of the JFS 01217.
- 3. The signature date on the JFS 01217 exceeded more than 12 months.
- 4. The time period to administer the medication on the JFS 01217 was exceeded.
- 5. The JFS 01217 included more than one medication.
- 6. The JFS 01217 included more than one child's name.
- 7. The JFS 01217 was not on file for one year.
- 8. The prescription label was not current.

Submit the program's corrective action plan to the Department to verify compliance with the requirements of this rule.

Corrective Action Plan Due: 10/07/2021

Domain: 09 Children's Files

Rule: 5101:2-12-15 Medical/Physical Care Plans

<u>Code</u>: The program is required to retain the JFS 01236 "Child Medical/Physical Care Plan" on file for at least one year.

<u>Finding</u>: In review of the children's records, it was determined that the JFS 01236 "Medical/Physical Care Plan" did not meet the requirements of the rule as noted in number 3 below:

- 1. The JFS 01236 had not been updated as needed and at least annually.
- 2. The JFS 01236 had not been kept on file for one year.
- 3. A separate JFS 01236 had not been used for each condition.

Submit the program's corrective action plan to the Department to verify compliance with the requirements of this rule.

Domain: 09 Children's Files

Rule: 5101:2-12-15 Child Medical and Enrollment Records

<u>Code</u>: The program is required to use the updated JFS 01234 "Child Enrollment and Health Information For Child Care" .



<u>Finding</u>: In review of 25% of the children's records, it was determined that information had not been secured from the parent/guardian on the JFS 01234 "Child Enrollment and Health Information For Child Care", as required, for the items in numbers 4, 5 below.

- 1. No enrollment form was completed for at least one child
- 2. The current JFS 01234 was not completed for at least one child
- 3. Complete parent information
- 4. Complete emergency contact information
- 5. Complete physician information
- 6. Information regarding the parent list
- 7. Health information
- 8. Additional information for all boxes checked "yes"
- 9. Emergency transportation information
- 10. Parent/guardian's signature
- 11. Diapering Statement
- 12. Acknowledgement of Policies and Procedures
- 13. Enrollment form for at least one child was not updated by either the parent or the administrator
- 14. Enrollment form for at least one child was not signed by the administrator
- 15. Other []

Technical assistance was provided at the time of the inspection, and as discussed, please correct this rule noncompliance. A written response for this rule noncompliance is not required at this time.

Domain: 10 Written Policies & Procedures

Rule: 5101:2-12-16 Written Disaster Plan

Code: The program is required to have a written disaster plan.

<u>Finding</u>: During the inspection, it was determined the program's written disaster plan did not meet the requirement or was missing the information in number 7, 11, 17, 18, 19 below: Procedures:

- 1. The written disaster plan had not been completed
- 2. The plan was not provided to all child care staff and employees
- 3. The plan was not used to respond to an emergency or disaster situation
- 4. Weather emergencies and natural disasters which include severe thunderstorms, tornadoes, flash flooding, major snowfall, blizzards, ice storms or earthquakes
- 5. Emergency outdoor and indoor lockdown or evacuation due to threats of violence which includes active shooter, bioterrorism or terrorism
- 6. Emergency or disaster evacuations due to hazardous materials and spills, gas leaks or bomb threats.
- 7. Outbreaks, epidemics or other infectious disease emergencies
- 8. Loss of power, water, or heat
- 9. Other threatening situations that may pose a health or safety hazard to the children in the program

Details:

- 10. Shelter in place or evacuation, how the program will care for and account for the children until they can be reunited with the parent
- 11. Assisting infants and children with special needs and/or health conditions
- 12. Emergency contact information for parents and the program
- 13. Procedures for notifying and communicating with parents regarding the location of the children if evacuated
- 14. Procedures for communicating with parents during loss of communications, no phone or internet service available
- 15. The location of supplies and procedures for gathering necessary supplies for staff and children if required to shelter in place
- 16. What to do if a disaster occurs during the transport of children or when on a field trip or routine trip
- 17. Training of staff or reassignment of staff duties as appropriate
- 18. Updating the plan on a yearly basis
- 19. Contact with local emergency management officials

Make the necessary revisions to the disaster plan. Submit the program's corrective action plan, which includes the revised information, to the Department to verify compliance with the requirements of this rule.
