Code: The program is required to place infants in cribs while sleeping.

Allegation: Infants sleep on the floor on boppy pillows, in infant seats and in cribs with bibs on.

Determination: Substantiated

Findings: Based on information received in the course of the investigation it was determined and observed that 7, 8, 10 below had been used for sleeping infants and did not allow the infant to sleep on a firm mattress:

- 1. Mesh cribs;
- 2. Play pens;
- 3. Bassinets;
- 4. Cots;
- 5. Car seats;
- 6. Infant swing;
- 7. The floor;
- 8. Infant seats;
- 9. An infant placed in a car seat in a crib;
- 10. On boppy pillows.

Infants must be provided with a crib, which meets requirements specified in this rule, for resting and sleeping. Provide staff training. Submit the program's corrective action plan, which includes a statement that staff training was provided, to the Department to verify compliance with the requirements of this rule.

Code: The program is required to have documentation from ODJFS, indicating the individual is eligible to be employed in child care, on file before allowing the staff to have sole responsibility of children.

Findings: During the inspection, it was determined that a child care staff member had sole responsibility of a child in the Schoolage B group(s) and had only a preliminary approval but no JFS 01176 "Program Notification of Background Check Review for Child Care" was on file as required. Submit the program's corrective action plan, which includes a copy of the JFS 01176 or a statement that the child care staff member(s) no longer have sole responsibility of children, to the Department to verify compliance with the requirements of this rule.

Low Risk Non-Compliances

Rule: 5101:2-12-19 Supervision

Code: The program staff is required to supervise children in their assigned group by sight and hearing. Supervision includes being near enough to respond and reach children immediately including responding to the child's basic needs and protecting them from harm.

Findings: During the inspection, it was determined that children were not being properly supervised as noted in number(s) 1, 3, 4 below when a staff member had to stand at a chest high wall to observe both her Toddler group and the Toddler group in the adjacent room at nap time. One child's cot was placed behind a shelf, out of sight of the staff member. The staff member was observed walking away from the wall to meet the needs of the children in her room so that the adjacent room was unsupervised:

- 1. Child(ren) were not within both sight and hearing of a child care staff member during indoor play (naptime).
- 2. Child(ren) were not within both sight and hearing of a child care staff member during outdoor play.
- 3. Child(ren) were not within both sight and hearing of a child care staff member more than once.
- 4. Staff were not physically present in the space and near enough to respond and reach the child(ren) immediately.

Children must be supervised according to rule and within both sight and hearing of a child care staff member at all times. Provide staff training. Submit the program's corrective action plan, which includes a statement that training was provided, to the Department to verify compliance with the requirements of this rule.

Rule: 5101:2-12-20 Cots and Napping

Code: The program is required to provide enough cots or mats for each child in attendance to be assigned their individual cot/mat. Cots and mats must be firm, resilient, and in good condition.

Findings: During the inspection, it was determined that cots or mats did not meet the requirements as noted in number(s) 2 below:

- 1. The program did not have enough individually assigned cots and/or mats for each child.
- 2. Several children were observed sleeping on the floor in the Schoolage 2 room.
- 3. Frames were bent/broken.
- 4. Covers were torn.
- 5. Cots were missing bolts.
- 6. Cots were sagging.
- 7. Legs on the cots were broken.
- 8. Cots did not stand at least 3 inches but no more than 18 inches off the floor.
- 9. Cots were not at least 36 inches in length and as long as the child is tall.
- 10. Mats were not at least 1 inch thick and as wide and long as the child assigned.
- 11. Other [].

Rule: 5101:2-12-20 Cots and Napping

Code: The program is required to provide sufficient lighting when the children rest, nap, or sleep.

Findings: During the inspection, it was determined that the Infant area used when children rest, nap or sleep was not lighted sufficiently to allow child care staff visual supervision of the children at all times.
