## **Complaint Allegations**

#### **Domain:07 Diapering & Infant Care**

Rule: 5101:2-12-20 Cribs

Code: The program staff is required to remove any items listed in rule that are a potential suffocation risk from cribs.

Allegation: It was alleged determined that a child had been placed in a crib with an object that created a potential strangulation or suffocation risk when a child was placed in the crib with a jacket on and hair bow aroung their neck.

Determination: Substantiated

Findings: During the inspection, it was determined that a child had been placed in a crib with an object that created a potential strangulation or suffocation risk, as indicated in number(s) 12 and 13 below:

- 1. Bib
- 2. Pacifier clip/ribbon
- 3. Teething jewelry
- 4. Blanket for infant under twelve months old
- 5. Pillow
- 6. Boppie
- 7. Bumper pad
- 8. Clothing stored in the crib
- 9. Diaper bag
- 10. Object or toy strung over the crib in which a child can pull himself up
- 11. Stuffed animal that is large/soft enough to conform to the shape of the child's face
- 12. Other- Head band
- 13. Other-Jacket

The rule prohibits any item which obstructs child-care staff's visibility or poses a risk of strangulation or suffocation from being placed on or in a crib. Remove the item(s) immediately. Provide staff training. Submit the program's corrective action plan, which includes a statement that training was provided, to the Department to verify compliance with the requirements of this rule.

### Domain:07 Diapering & Infant Care

Rule: 5101:2-12-23 Infant Daily Care

Code: The program staff is required to hold infants or have the infant sitting up while feeding. The program staff may not place an infant in a crib with a bottle.

Allegation: It was alleged that a child was drinking from a sippy cup while in the crib.

Determination: Substantiated



Findings: During the inspection, it was determined that the program did not meet the requirements for bottle feeding as noted in number 2 below:

- 1. A bottle was propped for an infant feeding.
- 2. An infant was placed in a crib with a sippy cup.
- 3. An infant was not held or fed sitting up for bottle feedings.

Provide staff training. Submit the program's corrective action plan, which includes a statement that training was provided, to the Department to verify compliance with the requirements of this rule.
