Complaint Allegations

Code: The program staff is required to supervise children in their assigned group by sight and hearing. Supervision includes being near enough to respond and reach children immediately and protecting them from harm.

Allegation: A child was left unattended in a classroom.

Determination: Substantiated

Findings: During the inspection, it was determined that a child was left unattended while inside the program as noted in number 1 below:

- 1. A child was left unattended once when a teacher took the class outside and the child remained inside the classroom.
- 2. A child was left unattended more than once.
- 3. Child(ren) left the group and were unattended.
- 4. Child care staff were using a baby monitor to supervise children.
- 5. Child care staff were using a walkie talkie to supervise children.
- 6. Child care staff were using mirrors to view children in another room.
- 7. Child care staff were using a video camera instead of physically being present in the room.
- 8. Other [].

Children must be supervised and within sight and hearing of a child care staff member at all times. Provide staff training. Submit the program's corrective action plan, which includes a statement that training was provided, to the Department to verify compliance with the requirements of this rule.

Rule: 5101:2-12-16 Incident/Injury Reporting
