Rule: 5180:2-12-13 Handwashing Requirements

Code: The program is required to have all staff and children wash their hands as outlined in rule.

Allegation: Staff are not handwashing in between diaper changes and children's hands are not washed after diaper changes.

Determination: Substantiated

Findings: During the inspection, it was determined that handwashing requirements were not followed as listed in number(s) 4 below, as required in rule.

- 1. At least one staff/child did not wash their hands upon arrival for the day.
- 2. At least one staff/child did not wash their hands prior to departure.
- 3. At least one staff did not wash their hands upon entry into a classroom.
- 4. At least one staff and child did not wash their hands after toileting or assisting a child with toileting.
- 5. At least one staff/child did not wash their hands after each diaper change or pull-up change.
- 6. At least one staff did not wash their hands after contact with bodily fluids or cleaning up spills or objects contaminated with bodily fluids.
- 7. At least one child did not wash their hands after contact with bodily fluids.
- 8. At least one child did not wash their hands after returning inside after outdoor play.
- 9. At least one staff did not wash their hands after cleaning or sanitizing or using any chemical products.
- 10. At least one staff/child did not wash their hands after handling pets, pet cages or other pet objects that have come in contact with the pet.
- 11. At least one staff did not wash their hands before eating, serving or preparing food or bottles or feeding a child.
- 12. At least one child did not wash their hands before eating or assisting with food preparation.
- 13. At least one staff did not wash their hands before and after completing a medical procedure or administering medication.
- 14. At least one child did not wash their hands after water activities.
- 15. At least one staff/child did not wash their hands when visibly soiled (must use soap and water).

Rule: 5180:2-12-23 Diapering and Toilet Training

Code: The program is required to launder diapers according to manufacturer's guidelines.

Allegation: A trashcan with no lid, full of dirty diapers was accessible to children.

Determination: Substantiated



Findings: During the inspection, it was determined that the program was not storing or laundering soiled diapers or clothing according to the rule, in that the program did not meet the condition indicated in number(s) 6 below.

- 1. Store for no longer than one day
- 2. Store in an individual covered container or plastic bag away from children's belongings
- 3. Kept out of reach of children
- 4. Store soiled diapers and diapering washcloths laundered by the center in a covered container with sanitizing solution
- 5. Hold soiled diapers to be commercially laundered for no more than seven days
- 6. Store soiled disposable diapers in a plastic-lined covered container not easily accessible to children
- 7. Discard disposable diapers daily or more frequently as needed to eliminate odor
- 8. Launder diapers according to manufacturer's guidelines
