<ol> <li>Infants could not safely and comfortably sit, crawl, toddle, or walk and play according to the infant's stage of development.</li> <li>Infants were not removed from the crib, swing, infant seat, exercise seat or other equipment throughout the day for individual attention.</li> </ol>		
<ol> <li>Each non-crawling infant was not provided the opportunity for tummy time, outside of their crib, each day.</li> <li>Other- infants were not provided with time to comfortably sit, crawl, walk and play outside of sitting in a highchair, bouncer, or crib for the majority of the morning routine.</li> </ol>		
Provide staff training. Submit the program's corrective action plan, which includes a statement that training was provided, to the Department to verify compliance with the requirements of this rule.
