Allegation: Allegedly classroom environments are not safe.

Determination: Substantiated

Findings: During the inspection, a potentially hazardous item or toxic substance was used in Toddler classroom where children had access to it, as noted in number 14 below.

1. Bleach.
 2. Cleaning agent.
 3. Fish tank chemicals.
 4. Gasoline.
 5. Pesticide.
 6. Poison, including insect/rodent poison.
 7. Flammable substance.
 8. Windshield washer fluid.
 9. Aerosol cans.
 10. A lawn mower.
 11. A weed trimmer.
 12. Hedge trimmers.
 13. A snow blower.
 14. Other potentially hazardous substance, equipment or machinery: a rodent sticky trap was located in the room under cabinet - within reach of toddlers. A toddler was stuck to the trap.
- Provide staff training. Submit the program's corrective action plan, which includes a statement that the potentially hazardous substance or item is no longer accessible to children and/or children will not be outside when machinery is in use and a statement that training was provided, to the Department to verify compliance with the requirements of this rule.
