

Rule: 5101:2-12-12 Safe Environment

Code: The program is required to provide an environment that protects the children in care from any items and conditions that may threaten their health, safety, and well-being.

Findings: Children in care shall be protected from any items and conditions which threaten their health, safety, and wellbeing. During the inspection, it was determined that children were not protected from the following item(s) or condition(s) which may threaten their health, safety, or well-being as noted in number(s) 12 below:

- 1. Open pull cords that are not closed loop.
- 2. Telephone cords.
- 3. Electrical/extension cords attached to an object that would not likely result in a severe injury if pulled.
- 4. Stacked chairs.
- 5. Employee(s) purse(s).
- 6. Diaper bags.
- 7. Television not securely anchored.
- 8. Small or lightweight pieces of shelving units are not securely anchored to the wall.
- 9. Smoke detector needing batteries replaced.
- 10. Staff member stepped over a barrier/gate while holding a child.
- 11. Emergency exits were blocked by the following classroom furniture: [].

12. Other: Front door was unlocked and was not being watched. Two people walked in including the specialists without anyone knowing.
