Findings: During the inspection, it was determined the program did not protect children from an item or condition which threatened their health, safety, and wellbeing as noted in number(s) 5 below:

- 1. Children were exposed to a lead hazard in or near at least one area or at least one piece of equipment.
- 2. Children were exposed to lead hazards that were introduced into the environment during renovation or remodeling.
- 3. Children were exposed to an unsafe level of lead contained in paint, soil, dust, or other substance.
- 4. Children were exposed to drinking water containing an unsafe level of lead.
- 5. Illegal drugs were on the premises.
