Code: The program is required to keep equipment, furnishings, and materials clean and in good repair and clean the home daily.

Findings: During the inspection, it was determined that the following equipment was unclean or soiled during daily use, the stove top. Submit the program's corrective action plan to verify compliance with the requirements of this rule.

During the inspection, it was determined that children were not protected from the following item(s) or condition(s) which may threaten their health, safety, or well being as noted in the following number 12, 13 and 14 below:

- 1. Open pull cords that are not closed loop;
- 2. Telephone cords;
- 3. Electrical/Extension cords attached to an object that would likely result in a severe injury if pulled;
- 4. Stacked chairs;
- 5. Employee(s) purse(s);
- 6. Diaper bags;
- Television not securely anchored;
- 8. Small or lightweight pieces of shelving units are not securely anchored to the wall;
- 9. Staff member stepped over a barrier/gate while holding a child;
- 10. Chipping or peeling paint;
- 11. Emergency exits were blocked by the following furniture: [];
- 12. Several items stacked high on top of the television.
- 13. Two extension cords on the floor where children use the space.
- 14. Medicated ointment in the bathroom medicine cabinet.

Correct the violation and submit the program's corrective action plan to verify compliance with the requirement of the rule.



# **Domain: 04 Indoor/Outdoor Space**

Rule: 5101:2-13-11 Outdoor Space

Code: The program is required to use an outdoor space that is protected from traffic and other hazards with a

barrier.

Findings: During the inspection, it was determined that an area was used which was not protected from traffic and other hazards by a fence in good repair, or other barrier. Although the fence or natural barrier was not meeting the rule requirements, it was determined to not present an immediate risk for a child to be able to leave the playground. The fence or gate was not in good repair and/or being used inappropriately as noted in number 3 below:

- 1. The fencing had missing slat boards.
- 2. The fencing was broken.
- 3. The fencing was loose and not fully extended.
- 4. The fencing was rotting.
- 5. The gate was broken and did not close.
- 6. The gate was padlocked.
- 7. The latch on the gate was broken.
- 8. The latch was easily opened by children on the playground.
- 9. The gate had no latch.

Submit the program's corrective action plan to the Department to verify compliance with the requirements of this rule.

# Domain: 05 Health & Safety

Rule: 5101:2-13-16 Disaster Plan

Code: The program is required to have a completed written disaster plan.

Findings: During the inspection, it was determined the program's written disaster plan did not meet the requirement or was missing the information in number 8 below:

#### Procedures:

- 1. The written disaster plan had not been completed
- 2. The plan was not provided to all child care staff and employees
- 3. Weather emergencies and natural disasters which include severe thunderstorms, tornadoes, flash flooding, major snowfall, blizzards, ice storms or earthquakes
- 4. Emergency outdoor and indoor lockdown or evacuation due to threats of violence which includes active shooter, bioterrorism or terrorism
- 5. Emergency or disaster evacuations due to hazardous materials and spills, gas leaks or bomb threats.
- 6. Outbreaks, epidemics or other infectious disease emergencies
- 7. Loss of power, water, or heat
- 8. Other threatening situations that may pose a health or safety hazard to the children in the program Details:
- 9. Shelter in place or evacuation, how the program will care for and account for the children until they can be reunited with the parent

- 10. Assisting infants and children with special needs and/or health conditions
- 11. Emergency contact information for parents and the program
- 12. Procedures for notifying and communicating with parents regarding the location of the children if evacuated
- 13. Procedures for communicating with parents during loss of communications, no phone or internet service available
- 14. The location of supplies and procedures for gathering necessary supplies for staff and children if required to shelter in place
- 15. What to do if a disaster occurs during the transport of children or when on a field trip or routine trip
- 16. Training of staff or reassignment of staff duties as appropriate
- 17. Updating the plan on a yearly basis
- 18. Contact with local emergency management officials

Add the missing information to the disaster plan. Submit the program's corrective action plan, which includes the missing information, to the Department to verify compliance with the requirements of this rule.

#### Domain: 05 Health & Safety

Rule: 5101:2-13-22 Meals and Snacks

Code: The program is required to refrain from using television, computers, or other devices during meals and

snacks.

Findings: During this inspection it was determined that television/computer/device were on during meals and snacks. Correct the violation and submit the program's corrective action plan to verify compliance with the requirement of the rule.

Corrective Action Plan Due: 11/21/2021

#### Domain: 05 Health & Safety

Rule: 5101:2-13-22 Meals and Snacks

Code: The program is required to post a current menu for the week.

Findings: During this inspection, it was observed that the current menu for this week was not posted. Correct the violation and submit the program's corrective action plan to verify compliance with the requirement of the rule.

Rule: 5101:2-13-22 Meals and Snacks

Code: The program is required to provide the appropriate food groups with meals and snacks.

Findings: During this inspection it was determined that the meal served at the program did not include the following item from each food group, number 4:

- 4. Milk.

- 2. Version dated 12/2016.

Code: The program staff is required to have all bottles labeled.

Findings: During the inspection, it was determined that bottles containing milk/formula for a particular infant were not labeled with the child's name and date of preparation. Submit the program's corrective action plan to verify compliance with the requirements of this rule.

Rule: 5101:2-13-23 Diapering

Code: The program staff is required to change diapers immediately when wet or soiled.

Findings: During the inspection, it was determined that a child's basic diapering needs were not being met in number 2 below:

- 1. Diapers were not checked and immediately changed when needed.
- 2. Diapers not checked regularly.
- 3. Diapers not changed when found to be wet or soiled.
- 4. Other [ ].

- 2. Infants were not removed from the crib, swing, infant seat, exercise seat or other equipment throughout the day for individual attention;
- 3. Each non-crawling infant was not provided the opportunity for tummy time each day;
- 4. An 8-month-old infant was observed sitting on the couch, unattended by the provider.

Submit the program's corrective action plan to verify compliance with the requirements of this rule.

Corrective Action Plan Due: 11/21/2021

#### **Domain: 07 Diapering & Infant Care**

Rule: 5101:2-13-23 Infant Bottle and Food Preparation

Code: The program is required to retain and update infant feeding instructions.

Findings: During the inspection, it was determined that written instructions for feeding the infants noted on the Children Record Review form were not on file, as required by this rule. Correct the violation and submit the program's corrective action plan to verify compliance with the requirement of the rule.

Code: The program staff is required to complete at least six clock hours of training annually.

Findings: In review of records, it was determined the provider indicated on the Employee Record Chart did not meet the annual professional development requirement as noted in number 5.

- 2. Documentation did not demonstrate the person who provided the training met the trainer qualifications as stated in the rule.
- 3. Training topic did not meet the requirements listed in appendix A of this rule.
- 4. Documentation of training did not meet the requirements of this rule.
- 5. No verification of completing 6 hours of PD training.

Submit the program's corrective action plan to verify compliance with the requirements of this rule.

Code: The program is required to have a completed medical on file for each child.

Findings: In review of of the children's records, it was determined that completed medical statements were not on file, as required, for children listed on the JFS Children's Record Review For Child Care as indicated in number 9 below:

- 1. No medical was on file for at least one child
- 2. Medical(s) on file was not updated every 13 months
- 3. Medical(s) were missing child's name and date of birth
- 4. Medical(s) were missing the date of the medical examination
- 5. Medical(s) were missing a statement that the child has been examined and is in suitable condition for participation in group care
- 6. Medical(s) were missing the signature, business address and telephone number of the physician, physician's assistant(PA), advance practice nurse (APN) or certified

nurse practitioner (CNP) who examined the child

- 7. Medical(s) were missing a record of immunizations the child has had specifying month, day and year
- 8. Medical(s) were missing a statement from the physician, PA, APN, or CNP that the child has been immunized or is in the process of being immunized against the diseases

required by division 5104.014 of the Revised Code and found in appendix A to this rule

9. Medical was missing a statement from the child's parent or guardian that he or she has declined to have the child immunized against the disease for reasons of

conscience, including religious convictions

- 12. Care of children without immunizations.
