Code: The program staff is required to protect or remove a child from a situation and/or person that are determined to be

unsafe.

Allegation: Complainant alleges a bottle warmer fell on a child resulting in first degree burns.

Complainant alleges that a piece of glass was found in a infants diaper.

Determination: Substantiated

Findings: During the inspection, it was determined the administrator, child care staff, and/or employees of the program did not protect or remove children from a situation and/or person determined to be unsafe as noted in number 2 below:

- 1. Verbal argument involving adults;
- 2. Staff member(s) allow child(ren) to do something unsafe (a child was able to pull down a bottle warmer)
- 3. Staff member(s) doing something unsafe;
- 4. Other [].

An investigation into whether there was glass in a child's diaper was inconclusive.

While the program did not protect the child(ren) from an unsafe situation and/or person, it was determined the situation would not or did not result in a serious incident or injury to a child. All program employees must take actions to protect children in care. Provide staff training. Submit the program's corrective action plan, which includes a statement that training was provided, to the Department to verify compliance with the requirements of this rule.

Findings: During the inspection, it was determined that a JFS 01299 "Incident/Injury Report" was not completed by child care staff for the situation(s) listed in number 1 below:

- 1.Staff interviews revealed that incident reports are not always completed when a child becomes ill or receives an injury which requires first aid treatment.
- 2. A child was transported for emergency medical care.
- 3. A child received a bump or blow to the head.
- 4. An unusual or unexpected incident which jeopardized the safety of a child or employee of a program.
