Allegation: Teachers do not have an agreed upon behavior management plan in writing which involved the use of a weighted vest on a child.

Determination: Substantiated

Findings: During the inspection, it was determined the center did not follow the rule requirement when implementing a specific behavior plan as noted in numbers 1,2 below:

1. The center did not communicate and consult with the parent prior to implementing the plan which involved the use of a weighted vest on a child.
2. The center did not put the plan in writing and/or the plan was not signed by the parent which involved the use of a weighted vest on a child.
3. The plan was not consistent with the requirements of this rule.

2. The center did not put the plan in writing, and the plan was not signed by the parent when CCSM's used a weighted vest on a child to calm them down when they were overly stimulated.
3. The plan was not consistent with the requirements of this rule.
