Code: The program staff is required to supervise children in their assigned group by sight and hearing. Supervision includes being near enough to respond and reach children immediately and protecting them from harm.

Allegation: A child was observed to be in a classroom by themselves.

Determination: Substantiated

Findings: During the inspection, it was determined that a child was left unattended while inside the program. A child left the classroom when the preschool groups were combined at the end of the day. The child was found in their classroom located on the lower level. Children must be supervised and within sight and hearing of a childcare staff member at all times. Provide staff training. Submit the program's corrective action plan, which includes a statement that training was provided, to the Department to verify compliance with the requirements of this rule.

A child was observed to be by themselves in a classroom. Staff were not aware that the child had left the group. Submit the program's corrective action plan, which includes a statement that the program administrator or designee has completed the Serious Incident Report in OCLQS, to the Department to verify compliance with the requirements of this rule.
