Domain: 02 Safe & Sanitary Environment

Rule: 5101:2-12-12 Safe Environment

<u>Code</u>: The program is required to provide an environment that protects the children in care from any items and conditions that may threaten their health, safety, and well-being.

<u>Finding</u>: Children in care shall be protected from any items and conditions which threaten their health, safety, and well-being. During the inspection, it was determined the program did not protect children from an unsafe item, condition or equipment noted in number 2 and 17 below:

1. Closed ended pull cord(s) on the window blind(s)

- 2. Extension cord(s); electrical cord(s) attached to an object that could result in a severe injury if pulled.
- 3. Stacked tables.
- 4. Folding tables.
- 5. Matches and/or a lighter.
- 6. Power tool(s).
- 7. Live wires.
- 8. Stove(s) that are either on or able to be turned on by a child.
- 9. Asbestos.
- 10. Traffic.
- 11. A body of water.
- 12. A well.
- 13. Environmental hazard(s) confirmed by local authorities having jurisdiction over the hazard.
- 14. A crockpot used to heat bottles.
- 15. Immediate access to a knife.
- 16. Large or heavy pieces of shelving units are not securely anchored to the wall.
- 17. Other: An operating wax warmer within reach of children.

Any hazardous equipment must be removed, replaced, or repaired and any hazardous condition must be corrected and must be made inaccessible to children. Provide staff training. Submit the program's corrective



action plan, which includes a statement that the item or condition has been removed and a statement that training was provided, to the Department to verify compliance with the requirements of this rule.

Domain: 07 Diapering & Infant Care

Rule: 5101:2-12-20 Cribs

<u>Code</u>: The program staff is required to remove any items listed in rule that are a potential suffocation risk from cribs.

<u>Finding</u>: During the inspection, it was determined that a child had been placed in a crib with an object that created a potential strangulation or suffocation risk, as indicated in number 2 below:

- 1. Bib
- 2. Pacifier clip/ribbon
- 3. Teething jewelry
- 4. Blanket for infant under twelve months old
- 5. Pillow
- 6. Boppie
- 7. Bumper pad
- 8. Clothing stored in the crib
- 9. Diaper bag
- 10. Object or toy strung over the crib in which a child can pull himself up
- 11. Stuffed animal that is large/soft enough to conform to the shape of the child's face
- 12. Other []

The rule prohibits any item which obstructs child-care staff's visibility or poses a risk of strangulation or suffocation from being placed on or in a crib. Remove the item(s) immediately. Provide staff training. Submit the program's corrective action plan, which includes a statement that training was provided, to the Department to verify compliance with the requirements of this rule.

Domain: 07 Diapering & Infant Care

Rule: 5101:2-12-20 Cribs

<u>Code</u>: The program is required to place infants in cribs while sleeping.

<u>Finding</u>: During the inspection, it was determined that the equipment in number 7 below had been used for sleeping infants and did not allow the infant to sleep on a firm mattress:



- 1. Mesh cribs;
- 2. Play pens;
- 3. Bassinets;
- 4. Cots;
- 5. Car seats;
- 6. Infant swing;
- 7. The floor; on a Boppy.
- 8. Infant seats;
- 9. An infant placed in a car seat in a crib;
- 10. Other [].

Infants must be provided with a crib, which meets requirements specified in this rule, for resting and sleeping. Provide staff training. Submit the program's corrective action plan, which includes a statement that staff training was provided, to the Department to verify compliance with the requirements of this rule.

<u>Rule</u>: 5101:2-12-09 Background Check Requirements <u>Code</u>: The program is required to have all staff request background checks as required.

<u>Finding</u>: In review of the staff records, it was determined that background checks were not requested for the person(s) listed on the Employee Record Chart as noted in number 1 below:

- 1. Submitting the request for a background check for child care in the OPR.
- 2. Submitting fingerprints electronically according to the process established by BCI.

Rule: 5101:2-12-15 Medical/Physical Care Plans

<u>Code</u>: The program is required to have staff trained to perform the procedures on the JFS 01236 "Child Medical/Physical Care Plan" for Child Care" present at the program when the child requiring the procedure is onsite. The program staff that are trained to perform the procedures listed on the JFS 01236 are to be the only staff permitted to perform the procedures.

<u>Finding</u>: During the inspection, it was determined a child with a condition that required a JFS 01236 "Child Medical/Physical Care Plan" had been present and the program did not meet the requirement(s) noted in number 4 below:

1. None of the child care staff members trained in the procedures on the JFS 01236 were onsite when a child requiring the plan was present.

2. Child care staff members trained in the procedures on the JFS 01236 were not scheduled to be present the entire the time the child requiring the plan was onsite.

3. None of the child care staff members trained in the procedures on the JFS 01236 accompanied the child requiring the plan during a trip.

4. A child care staff member who had not been trained in the procedures on the JFS 01236 performed the procedure.

<u>Code</u>: The program is required to have a completed JFS 01236 "Child Medical/Physical Care Plan for Child Care" on file at the program for any child having a health condition. The program is required to implement and/or follow instructions on the JFS 01236 for a child with a health condition.

<u>Finding</u>: A written, signed and dated JFS 01236 "Child Medical/Physical Care Plan for Child Care" must be on file for any child having health conditions which require monitoring for symptoms, or a medical procedure be performed, or ongoing administration of medication or medical foods at the program. In review of the children's records, it was determined that the required written information was either not on file, implemented or followed, for at least one child indicated on the Children Records Review, as noted in number(s) 8, 13, 16, 18, 19, 20, 21, 22, 23, 24, 25, below:

- 1. No plan was on file.
- 2. Child's name was missing.
- 3. Child's date of birth was missing.
- 4. Name of the condition was missing.
- 5. Indication if medication is required was missing.
- 6. Symptoms to watch for were missing.
- 7. Directions for when should the medication or medical food be administered were missing.
- 8. Instructions for administration were missing.
- 9. Conditions that trigger the need for medication or medical foods were missing.
- 10. Expected results of the medication or medical food were missing.
- 11. Actions to be taken if the symptoms do not subside were missing.
- 12. Activities, foods, environmental conditions to avoid were missing.
- 13. Training instructions were missing.

14. Directions for action to be taken if expected result of medication or medical food does not occur were missing.

- 15. Instructions regarding emergency evacuation, if applicable, were missing.
- 16. Dated signature of parent was missing.

17. Dated signature of certified professional who trained the program staff was missing, if parent was not the trainer.

18. Printed name(s)/Dated signature(s) of child care staff member(s) trained to perform the procedure were missing.

- 19. Dated signature(s) of administrator was missing.
- 20. Name of any applicable medication was missing.
- 21. Date medication was administered was missing.
- 22. Time medication was administered was missing.
- 23. Dosage administered was missing.
- 24. Signature of staff member who administered the medication was missing.

25. Medication listed in the procedures to follow was not onsite available to administer as instructed and alternate instructions for this situation were not included on the plan.

- 26. The plan was not implemented.
- 27. The plan was not able to be implemented due to conflicting information.
- 28. The plan was not followed.

Low Risk Non-Compliances

Domain: 01 Ratio & Supervision

<u>Rule</u>: 5101:2-12-18 Attendance Records <u>Code</u>: The program is required to maintain a record of the arrival and departure of each child. The program is also required to retain the original attendance record at the center for a period of one year.

<u>Finding</u>: During the inspection, it was determined the program did not meet the requirements for keeping an attendance record as listed in number(s) 1 and 2 below:

1. No attendance record was being maintained.

- 2. The attendance record was not being consistently completed.
- 3. The original attendance documentation was not kept at the program for a period of one year.

Submit the program's corrective action plan, which includes a statement that training was provided, to the Department to verify compliance with the requirements of this rule.

Corrective Action Plan Due: 02/11/2023

Domain: 02 Safe & Sanitary Environment

Rule: 5101:2-12-12 Safe Environment

<u>Code</u>: The program is required to have all surge protectors and outlets covered.

<u>Finding</u>: During the inspection, it was determined that 2 outlets did not have childproof receptacle covers in the main lobby and Pre-K classroom. The program must have safety covers on all electrical outlets, including power strips and surge protectors, which are within the reach of the children. Technical assistance was provided at the time of the inspection, and as discussed, please correct this rule noncompliance. A written response for this rule noncompliance is not required at this time.



Domain: 02 Safe & Sanitary Environment

<u>Rule</u>: 5101:2-12-13 Sanitary Equipment and Environment <u>Code</u>: The program is required to follow the cleaning schedule for equipment.

<u>Finding</u>: During the inspection, it was determined that the program was not providing a clean and healthy environment, furniture, materials and equipment as required by Appendix A, as noted in number 11 below:

- 1. The changing table was not sanitized after each use.
- 2. Reusable cloths were not being cleaned daily or when visibly soiled.
- 3. Dividers were not cleaned when visibly soiled.
- 4. The food prep areas were not being cleaned and sanitized before and after food prep.
- 5. The food prep areas were not being cleaned and sanitized between preparing raw and cooked food.
- 6. Toilet seat(s), handle(s) and toilet bowl(s) were not being cleaned when visibly soiled and sanitized.
- 7. The sinks were not clean.
- 8. Diaper receptacles were not being cleaned and sanitized.
- 9. Potty chairs were not emptied and/or cleaned and sanitized after each use.
- 10. Wastebaskets/trash receptacles/rinse buckets were not being cleaned and sanitized when visibly soiled.
- 11. Other: Walls and vents were not being cleaned and sanitized when visibly soiled.

Furniture, materials and equipment must be maintained according to the cleaning and sanitizing schedule in Appendix A to this rule. Technical assistance was provided at the time of the inspection, and as discussed, please correct this rule noncompliance. A written response for this rule noncompliance is not required at this time.

Domain: 03 Postings & Equipment

Rule: 5101:2-12-16 Medical, Dental, and General Emergency Plan

<u>Code</u>: The program is required to post and implement the JFS 01242 "Medical, Dental, and General Emergency Plan" when necessary.

<u>Finding</u>: During the inspection, it was determined the requirements for the JFS 01242 "Medical, Dental, and General Emergency Plan for Child Care" were not followed as noted in number 8 below:

1. The plan was not posted in each classroom.

- 2. The plan was not posted in other spaces used by children.
- 3. The name, address and telephone number of the program were not complete.

4. The location of first aid kit, fire extinguishers and fire alarm system, fire alarm pull stations and electrical circuit box were not complete.



5. The telephone number for emergency squad, fire department, hospital, poison control program, public children services agency, local health department, local emergency management agency, and police department were not complete.

6. Location of children's records was not complete.

7. Emergency information including any medications or supplies needed in the event of an evacuation was not complete.

8. The current version of the prescribed form was not used.

9. The plan was not implemented when necessary in that [].

Submit the program's corrective action plan to the Department to verify compliance with the requirements of this rule.

Corrective Action Plan Due: 02/11/2023

Domain: 05 Health & Safety

Rule: 5101:2-12-16 Emergency Drills

<u>Code</u>: The program is required to complete fire drills, weather drills, and emergency/lockdown drills appropriately.

<u>Finding</u>: During the inspection, it was determined that the required drills were not completed for item number(s)1, 2, and 3 below:

1. Monthly fire drills.

2. Monthly weather emergency drills (March through September).

3. Emergency/lockdown drills in each quarter of the calendar year.

Submit the program's corrective action plan to the Department to verify compliance with the requirements of this rule.

Corrective Action Plan Due: 02/11/2023

Domain: 05 Health & Safety

<u>Rule</u>: 5101:2-12-16 Management of Communicable Disease <u>Code</u>: The program is required to post the JFS 08087 "Ohio Communicable Disease Chart".

<u>Finding</u>: During the inspection, it was determined that the JFS 08087 "Ohio Communicable Disease Chart" was not posted as required, as indicated in number 4 below:



1. The chart was not posted.

2. In a location readily available to program staff and parents.

3. The posted chart was not the current version, and the Child Care Manual Procedural Letter No. 159 was not attached.

4. The posted chart was not displayed in the size available in the ODJFS forms central to be easily read.

Technical assistance was provided at the time of inspection, and as discussed, please correct this rule noncompliance. A written response for this rule noncompliance is not required at this time.

Domain: 07 Diapering & Infant Care

<u>Rule</u>: 5101:2-12-23 Infant Bottle and Food Preparation <u>Code</u>: The program staff is required to label bottles containing formula or breast milk.

<u>Finding</u>: During the inspection, it was determined that bottles containing breast milk/formula for a particular infant were not labeled with the child's name and date of preparation. Technical assistance was provided at the time of the inspection, and as discussed, please correct this rule noncompliance. A written response for this rule noncompliance is not required at this time.

Domain: 08 Staff Files

Rule: 5101:2-12-10 Health Training Requirements

<u>Code</u>: The program is required to have all child care staff members complete training in child abuse and neglect recognition and prevention within sixty days of hire. Staff must complete training in first aid and CPR within the first ninety days of hire.

<u>Finding</u>: In review of the staff records, it was determined that at least one child care staff member had not completed required health and safety training as noted in number(s) 2, 3, 4, and 6 below:

1. Child abuse and neglect recognition and prevention training was not completed within sixty days of hire.

- 2. First aid training was not completed within ninety days of hire.
- 3. Cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR) training was not completed within ninety days of hire.
- 4. The child abuse and neglect recognition and prevention training was expired.
- 5. The first aid training was expired.
- 6. The CPR training was expired.



Refer to the Employee Record Chart for the name(s) of the child care staff member(s) who must complete the required health and safety training(s). Submit the program's corrective action plan to the Department to verify compliance with the requirements of this rule.

<u>Rule</u>: 5101:2-12-08 Child Care Staff Member Educational Requirements <u>Code</u>: The program staff is required to have educational verification on file at the program or in the Ohio Professional Registry.

<u>Finding</u>: In review of the staff records, it was determined that verification of a high school education was not on file nor verified in the Ohio Professional Registry for Child Care Staff Member(s) listed on the Employee Record Chart, as required. Submit the program's corrective action plan, which includes a copy of the verification of a high school education, to the Department to verify compliance with the requirements of this rule.

Domain: 08 Staff Files

<u>Rule</u>: 5101:2-12-08 Medical Statement <u>Code</u>: The program staff medicals are required to be completed and on file at the program.

<u>Finding</u>: In review of the staff records, it was determined a completed medical examination statement for the employee(s) listed on the Employee Record Chart was not on file, as required by this rule. Submit the program's corrective action plan, which includes a copy of the completed employee medical statement, to verify compliance with the requirements of this rule.

Rule: 5101:2-12-07 Administrator Responsibilities/Requirements



<u>Code</u>: The program administrator is required to maintain current employee records in the Ohio Professional Registry.

<u>Finding</u>: During the inspection, it was determined employment records in the Ohio Professional Registry (OPR) were not created or maintained as noted in number(s) 5 and 7 below:

1. At least one administrator, employee or child care staff member (including substitutes) had not created a profile.

2. At least one administrator, employee or child care staff member had not created an employment record for the program on or before their first day of employment.

3. At least one administrator, employee or child care staff member had not updated changes to positions or roles within five calendar days of the change.

4. The administrator had not assigned at least one employee or child care staff member to the program's organization dashboard.

5. At least one individual's schedule was not current.

6. At least one individual's position or role did not include an applicable group assignment.

7. At least one individual's employment had not been end dated.

8. Other: []

Submit the program's corrective action plan to the Department to verify compliance with the requirements of this rule.

Rule: 5101:2-12-08 Medical Statement

<u>Code</u>: The program staff medicals are required to include all information.

<u>Finding</u>: In review of the staff records, it was determined that the medical statements for those employees listed on the Employee Record Chart did not include the required information listed below in number 3b and 5.

1. Date of examination;

2. Signature, business address, and telephone number of the licensed physician, physician assistant, advanced practice nurse, certified midwife, or certified nurse practitioner who completed the examination;

- 3. A statement that verifies that the employee is:
- a. Physically fit for employment in a program caring for children;
- b. Immunized against Tetanus, Diphtheria, Pertussis (Tdap);
- c. Immunized against Measles, Mumps, and Rubella (MMR);
- 4. Tuberculosis (TB) screening/test

a. Documentation of the screening process to determine if the employee resided in a country identified by the World Health Organization as having a high burden of TB and arrived in the United States within the five years preceding the date of application for employment;

b. Results of a TB test for employees meeting both criteria in 4a;



c. Results of additional testing for employees with a positive TB test;

d. Written statement, signed by a representative of the TB control unit, that the employee's TB is no longer infectious or the individual is receiving a TB treatment regimen for employees with a positive TB test.
5. The current version of the JFS 01296, Staff Medical, was not completed.

Submit the program's corrective action plan, which includes a copy of the completed employee medical statement, or TB results/documentation, to the Department to verify compliance with the requirements of this rule.

<u>Rule</u>: 5101:2-12-15 Child Medical and Enrollment Records <u>Code</u>: The program is required to use the updated JFS 01234 "Child Enrollment and Health Information For Child Care" .

<u>Finding</u>: In review of 25% of the children's records, it was determined that information had not been secured from the parent/guardian on the JFS 01234 "Child Enrollment and Health Information For Child Care", as required, for the items in number(s) 2, 4, 5, 6, 7, 10, and 13 below.

- 1. No enrollment form was completed for at least one child
- 2. The current JFS 01234 was not completed for at least one child
- 3. Complete child information
- 4. Complete parent information
- 5. Complete emergency contact information
- 6. Complete physician information
- 7. Information regarding the parent list
- 8. Health information
- 9. Additional information for all boxes checked "yes"
- 10. Emergency transportation information
- 11. Parent/guardian's signature
- 12. Diapering Statement
- 13. Acknowledgement of Policies and Procedures
- 14. Enrollment form for at least one child was not updated by either the parent or the administrator
- 15. Enrollment form for at least one child was not signed by the administrator

<u>Rule</u>: 5101:2-12-15 Medical/Physical Care Plans <u>Code</u>: The program is required to maintain a complete JFS 01236 "Child Medical/Physical Care Plan for Child Care" on file for any child having a health condition.

<u>Finding</u>: In review of the children's records, it was determined that the JFS 01236 "Child Medical/Physical Care Plan for Child Care" did not meet the requirements of the rule as noted in number(s) 1 and 3 below:

1. The JFS 01236 had not been updated as needed and at least annually.

- 2. A separate JFS 01236 had not been used for each condition.
- 3. The program used an old version of the JFS 01236.

Submit the program's corrective action plan to the Department to verify compliance with the requirements of this rule.

Corrective Action Plan Due: 02/11/2023

Domain: 10 Written Policies & Procedures

Rule: 5101:2-12-16 Written Disaster Plan

<u>Code</u>: The program is required to have a written disaster plan.

<u>Finding</u>: During the inspection, it was determined the program's written disaster plan did not meet the requirement or was missing the information in number(s) 12 and 13 below:

Procedures:

- 1. The written disaster plan had not been completed
- 2. The plan was not provided to all child care staff and employees
- 3. The plan was not used to respond to an emergency or disaster situation

4. Weather emergencies and natural disasters which include severe thunderstorms, tornadoes, flash flooding, major snowfall, blizzards, ice storms or earthquakes
