Complaint Allegations

Allegation: It was alleged that children had access to cleaning supplies while at the child care center.

Determination: Substantiated

Findings: During the inspection, a potentially hazardous item or toxic substance was used or stored in the Pre-K classroom where children had access to it, as noted in number 2 below.
