Complaint Allegations

Domain:01 Ratio & Supervision

Rule: 5101:2-12-19 Child Guidance

Code: The program staff shall use developmentally appropriate techniques when managing children's behavior. Corporal punishment is prohibited, as well as any cruel, harsh, unusual or extreme techniques.

Allegation: Child care staff members use inappropriate language and tone when managing child behavior.

Determination: Substantiated

Findings: During the inspection, it was determined that a child care staff member used a discipline technique to guide or discipline children that was not developmentally appropriate, consistent, or occurred at the time of the incident. During the investigation it was confirmed staff have yelled at children and said phrases that were inappropriate. Provide staff training. Submit the program's corrective action plan, which includes a statement that training was provided, to the Department to verify compliance with the requirements of this rule.

Domain:02 Safe & Sanitary Environment

Rule: 5101:2-12-12 Safe Environment

Code: The program is required to provide an environment that protects the children in care from any items and conditions that may threaten their health, safety, and well-being.

Allegation: An area of the preschool bathroom wall above the sink is damaged and black.

Determination: Substantiated

Findings: During the inspection, it was determined that children were not protected from item(s) or condition(s) which may threaten their health, safety, or well-being as noted in number 22 below:

- 1. Surge protectors/outlets did not have childproof receptacle covers.
- 2. Open pull cords that are not closed loop.
- 3. Toys or other items small enough to be swallowed were present in the space where infants and/or toddlers were in care.
- 4. Electrical/extension cords attached to an object that would not likely result in a severe injury if pulled.
- 5. Stacked chairs.
- 6. Employee(s) purse(s).
- 7. Diaper bags.
- 8. Television not securely anchored.
- 9. Small or lightweight pieces of shelving units are not securely anchored to the wall.
- 10. Smoke detector needing batteries replaced.
- 11. An area rug did not have a nonskid backing.
- 12. An area rug presented a tripping hazard.
- 13. A floor surface that was unsafe.
- 14. No platform was provided for the sink or toilet in the classroom.
- 15. The platform provided for the sink or toilet in the classroom was not sturdy.

- 16. The platform provided for the sink or toilet in the classroom posed a safety hazard.
- 17. Telephone cords.
- 18. Staff member stepped over a barrier/gate while holding a child.
- 19. Emergency exits were blocked by the classroom furniture.
- 20. A mercury thermometer was being used to take a child's temperature.
- 21. Methods of ventilation used did not provide protection from rodents, insects, or other hazards.
- 22. Other: An area above the sink in the preschool restroom is damaged and back in color.

Submit the program's corrective action plan, which includes a statement that this area has been repaired, to the Department to verify compliance with the requirements of this rule.
