Allegation: The program is not providing developmentally appropriate activities for infants.

Determination: Substantiated

Findings: During the inspection, it was determined that the program's infant daily care did not meet the requirements of this rule as noted in number(s) 1,2,4 below:

- 1. Infants could not safely and comfortably sit, crawl, toddle, or walk and play according to the infant's stage of development in that the infants were observed sitting in bucket seats during a complaint inspection.
- 2. Infants were not removed from the crib, swing, infant seat, exercise seat or other equipment throughout the day for individual attention.
- 3. Each non-crawling infant was not provided the opportunity for tummy time, outside of their crib, each day.
- 4. Other: Infants were observed watching a tablet while sitting in bucket seats with no other activities provided.

Provide staff training. Submit the program's corrective action plan, which includes a statement that training was provided, to the Department to verify compliance with the requirements of this rule.
