Moderate Risk Non-Compliances

Domain: 04 Indoor/Outdoor Space

Rule: 5101:2-13-11 Outdoor Equipment

Code: The program is required to provide equipment that has openings less than 3 1/2 inches and no more than 9 inches to avoid the risk of entrapment.

Findings: During the inspection, it was determined that equipment on the outdoor play space posed an imminent risk of harm to a child as noted in number(s) 6 below:

- 1. The climber was not anchored.
- 2. The swings were not securely anchored.
- 3. The slide was not securely anchored.
- 4. The climbing rope was not securely anchored at both ends.

5. The "S" hooks on the climber were not closed in order to prevent the chain from slipping off the hook and prevent strangulation.

6. The "S" hooks on the swing(s) were not closed in order to prevent the chain from slipping off the hook and prevent strangulation.

7.The [] had an opening that was greater than three and one-half inches, but less than nine inches. Equipment openings must be less than 3 1/2 inches or more than 9 inches to avoid the risk of entrapment. Discontinue the use of this equipment until it has been removed, repaired or replaced. Submit the program's corrective action plan to the Department to verify compliance with the requirements of this rule.



Domain: 07 Diapering & Infant Care

Rule: 5101:2-13-20 Crib and Playpen Requirements Code: The program staff is required to place infants in a crib or playpen with no strangulation hazards.

Findings: During the inspection, it was determined that an infant was placed in a crib with the following suffocation or strangulation hazard (string on pacifier attached to the infant as well as infant sleeping with blanket over their face). Correct the violation and submit the program's corrective action plan to verify compliance with the requirement of the rule.

Corrective Action Plan Due: 09/29/2022

Domain: 07 Diapering & Infant Care

Rule: 5101:2-13-20 Crib and Playpen Requirements Code: The program staff is required to place infants in a crib or playpen to sleep unless a JFS 01235 "Sleep Position Waiver Statement for Child Care" is on file.

Findings: During the inspection, it was determined an infant slept in equipment other than their crib or playpen and did not have written permission from a physician on file. Correct the violation and submit the program's corrective action plan to verify compliance with the requirement of the rule.

Corrective Action Plan Due: 09/29/2022

Low Risk Non-Compliances

Domain: 00 License & Approvals

Rule: 5101:2-13-02 License Visible

Code: The program is required to have their license in a visible area.

Findings: During the inspection, it was determined the provider's license was not in a location visible to parents, as required. Submit the program's corrective action plan to verify compliance with the requirements of this rule.



Domain: 01 Ratio & Supervision

Rule: 5101:2-13-18 Attendance

Code: The program is required to maintain attendance records.

Findings: During the inspection, it was determined the program did not meet the requirements for keeping an attendance record as listed in number(s) 1, 2 and 3 below:

- 1. No attendance record was being maintained.
- 2. The attendance record was not being consistently completed.
- 3. The original attendance documentation was not kept at the program for a period of one year.

Submit the program's corrective action plan, which includes a statement that training was provided, to the Department to verify compliance with the requirements of this rule.

Corrective Action Plan Due: 09/29/2022

Domain: 02 Safe & Sanitary Environment

Rule: 5101:2-13-12 Pets

Code: The program is required to properly care for all pets.

Findings: During the inspection, it was determined that a pet at the program posed a threat to the safety or health of the children, in that the shots and proper licensing was not available on site at the program for 3 dogs residing at the program. Submit the program's corrective action plan to verify compliance with the requirements of this rule.

Corrective Action Plan Due: 09/29/2022

Domain: 02 Safe & Sanitary Environment

Rule: 5101:2-13-12 Safe Environment

Code: The program is required to protect children in care from items and conditions that threaten their health, safety, and well being.

Findings: Children in care shall be protected from any items and conditions which threaten their health, safety, and well being. During the inspection, it was determined that children were not protected from the following item(s) or condition(s) which may threaten their health, safety, or well being as noted in the following number(s) 1 below:

- 1. Telephone cords;
- 2. Stacked chairs;
- 3. Employee(s) purse(s);
- 4. Diaper bags;



- 5. Television not securely anchored;
- 6. Small or lightweight pieces of shelving units are not securely anchored to the wall;
- 7. Staff member stepped over a barrier/gate while holding a child;
- 8. Chipping or peeling paint;

9. Other: Coins were accessible to children in care. Mouthwash and other personal items were accessible in the bathroom.

Correct the violation and submit the program's corrective action plan to verify compliance with the requirement of the rule.

Corrective Action Plan Due: 09/29/2022

Domain: 02 Safe & Sanitary Environment

Rule: 5101:2-13-12 Safe Environment

Code: The program is required to remove toys or other items that may be a choking hazard from infants and toddlers.

Findings: During the inspection, it was determined there were toys or other items, small enough to be swallowed, present in the space where infants or toddlers were in care. Correct the violation and submit the program's corrective action plan to verify compliance with the requirement of the rule.

Corrective Action Plan Due: 09/29/2022

Domain: 03 Postings & Equipment

Rule: 5101:2-13-16 Medical, Dental, and General Emergency Plan

Code: The program is required to post the completed JFS 01242 "Medical, Dental, and General Emergency Plan for Child Care" and implement as required by rule.

Findings: During the inspection, it was determined the requirements for the JFS 01242 "Medical, Dental and General Emergency Plan" were not followed as noted in number(s) 7 below:

1. The plan was not posted on each level of the home used for child care.

2. The name, address and telephone number of the program were not complete.

3. The location of the first aid kit, fire extinguisher and fire alarm system, fire alarm pull stations and electrical circuit box were not complete.

4. The telephone number for emergency squad, fire department hospital, poison control program, public children services agency, local health department, local emergency management agency and police department were not complete.

5. Location of children's records was not complete.

6. Emergency information including any medications or supplies needed i the event of an evacuation was not complete.

7. The current version of the prescribed form was not used.



8. The plan was not implemented when necessary in that [].

Submit the program's corrective action plan to the Department to verify compliance with the requirements of this rule.

Corrective Action Plan Due: 09/29/2022

Domain: 03 Postings & Equipment

Rule: 5101:2-13-16 Medical, Dental, and General Emergency Plan Code: The program is required to post the completed JFS 01201 "Dental First Aid" and implement as required by rule.

Findings: During the inspection, it was determined the JFS 01201 "Dental First Aid" was not completed in that the updated version of the form was not posted. Correct the violation and submit the program's corrective action plan to verify compliance with the requirement of the rule.

Corrective Action Plan Due: 09/29/2022

Domain: 04 Indoor/Outdoor Space

Rule: 5101:2-13-11 Outdoor Equipment Code: Outdoor equipment is required to be safe.

Findings: During the inspection, it was determined that outdoor play equipment was unsafe as noted in the number(s) 3 below:

- 1. There was rust exposed.
- 2. There were protruding bolts.
- 3. There were cracks.- Cracks in the plastic on the swings/chain links.
- 4. There were holes.
- 5. There was splintering wood.
- 6. There were sharp edges or points.
- 7. There were toxic substances.
- 8. There were tripping hazards.
- 9. Other [].

Submit the program's corrective action plan to the Department to verify compliance with the requirements of this rule.



Domain: 05 Health & Safety

Rule: 5101:2-13-16 First Aid Kit/Standard Precautions Code: The program is required to meet the requirements for first aid kits.

Findings: During the inspection, it was determined that the program did not have a first aid kit [onsite/ on the vehicle/ on a field trip] as required, that included all items listed in the appendix A of the rule. The kit(s) were missing the item(s) or the item(s) were not replaced after use and/or expired listed in number(s) 9 below:

1. One roll of first-aid tape;

2. Individually wrapped sterile gauze;

squares in assorted sizes;

3. Sterile adhesive bandages in assorted sizes;

- 4.Tweezers;
- 5. Gauze rolled bandage;
- 6. Triangular bandage;
- 7. Rounded end scissors;

8. Tooth preservation system or fresh chilled liquid milk in which to transport a lost permanent tooth, including a written reference indicating location of the refrigerator/freezer where milk is stored if a tooth preservation system is not part of the first aid kit (for programs serving school age children only);

- 9. A working digital thermometer;
- 10. Disposable non-latex gloves;
- 11. A working flashlight;

12. An instant cold pack that has not been activated or ice, including a written reference indicating location of the refrigerator/freezer where the ice is stored if an instant cold pack is not part of the first aid kit;

13. Sealable leak-proof plastic bags in assorted sizes or double bagged plastic bags that can be securely tied for materials soiled with blood or bodily fluids;

14. Pocket mask or face shield, appropriate; for all ages of children in care, for cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR) administration;

15. Soap or waterless sanitizer (field trip or transporting away from the program only);

16. Bottled water (field trip or transporting away from the program only).

Correct the violation and submit the program's corrective action plan to verify compliance with the requirements of this rule.

Corrective Action Plan Due: 09/29/2022

Domain: 07 Diapering & Infant Care

Rule: 5101:2-13-23 Infant Daily Care

Code: The program staff is required to provide a daily written record for each infant in care.

Findings: During the inspection, it was determined that there was no daily written record for each infant provided to the parent or person picking up the infant on a daily basis. Submit the program's corrective action plan to verify compliance with the requirements of this rule.



Corrective Action Plan Due: 09/29/2022

Domain: 07 Diapering & Infant Care

Rule: 5101:2-13-23 Infant Bottle and Food Preparation Code: The program staff is required to have all bottles labeled.

Findings: During the inspection, it was determined that bottles containing formula for a particular infant were not labeled with the child's name and date of preparation. Submit the program's corrective action plan to verify compliance with the requirements of this rule.

Corrective Action Plan Due: 09/29/2022

Domain: 07 Diapering & Infant Care

Rule: 5101:2-13-23 Infant Bottle and Food Preparation

Code: The program is required to safely store, prepare, and serve formula, breast milk, and food.

Findings: During the inspection, it was determined that open containers of ready to serve food and concentrated formula was not stored appropriately as noted in number(s) 10 below:

- 1. The food/formula was not covered;
- 2. The food/formula was not dated;
- 3. The food/formula was not refrigerated according to the manufacturer's instructions;
- 4. The food/formula was not discarded or sent home daily if not used;
- 5. The food/formula was not refrigerated upon arrival;
- 6. The food/formula was not refrigerated immediately after preparation;
- 7. The food/formula was served beyond the expiration date;
- 8. The food/formula was not prepared prior to the manufacturer's instructions;

9. The food/formula was not prepared according to the instructions from the infant's physician, physician's assistant or certified nurse practitioner;

10. Other The infant's formula was placed in a separate compartment of the bottle and was not labeled with any manufacturer's information regarding expiration, date it was opened, etc.

Submit the program's corrective action plan to verify compliance with the requirements of this rule.
