Complaint Allegations

Rule: 5180:2-12-19 Supervision

Code: The program staff is required to supervise children in their assigned group by sight and hearing. Supervision includes being near enough to respond and reach children immediately including responding to the child's basic needs and protecting them from harm.

Allegation: It was alleged that adequate supervision was not provided at the program.

Determination: Substantiated

Findings: The allegation is substantiated in that, during the inspection, it was determined that children were not being properly supervised as noted in number(s) 3,4 below:

- 1. Child(ren) were not within both sight and hearing of a child care staff member during indoor play.
- 2. Child(ren) were not within both sight and hearing of a child care staff member during outdoor play.
- 3. Child(ren) were not within both sight and hearing of a child care staff member more than once in that the staff member's back was to the classroom during diaper changes and was unable to adequately supervise the group resulting to an injury to a child.
- 4. Staff were not near enough to respond and reach the child(ren) immediately in that the staff member was attending to a child on the diaper changing table and was unable to intervene immediately resulting in an injury to a child.
- 5. Other: [].

Children must be supervised according to rule and within both sight and hearing of a child care staff member at all times. Provide staff training. Submit the program's corrective action plan, which includes a statement that training was provided, to the Department to verify compliance with the requirements of this rule.
