Code: The program staff is required to place the bottle warmer in an area that is not accessible to children.

Findings: During the inspection, it was determined that the container used for heating bottles was accessible to children, in that the bottle warmer was on a table in the multipurpose room where infants and toddlers were combined. Toddlers were observed sleeping next to the table. Relocate the container. Provide training. Submit the program's corrective action plan, which includes a statement that training was provided, to the Department to verify compliance with the requirements of this rule.
