Domain:02 Safe & Sanitary Environment

Rule: 5101:2-12-12 Safe Environment

Code: The program is required to provide an environment that protects the children in care from any items and conditions that may threaten their health, safety, and well-being.

Findings: Children in care shall be protected from any items and conditions which threaten their health, safety, and well-being. During the inspection, it was determined that children were not protected from the following item or condition which may threaten their health, safety, or well-being as noted in number 12 below:

- 1. Open pull cords that are not closed loop.
- 2. Telephone cords.
- 3. Electrical/extension cords attached to an object that would not likely result in a severe injury if pulled.
- 4. Stacked chairs.
- 5. Employee(s) purse(s).
- 6. Diaper bags.
- 7. Television not securely anchored.
- 8. Small or lightweight pieces of shelving units are not securely anchored to the wall.
- 9. Smoke detector needing batteries replaced.
- 10. Staff member stepped over a barrier/gate while holding a child.
- 11. Emergency exits were blocked by the following classroom furniture: [].
- 12. Other: there was a large hole in the drywall in the PreK room exposing a water valve which was accessible to the children.

Rule: 5101:2-12-17 Daily Schedule

Code: The program is required to have a balance of activities daily.

Findings: During the inspection, it was determined that the PreK classroom did not have a well-balanced program. Children were made to sit on the floor with nothing to do while waiting for circle time for an extended period of time resulting in many children getting up and running around the classroom. A well-balanced program of activities suitable to the developmental levels and abilities of each child in care shall be implemented on a daily basis. Technical assistance was provided at the time of the inspection, and as discussed, please correct this rule noncompliance. A written response for this rule noncompliance is not required at this time.
