Allegation: Staff do not wash their hands as required.

Determination: Substantiated

Findings: During the inspection, it was determined that at least one staff member with the Infant A group did not wash his or her hands at the time listed in number 7 below, as required in rule.

- 1. Upon arrival for the day.
- 2. Prior to departure.
- 3. Upon entry into a classroom.
- 4. After toileting or assisting a child with toileting.
- 5. After each diaper change or pull-up change.
- 6. After contact with bodily fluids or cleaning up spills or objects contaminated with bodily fluids.
- 7. After cleaning or sanitizing or using any chemical products.
- 8. After handling pets, pet cages or other pet objects that have come in contact with the pet.
- 9. Before eating, serving or preparing food or bottles or feeding a child.
- 10. Before and after completing a medical procedure or administering medication.
- 11. When visibly soiled (must use soap and water).
- 12. Other [].

Code: The program is required to follow the cleaning schedule for equipment.

Allegation: There have been illnesses going around the center due to the center staff not keeping the center and the equipment clean and children are sharing sippy cups.

Determination: Substantiated

Findings: The allegation that illnesses are going around the center because the center is not clean and children are sharing sippy cups was denied. However, during the inspection, it was determined that cots were not cleaned, as required. Cots need to be cleaned with soap and water and sanitized prior to reassignment, when used by a sick child, when soiled, and at least every three months. Please correct this rule noncompliance. A written response for this rule noncompliance is required at this time.

Code: The program is required to launder diapers according to manufacturer's guidelines.

Findings: During the inspection, it was determined that the program was not storing or laundering soiled diapers or clothing according to the rule, in that the program did not meet the condition indicated in number 6 below.

- 1. Store for no longer than one day
- 2. Store in an individual covered container or plastic bag away from children's belongings
- 3. Kept out of reach of children
- 4. Store soiled diapers and diapering washcloths laundered by the center in a covered container with sanitizing solution
- 5. Hold soiled diapers to be commercially laundered for no more than seven days
- 6. Store soiled disposable diapers in a plastic-lined covered container not easily accessible to children
- 7. Discard disposable diapers daily or more frequently as needed to eliminate odor
- 8. Launder diapers according to manufacturer's guidelines
