### Complaint Allegations

#### Domain:01 Ratio & Supervision

Rule: 5180:2-12-18 Ratio

Code: The program is required to maintain the appropriate staff to child ratio for each group served.

Allegation: It was alleged that the program was not maintaining staff/child ratio as required by rule.

Determination: Substantiated

Findings: The allegation is substantiated in that, during the inspection, it was determined that staff/child ratios were not consistently met for combined groups in the morning when the situation in number(s) 2, 6, 15 below occurred:

1. A child care staff member stepped out of the room.
2. A child care staff member had not arrived at work on time.
3. Children were present who were not scheduled to be there.
4. A child care staff member was unable to work.
5. A child was injured in that group.
6. A child arrived in the group before a second staff member was scheduled to arrive with the group.
7. Two groups were combined, and the program did not follow the ratio for the youngest child in the group.
8. A child was transitioning to the next older age group, and the program did not follow the ratio for the youngest child in the group.
9. Ratio was doubled for more than two hours while children were napping.
10. Ratio was doubled while children were napping for a group that included at least one infant.
11. Ratio was doubled while children were napping and there were not enough staff members in the building to meet staff/child ratio.
12. Ratio was doubled in the school age group to allow access to the program, however, the program does not serve only school age children.
13. Both child care staff members did not have a working communication device when one staff member left the group to allow access to the school age only program.
14. The child care staff member did not return to the group after allowing access to the school age only program.
15. Child care staff were not requesting for the parent to wait until the second teacher arrives.

Additional child care staff members must be hired or current child care staff members must be rescheduled to maintain compliance. Provide staff training. Submit the program's corrective action plan, which includes a statement that training was provided, to the Department to verify compliance with the requirements of this rule.

#### Domain:04 Indoor/Outdoor Space

Rule: 5180:2-12-11 Indoor Space Requirements

Code: The program is required to have only the number of children in attendance that is allowed by the indoor floor space.

Allegation: It was alleged that classroom capacity was exceeded.

Determination: Substantiated

Findings: The allegation is substantiated in that, during the inspection, it was determined that more children were in attendance at one time than program's usable floor space allowed for in preschool 3. Technical assistance was provided at the time of the inspection, and as discussed, please correct this rule noncompliance. A written response for this rule noncompliance is required at this time.
