Allegation: The complainant alleged that the toddlers were being care for in a space that did not have appropriate equipment and materials available for the children

Determination: Substantiated

Findings: During the inspection, it was determined that equipment, materials and furnishings provided for indoor and outdoor play did not meet the requirement of the rule as noted in number(s) 1,2,3 below.

- 1. Equipment and materials were not varied and adequate to meet the developmental needs of the children.
- 2. Equipment and materials were not provided in a sufficient quantity that each child can be actively involved in an activity.
- 3. Play materials were not readily accessible to the children in the toddler group that was moved to the patio area of the schoolage classroom.
- 4. Play materials were not arranged in an orderly manner so that children have opportunities to select, remove and replace play materials with minimal assistance during the day in the [] classroom.
- 5. Durable, child-sized or safely adapted furniture was not provided for children in the [] classroom.
