Code: The program staff is required to supervise children in their assigned group by sight and hearing. Supervision includes being near enough to respond and reach children immediately including responding to the child's basic needs and protecting them from harm.

Allegation: It was alleged that child care staff were not adequately supervising children.

**Determination: Substantiated** 

Findings: The allegation is substantiated in that, during the inspection, it was determined that children were not being properly supervised as noted in number(s) 1 below:

- 1. Child(ren) were not within both sight and hearing of a child care staff member during indoor activities in that the child care staff members in the juniors room were positioned in a manner in which they could not see the children washing their hands at the sink in the restroom.
- 2. Child(ren) were not within both sight and hearing of a child care staff member during outdoor play.
- 3. Child(ren) were not within both sight and hearing of a child care staff member more than once.
- 4. Staff were not physically present in the space and near enough to respond and reach the child(ren) immediately.
- 5. Other: [ ].

Children must be supervised according to rule and within both sight and hearing of a child care staff member at all times. Provide staff training. Submit the program's corrective action plan, which includes a statement that training was provided, to the Department to verify compliance with the requirements of this rule.
