Code: The program staff is required to supervise children in their assigned group by sight and hearing. Supervision includes being near enough to respond and reach children immediately including responding to the child's basic needs and protecting them from harm.

Allegation: Complainant alleged that Child Care Staff Members are inadequately supervising the children resulting in incidents/ injuries.

**Determination:** Substantiated

Findings: During the inspection, it was determined that children were not being properly supervised as noted in numbers 1 & 4 below:

- 1. Child(ren) were not within both sight and hearing of a child care staff member during lunch.
- 2. Child(ren) were not within both sight and hearing of a child care staff member during outdoor play.
- 3. Child(ren) were not within both sight and hearing of a child care staff member more than once.
- 4. Staff were not near enough to respond and reach the child(ren) immediately.
- 5. Other: [ ].

Children must be supervised according to rule and within both sight and hearing of a child care staff member at all times. A thorough investigation was completed. An on-site inspection was conducted that included classroom observations. Administrative and Child Care Staff were interviewed. Video surveillance and center policies were reviewed. Evidence was able to verify that the program was not compliant with the licensing rule referenced in the allegation. Provide staff training. Submit the program's corrective action plan, which includes a statement that training was provided, to the Department to verify compliance with the requirements of this rule.
