#### Domain:01 Ratio & Supervision

Rule: 5180:2-12-18 Ratio

Code: The program staff used in ratio are to refrain from other duties that would not allow them to provide appropriate care and supervision of the children in their group.

Allegation: complainant alleges teachers are on their phones and not watching the children.

Determination: Substantiated

Findings: During the inspection, it was determined that Child Care Staff Members who were used in the staff/child ratio were engaged in other duties such as noted in numbers 4 and 6 below and, therefore, were unable to provide appropriate care and supervision to the children:

1. Cooking;
2. Cleaning that interferes with supervision;
3. Paperwork;
4. Taking phone calls and talking on the phone while supervising children.
5. Engaging in a conversation with a parent for an extended period of time;
6. Staff engaged in online shopping, scrolling social media, and texting on their phone while supervising children.

Provide staff training. Submit the program's corrective action plan, which includes a statement that training was provided, to the Department to verify compliance with the requirements of this rule.

#### Domain:01 Ratio & Supervision

Rule: 5180:2-12-19 Child Guidance

Code: The program staff shall use developmentally appropriate techniques when managing children's behavior. Corporal punishment is prohibited, as well as any cruel, harsh, unusual or extreme techniques.

Allegation: complainant alleges a staff member was yelling at children and also pulling on their arms.

Determination: Substantiated

Findings: During the inspection, it was determined that a child care staff member used a discipline technique to guide or discipline child(ren) that was not developmentally appropriate, consistent, or occurred at the time of the incident. During interviews staff members reported consistently hearing staff members yelling at children and inappropriate tone being used toward children. Provide staff training. Submit the program's corrective action plan, which includes a statement that training was provided, to the Department to verify compliance with the requirements of this rule.

### Moderate Risk Non-Compliances

#### Domain:01 Ratio & Supervision

Rule: 5180:2-12-19 Child Guidance

Code: The program staff shall use developmentally appropriate techniques when managing children's behavior. Corporal punishment is prohibited, as well as any cruel, harsh, unusual or extreme techniques.

Findings: During the inspection, it was determined that a Child Care Staff Member had used the inappropriate techniques in number(s) 1,2, and 5 below when managing unacceptable behavior in children:

1. Utilize cruel, harsh, unusual, or extreme techniques; staff grabbed child by cheeks and talked sternly in his face, yanked child's head back and got in their face and yanked child's head forward toward table, grabbing children harder than normal, shoving a child.
2. Utilize any form of corporal punishment; hit a child in the face.
3. Delegate children to manage or discipline other children;
4. Use physical restraints on a child;
5. Restrain a child by prone restraint or any means other than holding children for a short period of time; staff held her foot behind a chair so child could not get up, keeping child at the table. Child was upset and struggling.
6. Place children in a locked room or confine children in any enclosed area;
7. Confine children to equipment such as cribs or highchairs;
8. Humiliate, threaten or frighten children;
9. Subject children to profane language or verbal abuse;
10. Make derogatory or sarcastic remarks about children or their families;
11. Punish children for failure to eat or sleep or for toileting accidents;
12. Withhold any food (including snacks and treats), rest or toilet use;
13. Punish an entire group of children due to the unacceptable behavior of one or a few;
14. Isolate and restrict children from all activities for an extended period of time.

Child Care Staff Members and other employees must always use appropriate guidance and management methods with children. Provide staff training. Submit the program's corrective action plan, which includes a statement that training was provided, to the Department to verify compliance with the requirements of this rule.
