Complaint Allegations

Code: The program is required to maintain the appropriate staff to child ratio for each group served.

Allegation: It was alleged that the program does not maintain required ratios.

Determination: Substantiated

Findings: During the investigation it was determined that proper ratios are not being maintained when groups of preschool aged children are on the playground together when the situation in number 2 below occurred:

- 1. A child care staff member stepped out of the room.
- 2. A child care staff member had not arrived at work on time.
- 3. Children were present who were not scheduled to be there.
- 4. A child care staff member was unable to work.
- 5. A child was injured in that group.
- 6. A child arrived in the group before a second staff member was scheduled to arrive with the group.
- 7. Two groups were combined, and the program did not follow the ratio for the youngest child in the group.
- 8. A child was transitioning to the next older age group, and the program did not follow the ratio for the youngest child in the group.
- 9. Ratio was doubled for more than two hours while children were napping.
- 10. Ratio was doubled while children were napping for a group that included at least one infant.
- 11. Ratio was doubled while children were napping and there were not enough staff members in the building to meet staff/child ratio.
- 12. Ratio was doubled in the school age group to allow access to the program, however, the program does not serve only school age children.
- 13. Both child care staff members did not have a working communication device when one staff member left the group to allow access to the school age only program.
- 14. The child care staff member did not return to the group after allowing access to the school age only program.

Additional child care staff members must be hired or current child care staff members must be rescheduled to maintain compliance. Provide staff training. Allegation: It was alleged that the owner yelled at teachers, frightening children.

Determination: Substantiated

Findings: During the inspection, it was determined the administrator, child care staff, and/or employees of the program did not protect or remove children from a situation and/or person determined to be unsafe or inappropriate as noted in number 1 below:

- 1. Verbal argument involving adults.
- 2. Staff member(s) allowed child(ren) to do something unsafe.
- 3. Staff member(s) did something unsafe.
- 4. Children were exposed to inappropriate [language; conversation; behavior; video; music; DVD] by a [staff member/child/parent].
- 5. Other [].

While the program did not protect the child(ren) from an unsafe or inappropriate situation and/or person, it was determined the situation would not or did not result in a serious incident or injury to a child.
