Findings: During the inspection, it was determined that written instructions for feeding the infants noted on the Children Record Review were missing information as noted in number(s) 5 below:

- 1. Written instructions were not on file.
- 2. Type of food and/or formula/breast milk was missing.
- 3. Amount of food and/or formula/breast milk was missing.
- 4. Feeding times or frequency of feedings was missing..
- 5. The written instructions on file had not been updated.

Findings: During the inspection, it was determined that the written record used to document infant routines and activities did not meet the requirements as noted in number(s) 2 below:

- 1. A daily written record was not provided to the parent or person picking up the infant on a daily basis.
- 2. Food intake was missing.
- 3. Sleeping patterns was missing.
- 4. Times and results of diaper changes was missing.
- 5. Information about daily activities was missing.
