Rule: 5101:2-13-04 Flammable and Combustible Materials in a Type B Home

Code: The program is required to properly store flammable and combustible materials and substances.

Findings: During the inspection, it was determined flammable and combustible materials and substances were stored near number 2 below:

- 1. Heater;
- 2. Furnace;
- 3. Water Heater;
- 4. Gas Appliance.

Correct the violation and submit the program's corrective action plan to verify compliance with the requirement of the rule.

Domain: 02 Safe & Sanitary Environment

Rule: 5101:2-13-12 Carbon Monoxide Detectors - Type B Only

Code: The program is required to meet all requirements for carbon monoxide detectors.

Findings: During the inspection, it was determined that the Type B Home did not have a working carbon monoxide detector on the basement and first floor where care is provided. Carbon monoxide detectors were not



installed in accordance with manufacturer's recommendations. A working carbon monoxide detector must be installed in accordance with manufacturer's recommendations. Submit the program's corrective action plan to verify compliance with this rule.

Rule: 5101:2-13-12 Safe Environment

Code: The program is required to protect children in care from items and conditions that threaten their health, safety, and well being.

Findings: Children in care shall be protected from any items which threaten their health, safety, and well being. During the inspection, it was determined that children were not protected from the following items which may threaten their health, safety, or well being as noted in the following numbers 2 and 9 below:

- 1. Telephone cords;
- 2. Stacked boxes in child care space
- 3. Employee(s) purse(s);
- 4. Diaper bags;
- 5. Television not securely anchored;
- 6. Small or lightweight pieces of shelving units are not securely anchored to the wall;
- 7. Staff member stepped over a barrier/gate while holding a child;
- 8. Chipping or peeling paint;
- 9. Other Kitchen drawer needs a lock or remove scissors and knife.

Correct the violation and submit the program's corrective action plan to verify compliance with the requirement of the rule.

Corrective Action Plan Due: 06/02/2022

### **Domain: 03 Postings & Equipment**

Rule: 5101:2-13-17 Programming

Code: The program is required to have a daily schedule posted in a visible place.

Findings: During the inspection, it was determined the daily schedule was not posted in a visible place in the program. Correct the violation and submit the program's corrective action plan to verify compliance with the requirement of the rule.

Findings: During the inspection, it was determined the JFS 01201 "Dental First Aid" was not posted. Correct the violation and submit the program's corrective action plan to verify compliance with the requirement of the rule.

- 2. Weather alert plan was not posted
- 3. Weather alert plan was missing a diagram indicating evacuation routes.

Correct the violation and submit the program's corrective action plan to verify compliance with the requirement of the rule.

### **Domain: 03 Postings & Equipment**

Rule: 5101:2-13-16 Medical, Dental, and General Emergency Plan

Code: The program is required to post the completed JFS 01242 "Medical, Dental, and General Emergency Plan for Child Care" and implement as required by rule.

Findings: During the inspection, it was determined the requirements for the JFS 01242 "Medical, Dental and General Emergency Plan" were not followed as noted in number 1 below:

- 1. The plan was not posted on each level of the home used for child care.
- 2. The name, address and telephone number of the program were not complete.
- 3. The location of the first aid kit, fire extinguisher and fire alarm system, fire alarm pull stations and electrical circuit box were not complete.

- 4. The telephone number for emergency squad, fire department hospital, poison control program, public children services agency, local health department, local emergency management agency and police department were not complete.
- 5. Location of children's records was not complete.
- 6. Emergency information including any medications or supplies needed i the event of an evacuation was not complete.
- 7. The current version of the prescribed form was not used.
- 8. The plan was not implemented when necessary in that [].

Submit the program's corrective action plan to the Department to verify compliance with the requirements of this rule.

Corrective Action Plan Due: 06/02/2022

### **Domain: 04 Indoor/Outdoor Space**

Rule: 5101:2-13-11 Outdoor Space

Code: The program staff is required to protect the children from hazardous conditions in the outdoor play area.

Findings: During the inspection, it was determined that the following hazardous conditions existed in the off-site outdoor play area, as noted in number 9 below:

- 1. There was broken glass.
- 2. There were tall weeds.
- 3. There was poison ivy.
- 4. There were tree branches.
- 5. There was mold visible.
- 6. The sandbox was contaminated.
- 7. There were thistles with prickers.
- 8. There were bird droppings.
- 9. Other Stove, lawn equipment, battery charger, exercise equipment, bags of soil, boxes and trash needs to be removed. Grill needs to have tarp or removed.

Correct the violation and submit the program's corrective action plan to verify compliance with the requirement of the rule.

Corrective Action Plan Due: 06/02/2022

### Domain: 05 Health & Safety

Rule: 5101:2-13-16 Communicable Diseases

Code: The program is required to post the Ohio Communicable Disease Chart in a noticeable area.

Findings: During the inspection, it was determined that the Ohio Communicable Disease Chart was not posted as required, as indicated in the number 3 below:

- 1. In a location readily available to provider, child care staff members, employees, and residents;
- 2. The chart was not posted.
- 3. The posted chart was not the current version.
- 4. The posted chart was not displayed in the size available in the ODJFS forms central to be easily read.

Submit the program's corrective action plan to verify compliance with the requirements of this rule.

Corrective Action Plan Due: 06/02/2022

### Domain: 05 Health & Safety

Rule: 5101:2-13-22 Meals and Snacks

Code: The program is required to safely store food.

Findings: During this inspection, it was determined that food was not stored in a safe manner in that the refrigerator did not maintain a temperature of 40 degrees Fahrenheit. Correct the violation and submit the program's corrective action plan to verify compliance with the requirement of the rule.

Corrective Action Plan Due: 06/02/2022

#### Domain: 05 Health & Safety

Rule: 5101:2-13-16 Emergency Drills

Code: The program is required to complete and document the required drills.

Findings: During the inspection, it was determined that the required drills were not completed for item number 2 and 3 below:

- 1. Monthly fire drills
- 2. Monthly weather emergency drills (March through September)
- 3. Emergency/lockdown drills in each quarter of the calendar year

Submit the program's corrective action plan to verify compliance with the requirements of this rule.

Corrective Action Plan Due: 06/02/2022

### **Domain: 07 Diapering & Infant Care**

Rule: 5101:2-13-20 Crib and Playpen Requirements

Code: The program is required to have the mattress support in the lowest position in all cribs.

Findings: During the inspection, it was determined the mattress support was not maintained at the lowest position for all cribs when in use, as required. Correct the violation and submit the program's corrective action plan to verify compliance with the requirement of the rule.

Corrective Action Plan Due: 06/02/2022

### **Domain: 07 Diapering & Infant Care**

Rule: 5101:2-13-20 Crib and Playpen Requirements

Code: The program is required to ensure that each mattress has a properly fitted sheet.

Findings: During the inspection, it was determined that sheets did not meet the rule requirement as noted in number 4 below.

- 1. At least one crib or playpen did not have a sheet.
- 2. At least one sheet was too large.
- 3. At least one sheet was too small.
- 4. Sheet was torn.

Correct the violation and submit the program's corrective action plan to verify compliance with the requirement of the rule.

### **Domain: 07 Diapering & Infant Care**

Rule: 5101:2-13-23 Infant Bottle and Food Preparation

Code: The program staff is required to have all bottles labeled.

Findings: During the inspection, it was determined that bottles containing formula for a particular infant were not labeled with the date of preparation. Submit the program's corrective action plan to verify compliance with the requirements of this rule.

### Domain: 07 Diapering & Infant Care

Rule: 5101:2-13-23 Infant Daily Care

Code: The program staff is required to provide a daily written record for each infant in care.

Findings: During the inspection, it was determined that there was no daily written record for each infant provided to the parent or person picking up the infant on a daily basis. Submit the program's corrective action plan to verify compliance with the requirements of this rule.

Rule: 5101:2-13-07 Provider Responsibilities

Code: The provider is required to have hours of availability to meet with parents posted in a noticeable place.

Findings: During the inspection, it was determined that the provider did not have hours of availability to meet with parents in a noticeable location. Correct the violation and submit the program's corrective action plan to verify compliance with the requirement of the rule.

Code: The program is required to have a completed medical on file for each child.

- 3. Medical(s) were missing child's name and date of birth
- 4. Medical(s) were missing the date of the medical examination

- 6. Medical(s) were missing a statement that the child has been examined and is in suitable condition for participation in group care
- 7. Medical(s) were missing the signature, business address and telephone number of the physician, physician's assistant(PA), advance practice nurse (APN) or certified
- nurse practitioner (CNP) who examined the child
- 8. Medical(s) were missing a record of immunizations the child has had specifying month, day and year
- 9. Medical(s) were missing a statement from the physician, PA, APN, or CNP that the child has been immunized or is in the process of being immunized against the diseases
- required by division 5104.014 of the Revised Code and found in appendix A to this rule
- 10. Medical(s) were missing a statement from the child's parent or guardian that he or she has declined to have the child immunized against the disease for reasons of

conscience, including religious convictions

- 21. Transportation policy for field trips, routine walks, if applicable, and emergencies including if the provider will provide child care services to children whose parents refuse to grant consent for transportation to the source of emergency treatment.
- 22. Water activities/swimming.
- 23. Infant care about daily activities.
- 24. Sleeping, napping and resting.

- 25. Evening and overnight care, if applicable.
- 26. Policy on hours of operation, closing due to weather, school delays or closings and any other factors.
- 27. Use of a substitute child care staff member or child care staff member pursuant to 5101:2-13-08 of the Administrative Code for sick days, vacations or other time off.
- 28. Situations that may require disenrollment of a child, if applicable.
- 29. Problem or issue resolution for parents or employees to follow when needing assistance in resolving problems related to the family child care home.
