Domain: 09 Children's Files

Rule: 5101:2-12-15 Medical/Physical Care Plans

<u>Code</u>: The program is required to have a completed JFS 01236 "Child Medical/Physical Care Plan for Child Care" on file at the program for any child having a health condition and must implement and/or follow instructions on the plan. The program is required to have staff trained to perform the procedures on the JFS 01236 "Child Medical/Physical Care Plan for Child Care" present at the program when the child requiring the procedure is onsite. Only staff who have been trained shall be permitted to perform the procedures listed on the JFS 01236.

<u>Finding</u>: In review of the children's records, it was determined the program did not meet the requirements for caring for at least one child, indicated on the Children Records Review, with a condition that requires a JFS 01236 ""Child Medical/Physical Care Plan"" as noted in numbers 11, 12, 14, 28, 30 and 39 below:

1. No plan was on file. (Page 1)



- 2. Child's name was missing.
- 3. Name of the condition was missing.
- 4. Indication if medication or medical food is required was missing.
- 5. Signs, symptoms or situations that require staff to take action were missing.
- 6. Activities, foods, environmental conditions to avoid were missing.
- 7. Training instructions for procedures for staff to follow were missing or incomplete.

- 8. Child's name was missing or not attached.
- 9. Child's date of birth was missing or not attached.
- 10. Child's weight was missing or not attached.
- 11. Name of the medication/medical food was missing or not attached (name of medication was listed as lbuprofen, however medication was Children's Ibuprofen).
- 12. Dosage of medication/medical food to be administered was missing or not attached.
- 13. Time for medication/medical food to be administered was missing or not attached.
- 14. Expiration date for medication/medical food was missing or not attached.
- 15. Symptoms that require staff to administer medication/medical food were missing or not attached.
- 16. Specific instructions to administer the medication/medical food were missing or not attached.
- 17. Actions to be taken if the symptoms do not subside were missing or not attached.
- 18. Physician's signature was missing or not attached.
- 19. The date of the physician's signature was missing or not attached.

20. Child's name was missing.

- 21. Instructions regarding emergency evacuation, if applicable, were missing.
- 22. Signature of parent granting permission to implement the plan and verifying training was missing.
- 23. Date of parent signature was missing.
- 24. Certified Professional Trainer information was missing.
- 25. Signature of certified professional who trained the program staff was missing, if parent was not the trainer.
- 26. Date of trainer signature was missing.
- 27. Printed name(s) of child care staff member(s) who have received instructions for care and/or have been trained to perform the procedure were missing.
- 28. Signature(s) of child care staff member(s) who have received instructions for care and/or have been trained to perform the procedure were missing.
- 29. Date of staff signature was missing.
- 30. Administrator/Provider signature was missing
- 31. Date of administrator/Provider was missing.

- 32. Child's name was missing.
- 33. Name of medication or medical food was missing.
- 34. Date the medication/medical food was administered was missing.
- 35. Time medication/medical food was administered was missing.
- 36. Dosage of medication/medical food that was administered was missing.
- 37. Signature of person administering medication/medical food was missing.
- 38. The plan was not followed or implemented.
- 39. The plan was not able to be implemented due to conflicting information in that the instructions indicated the use of a spacer mask with the inhaler, however the spacer/mask was not available at the program.
- 40. None of the child care staff members trained in the procedures on the JFS 01236 were onsite when a child requiring the plan was present.



41. Child care staff members trained in the procedures on the JFS 01236 were not scheduled to be present the entire the time the child requiring the plan was onsite.

42. None of the child care staff members trained in the procedures on the JFS 01236 accompanied the child requiring the plan during a trip.

43. A child care staff member who had not been trained in the procedures on the JFS 01236 performed the procedure.

Low Risk Non-Compliances

Domain: 02 Safe & Sanitary Environment

Rule: 5101:2-12-13 Sanitary Equipment and Environment

<u>Code</u>: The program is required to provide equipment and materials that are easy to clean.

<u>Finding</u>: During the inspection, it was determined that at least one piece of equipment, furnishings, or material at the program was not constructed of materials to facilitate cleaning as noted in number 1 below:

1. The material was worn/torn (on the rainbow and butterfly soft climbers in the Pooh's classroom).

2. The material was not washable.

3. The material was porous.

4. The surface was cracked.

5. The surface was repaired, but in a manner that still did not facilitate cleaning.

6. Other [].

Equipment, furnishings, and furniture shall be constructed of materials to facilitate cleaning. Submit the program's corrective action plan, which includes a statement that the equipment has been removed from the classroom, to the Department to verify compliance with the requirements of this rule.

Rule: 5101:2-12-12 Safe Environment

<u>Code</u>: The program is required to provide an environment that protects the children in care from any items and conditions that may threaten their health, safety, and well-being.

<u>Finding</u>: During the inspection, it was determined that children were not protected from item(s) or condition(s) which may threaten their health, safety, or well-being as noted in number 4 below:

1. Surge protectors/outlets did not have childproof receptacle covers.

2. Open pull cords that are not closed loop.

3. Toys or other items small enough to be swallowed were present in the space where infants and/or toddlers were in care.

4. Electrical/extension cords attached to an object that would not likely result in a severe injury if pulled (fish tank cords in the Beach Bears classroom).

5. Stacked chairs.

6. Employee(s) purse(s).

7. Diaper bags.

- 8. Television not securely anchored.
- 9. Small or lightweight pieces of shelving units are not securely anchored to the wall.
- 10. Smoke detector needing batteries replaced.
- 11. An area rug did not have a nonskid backing.
- 12. An area rug presented a tripping hazard.
- 13. A floor surface that was unsafe in that [].
- 14. No platform was provided for the sink or toilet in the [] classroom.
- 15. The platform provided for the sink or toilet in the [] classroom was not sturdy.
- 16. The platform provided for the sink or toilet in the [] classroom posed a safety hazard in that [].

17. Telephone cords.

18. Staff member stepped over a barrier/gate while holding a child.

- 19. Emergency exits were blocked by the following classroom furniture: [].
- 20. A mercury thermometer was being used to take a child's temperature.
- 21. Methods of ventilation used did not provide protection from rodents, insects, or other hazards.

22. Other [].

Domain: 02 Safe & Sanitary Environment

Rule: 5101:2-12-12 Safe Environment

<u>Code</u>: The program is required to store chemicals and cleaning and sanitizing supplies in a place that is inaccessible to children. Cleaning agents, aerosol cans and chemical substances must be stored in their original



container or clearly labeled. School-age children may use cleaning supplies and equipment with adult supervision.

<u>Finding</u>: During the inspection, a potentially hazardous substance, which was determined to not present a serious risk to a child, was not used or stored properly as noted in number 9 below:

- 1. Cosmetics were accessible to children in the [] area.
- 2. Disinfecting wipes were accessible to children in the [] area.
- 3. Fish food was accessible to children in the [] area.
- 4. Hand lotion was accessible to children in the [] area.
- 5. Hand sanitizer (for children under 24 months) was accessible to children in the [] area.
- 6. Laundry detergent was accessible to children in the [] area.
- 7. Powder dish washing soap was accessible to children in the [] area.
- 8. Paint cans were accessible to children in the [] area.

9. White out was accessible to children in the ABC Bears (in an open wire organizer drawer) and the Paddington (on the teacher's table) classrooms.

- 10. Potting Soil was accessible to children in the [] area.
- 11. Other potentially hazardous substance [] was accessible to children in the [] area.
- 12. Cleaning/sanitizing supplies had not been clearly labeled.
- 13. School-age children were using cleaning supplies, agents and/or equipment without adult supervision.
- 14. A spray aerosol was used in the [] group while children were in attendance.
- 15. Other: [].

Provide staff training. Submit the program's corrective action plan to the Department to verify compliance with the requirements of this rule.

Corrective Action Plan Due: 08/12/2023

Domain: 05 Health & Safety

<u>Rule</u>: 5101:2-12-16 First Aid/Standard Precautions <u>Code</u>: The program is required to have a first aid kit onsite.

<u>Finding</u>: During the inspection, it was determined first aid kit(s) at the program had missing, or expired, items that are required by appendix A of this rule to be contained in a first aid kit, as noted in number 9 below:

- 1. The program did not have a first aid kit [onsite, on the vehicle, on a field trip].
- 2. One roll of hypoallergenic first-aid tape.
- 3. Individually wrapped sterile gauze squares in assorted sizes.
- 4. Sterile adhesive bandages in assorted sizes.
- 5. Tweezers.
- 6. Gauze rolled bandage.
- 7. Triangular bandage.
- 8. Rounded end scissors.



9. Tooth preservation system or fresh chilled liquid milk in which to transport a lost permanent tooth, including a written reference indicating location of the refrigerator/freezer where milk is stored if a tooth preservation system is not part of the first aid kit (for programs serving school age children only). (in the Kindergarten Field Trip First Aid Kit)

10. A working digital thermometer.

11. Disposable non-latex gloves.

12. A working flashlight.

13. An instant cold pack that has not been activated or ice, including a written reference indicating location of the refrigerator/freezer where the ice is stored if an instant cold pack is not part of the first aid kit.

14. Sealable leak-proof plastic bags in assorted sizes or double bagged plastic bags that can be securely tied for materials soiled with blood or bodily fluids.

15. Pocket mask or face shield, appropriate for all ages of children in care, for cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR) administration.

16. Soap or waterless sanitizer (field trip or transporting away from the program only).

17. Bottled water (field trip or transporting away from the program only).

Technical assistance was provided at the time of the inspection, and as discussed, please correct this rule noncompliance. A written response for this rule noncompliance is not required at this time.

Domain: 08 Staff Files

Rule: 5101:2-12-10 Health Training Requirements

<u>Code</u>: The program is required to have all child care staff members complete training in child abuse and neglect recognition and prevention within sixty days of hire. Staff must complete training in first aid and CPR within the first ninety days of hire.

<u>Finding</u>: In review of the staff records, it was determined that at least one child care staff member had not completed required health and safety training as noted in number 4 below:

- 1. Child abuse and neglect recognition and prevention training was not completed within sixty days of hire.
- 2. First aid training was not completed within ninety days of hire.
- 3. Cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR) training was not completed within ninety days of hire.
- 4. The child abuse and neglect recognition and prevention training was expired.
- 5. The first aid training was expired.
- 6. The CPR training was expired.

Refer to the Employee Record Chart for the name(s) of the child care staff member(s) who must complete the required health and safety training(s). Submit the program's corrective action plan to the Department to verify compliance with the requirements of this rule.

Rule: 5101:2-12-08 Medical Statement

<u>Code</u>: The program staff's medical statements are required to be completed and on file at the program.

<u>Finding</u>: In review of the staff records, it was determined that the medical statements for the employees listed on the Employee Record Chart did not meet the requirements as listed in number 2 below.

1. A medical statement was not on file for at least one employee;

2. The medical statement(s) on file did not have a date of examination within 12 months of the employee's first day of employment;

3. Date of examination was missing;

4. Signature, business address, or telephone number of the licensed physician, physician assistant, advanced practice nurse, certified midwife, or certified nurse practitioner who completed the examination was missing;

5. A statement was missing that verifies the employee is:

a. Physically fit for employment in a program caring for children;

b. Immunized against Tetanus, Diphtheria, Pertussis (Tdap);

c. Immunized against Measles, Mumps, and Rubella (MMR);

6. Tuberculosis (TB) screening/test information was missing:

a. Documentation of the screening process to determine if the employee resided in a country identified by the world health organization as having a high burden of TB and arrived in the United States within the five years preceding the date of application for employment.

b. Results of a TB test for employees meeting both criteria in 6a.

c. Results of additional testing for employees with a positive TB test.

d. Written statement, signed by a representative of the TB control unit, that the employee's TB is no longer infectious or the individual is receiving a TB treatment regimen for employees with a positive TB test.

Submit the program's corrective action plan, which includes a copy of the completed employee medical statement, or TB results/documentation, to the Department to verify compliance with the requirements of this rule.

Domain: 09 Children's Files

Rule: 5101:2-12-25 Medication Administration

<u>Code</u>: The program is required to use the appropriate form and retain current documentation to administer medications, medical foods and topical products. The program is also required to obtain separate documentation for each medication/product and child.



<u>Finding</u>: During the inspection, it was determined the program did not meet the requirements for the JFS 01217 "Request for Administration of Medication for Child Care" as noted in number 6 below:

- 1. The program used an old version of the JFS 01217.
- 2. The signature date on the JFS 01217 exceeded more than 12 months.
- 3. The time period to administer the medication or medical food on the JFS 01217 was exceeded.
- 4. The JFS 01217 included more than one medication or medical food.
- 5. The JFS 01217 included more than one child's name.
- 6. The prescription label was not current.

Submit the program's corrective action plan to the Department to verify compliance with the requirements of this rule.

Rule: 5101:2-12-25 Medication Administration

<u>Code</u>: The program is required to removed all medication, medical foods and topical products that are no longer being administered or have expired.

<u>Finding</u>: During the inspection, it was determined that medication, medical foods and/or topical products had not been removed from the program and were no longer needed or had expired. Technical assistance was provided at the time of the inspection, and as discussed, please correct this rule noncompliance. A written response for this rule noncompliance is not required at this time.

Rule: 5101:2-12-15 Medical/Physical Care Plans

<u>Code</u>: The program is required to maintain a complete JFS 01236 "Child Medical/Physical Care Plan for Child Care" on file for any child having a health condition.

<u>Finding</u>: In review of the children's records, it was determined that the JFS 01236 "Child Medical/Physical Care Plan for Child Care" did not meet the requirements of the rule as noted in number 1 below:

1. The JFS 01236 had not been updated as needed and at least annually.

2. A separate JFS 01236 had not been used for each condition.



3. The program used an old version of the JFS 01236.

Submit the program's corrective action plan to the Department to verify compliance with the requirements of this rule.
