Complaint Allegations

Domain:01 Ratio & Supervision

Rule: 5101:2-12-19 Supervision

Code: The program staff is required to supervise children in their assigned group by sight and hearing. Supervision includes being near enough to respond and reach children immediately including responding to the child's basic needs and protecting them from harm.

Allegation: Complainant alleges that child care staff members did not properly supervise children, which resulted in a child being injured.

Determination: Substantiated

Findings: During the inspection, it was determined that children were not being properly supervised as noted in number 4 below:

- 1. Child(ren) were not within both sight and hearing of a child care staff member during indoor play.
- 2. Child(ren) were not within both sight and hearing of a child care staff member during outdoor play.
- 3. Child(ren) were not within both sight and hearing of a child care staff member more than once.
- 4. Staff were not physically present in the space and near enough to respond and reach the child(ren) immediately (They all were sitting at a table on one side of the playground, so no adults were near the climber on the playground or walking around the playground. There were behavior issues happening and none of them noticed, so they were instructed by the Specialist from the Department to circulate the playground and also address the behaviors that were happening).
- 5. Other: [].

Children must be supervised according to rule and within both sight and hearing of a child care staff member at all times. Provide staff training. Submit the program's corrective action plan, which includes a statement that training was provided, to the Department to verify compliance with the requirements of this rule.

Domain:01 Ratio & Supervision

Rule: 5101:2-12-18 Ratio

Code: The program staff used in ratio are to refrain from other duties that would not allow them to provide appropriate care and supervision of the children in their group.

Allegation: Complainant alleges that Child care staff members were engaged in other duties/activities and were unable to provide appropriate care and supervision to the children.

Determination: Substantiated

Findings: During the inspection, it was determined that Child Care Staff Members who were used in the staff/child ratio were engaged in other duties such as noted in numbers 3 & 6 below and, therefore, were unable to provide appropriate care and supervision to the children:

1. Cooking;

- 2. Cleaning that interferes with supervision;
- 3. Paperwork;
- 4. Talking on the phone for extended time;
- 5. Engaging in a conversation with a parent for an extended period of time;
- 6. Other: using cell phones on a regular basis.

Provide staff training. Submit the program's corrective action plan, which includes a statement that training was provided, to the Department to verify compliance with the requirements of this rule.
