Rule: 5101:2-12-19 Supervision

Code: The program staff is required to supervise children in their assigned group by sight and hearing. Supervision includes being near enough to respond and reach children immediately and protecting them from harm.

Allegation: Complainant alleged that a child was left unsupervised in a classroom.

Determination: Substantiated

Findings: During the inspection, it was determined that children were left unattended while inside the program as noted in number 1 below:

1. A child was left unattended in a classroom.
2. Child(ren) were left unattended more than once.
3. Child(ren) left the group and were unattended.
4. Child care staff were using a baby monitor to supervise children.
5. Child care staff were using a walkie talkie to supervise children.
6. Child care staff were using mirrors to view children in another room.
7. Child care staff were using a video camera instead of physically being present in the room.

Children must be supervised and within sight and hearing of a child care staff member at all times. Provide staff training. Submit the program's corrective action plan, which includes a statement that training was provided, to the Department to verify compliance with the requirements of this rule. This allegation is substantiated.

Code: The program is required to space cribs two feet apart when in use.

Allegation: Complainant alleged that the cribs are not spaced properly.

Determination: Substantiated

Findings: During the inspection, it was determined and observed that cribs were not two feet apart when in use, as required by this rule. Technical assistance was provided at the time of the inspection, and as discussed, please correct this rule noncompliance. A written response for this rule noncompliance is required at this time. This allegation is substantiated.
