Rule: 5101:2-13-12 Safe Environment

Code: The program is required to refrain from using and storing potentially hazardous items, toxic substances, and outdoor machinery around children.

Findings: During the inspection, a potentially hazardous item or toxic substance was used or stored where children present had access to it as noted in number 9 below. The potentially hazardous substance or item that posed a risk to children was determined to be accessible to children in the provider's bedroom, the living room and the dining room.

- 1. Bleach.
- 2. Cleaning agent.
- 3. Fish tank chemicals.
- 4. Gasoline.

Provide staff training. Submit the program's corrective action plan, which includes a statement that the potentially hazardous substance or item is no longer accessible to children and/or children will not be outside when machinery is in use and a statement that training was provided, to the Department to verify compliance with the requirements of this rule.

Corrective Action Plan Due: 05/12/2023

Domain: 02 Safe & Sanitary Environment

Rule: 5101:2-13-12 Safe Environment

Code: The program is required to protect children from any items and conditions which threaten their health,

safety, and well-being.

Findings: Children in care shall be protected from any items and conditions which threaten their health, safety, and well-being. During the inspection, it was determined the program did not protect children from an unsafe item or condition or equipment due to the following numbers 5 and 17 below:

- 1. Pull cord(s) on the window blind(s).
- 2. Extension cord(s); electrical cord(s) attached to an object that could result in a severe injury if pulled.
- 3. Stacked tables.
- 4. Folding tables.
- 5. Matches and/or a lighter.
- 6. Power tool(s).
- 7. Live wires.
- 8. Stove(s) that are either on or able to be turned on by a child.
- 9. Asbestos.
- 10. Traffic.
- 11. A body of water.
- 12. A well.
- 13. Environmental hazard(s) confirmed by local authorities having jurisdiction over the hazard.
- 14. A crockpot used to heat bottles.
- 15. Immediate access to a knife.
- 16. Large or heavy pieces of shelving units are not securely anchored to the wall.
- 17. Other: 2 pairs of large scissors and small batteries

Any hazardous equipment must be removed, replaced, or repaired and any hazardous condition must be corrected and must be made inaccessible to children. Provide staff training. Submit the program's corrective action plan, which includes a statement that the item or condition has been removed and a statement that training was provided, to the Department to verify compliance with the requirements of this rule.

Domain: 07 Diapering & Infant Care

Rule: 5101:2-13-20 Crib and Playpen Requirements

Code: The program staff is required to place infants in a crib or playpen to sleep unless a JFS 01235 "Sleep

Position Waiver Statement for Child Care" is on file.

Findings: During the inspection, it was determined an infant slept in equipment other than their crib or playpen and did not have written permission from a physician on file. Correct the violation and submit the program's corrective action plan to verify compliance with the requirement of the rule. Child observed sleeping in car seat at start of inspection.

Corrective Action Plan Due: 05/12/2023

Low Risk Non-Compliances

Domain: 01 Ratio & Supervision

Rule: 5101:2-13-18 Attendance

Code: The program is required to have a tracking method for children.

Findings: During the inspection, it was determined that the method for tracking the children in the group did not meet the requirements in rule as noted in the number 1 below:

- 1. There was no method in place.
- 2. The method did not include each child's name.
- 3. The method did not include each child's birthdate.
- 4. The tracking method did not remain with the group at all times.
- 5. The tracking method was not updated throughout the day as children entered or left the group.

Submit the program's corrective action plan to verify compliance with the requirements of this rule.

Corrective Action Plan Due: 05/12/2023

Domain: 01 Ratio & Supervision

Rule: 5101:2-13-18 Attendance

Code: The program is required to maintain attendance records.

Findings: During the inspection, it was determined the program did not meet the requirements for keeping an attendance record as listed in numbers 1 below:

- 1. No attendance record was being maintained.
- 2. The attendance record was not being consistently completed.
- 3. The original attendance documentation was not kept at the program for a period of one year.

Submit the program's corrective action plan, which includes a statement that training was provided, to the Department to verify compliance with the requirements of this rule.

Corrective Action Plan Due: 05/12/2023

Domain: 02 Safe & Sanitary Environment

Rule: 5101:2-13-12 Safe Environment

Code: The program is required to protect children in care from items and conditions that threaten their health, safety, and well being.

Findings: Children in care shall be protected from any items and conditions which threaten their health, safety, and well being. During the inspection, it was determined that children were not protected from the following item(s) or condition(s) which may threaten their health, safety, or well being as noted in the following number 3 and 9 below:

- 1. Telephone cords;
- 2. Stacked chairs;
- Employee(s) purse(s);
- 4. Diaper bags;
- 5. Television not securely anchored;
- 6. Small or lightweight pieces of shelving units are not securely anchored to the wall;
- 7. Staff member stepped over a barrier/gate while holding a child;
- 8. Chipping or peeling paint;
- 9. Other: charging cord in child's cubby at floor level accessible to children and trash on floors- including orange peels and uneaten food

Correct the violation and submit the program's corrective action plan to verify compliance with the requirement of the rule.

Corrective Action Plan Due: 05/12/2023

Domain: 02 Safe & Sanitary Environment

Rule: 5101:2-13-12 Safe Environment

Code: The program is required to have all outlets and surge protectors covered.



Findings: During the inspection, it was determined that surge protectors or outlets did not have childproof receptacle covers in the playroom right next to child's cot used for sleeping. Correct the violation and submit the program's corrective action plan to verify compliance with the requirement of the rule.

Corrective Action Plan Due: 05/12/2023

Domain: 02 Safe & Sanitary Environment

Rule: 5101:2-13-12 Safe Environment

Code: The program is required to remove toys or other items that may be a choking hazard from infants and toddlers.

Findings: During the inspection, it was determined there were toys or other items, small enough to be swallowed, present in the space where infants or toddlers were in care. Correct the violation and submit the program's corrective action plan to verify compliance with the requirement of the rule.

Corrective Action Plan Due: 05/12/2023

Domain: 02 Safe & Sanitary Environment

Rule: 5101:2-13-13 Clean environment and equipment

Code: The program is required to be kept clean to prevent an infestation of insects or rodents.

Findings: During the inspection, it was determined the program was not kept clean to prevent an infestation by insects or rodents. Ants and gnats observed around rotting oranges and bananas in kitchen.

Submit the program's corrective action plan to verify compliance with the requirements of this rule.

Corrective Action Plan Due: 05/12/2023

Domain: 02 Safe & Sanitary Environment

Rule: 5101:2-13-13 Clean environment and equipment

Code: The program is required to store trash outside of the areas approved for child care.

Findings: During the inspection, it was determined that storage of trash or garbage did not meet the requirement as noted in number 1 below.

- 1. Trash cans/wastebaskets were not emptied daily, or more frequently as needed- trash overflowing in kitchen
- 2. Accumulated trash or garbage was stored in an area approved for child care.

Submit the program's corrective action plan to verify compliance with the requirements of this rule.

Corrective Action Plan Due: 05/12/2023

Domain: 02 Safe & Sanitary Environment

Rule: 5101:2-13-13 Clean environment and equipment

Code: The program is required to have all required items in the restroom(s) and keep them sanitary.

Findings: During the inspection, it was determined that unsanitary conditions, as noted in the following numbers 4 and 6 below, were in the restroom used by children:

- 1. There was no liquid soap.
- 2. There was no toilet tissue.
- 3. There were no individually assigned towels or disposable towels.
- 4. The toilet cleaning brush was accessible to the children.
- 5. The plunger was accessible to the children.
- 6. The toilet was not flushed.
- 7. The trash was not emptied from the day before.
- 8. There was a strong urine odor.
- 9. Other [].

The restroom(s) must be kept sanitary at all times. Submit the program's corrective action plan to verify compliance with the requirement of the rule.

Corrective Action Plan Due: 05/12/2023

Domain: 02 Safe & Sanitary Environment

Rule: 5101:2-13-13 Handwashing

Code: The program staff and residents are required to wash their hands at the appropriate times as outlined in

rule.

Findings: During the inspection, it was determined the handwashing requirements were not being followed by the provider, program staff, or residents in that hands were not washed prior to a diaper change. Submit the program's corrective action plan to verify compliance with the requirements of this rule.

Domain: 02 Safe & Sanitary Environment

Rule: 5101:2-13-12 Safe Environment

Code: The program is required to refrain from using and storing outdoor machinery around children.

Findings: During the inspections, a potentially hazardous substance, which was determined to not present a serious risk to a child, was accessible to children as noted in numbers 1, 2, 4, and 5 below:

- 1. Cosmetics
- 2. Disinfecting wipes
- 3. Fish food
- 4. Hand lotion
- 5. Hand sanitizer (for children under 24 months).
- 6. Laundry detergent
- 7. Powder dish washing soap
- 8. Paint cans
- 9. White out
- 10. Potting soil
- 11. Other potentially hazardous substance []

The potentially hazardous substance was determined to be accessible to children in the following area: bathroom, provider's bedroom to which door was open and children had access, living room and dining area. Correct the violation and submit the program's corrective action plan to verify compliance with the requirement of the rule.

Corrective Action Plan Due: 05/12/2023

Domain: 02 Safe & Sanitary Environment

Rule: 5101:2-13-12 Pets

Code: The program is required to properly care for all pets.

Findings: During the inspection, it was determined that a pet at the program posed a threat to the safety or health of the children, in that children exposed to pet's feces scattered throughout the entire outdoor play areaboth old droppings and fresh droppings. Submit the program's corrective action plan to verify compliance with the requirements of this rule.

Corrective Action Plan Due: 05/12/2023

Domain: 02 Safe & Sanitary Environment

Rule: 5101:2-13-13 Clean environment and equipment

Code: The program is required to follow the cleaning schedule for equipment.

Findings: During the inspection, it was determined that the program was not providing a clean and healthy environment, furniture, materials and equipment as required by Appendix A, as noted in numbers 2, 4 and 6 below:

- 1. The changing table was not sanitized after each use.
- 2. The food prep areas were not being cleaned and sanitized before and after food prep.
- 3. The food prep areas were not being cleaned and sanitized between preparing raw and cooked food.
- 4. Toilet seat(s), handle(s) and toilet bowl(s) were not being cleaned when visibly soiled and sanitized.
- 5. Diaper receptacles were not being cleaned and sanitized.
- 6. The sinks were not cleaned: dirty wet washcloth in bathroom used by children
- 7. Wastebaskets/trash receptacles/rinse buckets were not being cleaned and sanitized when visibly soiled.
- 8. Reusable cloths were not being cleaned daily or when visibly soiled.
- 9. Other [].

Furniture, materials and equipment must be maintained according to the cleaning and sanitizing schedule in Appendix A to this rule. Submit the program's corrective action plan to verify compliance with the requirements of this rule.

Corrective Action Plan Due: 05/12/2023

Domain: 03 Postings & Equipment

Rule: 5101:2-13-17 Materials and Equipment

Code: The program is required to have play materials accessible.

Findings: During the inspection, it was determined that play materials were not accessible/orderly for the following reason(s) as noted in numbers 1 and 2 below:

- 1. Play materials were not readily accessible to the children;
- 2. Play materials were not arranged in an orderly manner so that children have opportunities to select, remove and replace play materials with minimal assistance during the day.

Correct the violation and submit the program's corrective action plan to verify compliance with the requirement of the rule.

Corrective Action Plan Due: 05/12/2023

Domain: 03 Postings & Equipment

Rule: 5101:2-13-17 Programming

Code: The program is required to provide outdoor play as required by rule.

Findings: During the inspection, it was determined that daily outdoor play was not provided as required by rule. Submit the program's corrective action plan to verify compliance with the requirements of this rule.

Corrective Action Plan Due: 05/12/2023

Domain: 04 Indoor/Outdoor Space

Rule: 5101:2-13-11 Outdoor Space

Code: The program staff is required to protect the children from hazardous conditions in the outdoor play area.

Findings: During the inspection, it was determined that the following hazardous conditions existed in the outdoor play area, as noted in number 9 below:

- 1. There was broken glass.
- 2. There were tall weeds.
- 3. There was poison ivy.
- 4. There were tree branches.
- 5. There was mold visible.
- 6. The sandbox was contaminated.
- 7. There were thistles with prickers.
- 8. There were bird droppings.
- 9. Other: blue tubing throughout yard, black water hose across yard, trach scattered throughout outdoor play space, large drain hole- uncovered with standing water, hole dug in yard- tripping hazard

Correct the violation and submit the program's corrective action plan to verify compliance with the requirement of the rule.

Corrective Action Plan Due: 05/12/2023

Domain: 06 Program Information

Rule: 5101:2-13-24 On-site Pools

Code: The provider and program staff are required to make pools on the premises inaccessible to children.

Findings: During the inspection, it was determined a pool was located on the premises and was accessible to children in care as there was no fence or physical barrier as outlined in rule in that the fencing around the pool is loose and could allow a child to push down. Correct the violation and submit the program's corrective action plan to verify compliance with the requirement of the rule.



Domain: 07 Diapering & Infant Care

Rule: 5101:2-13-20 Crib and Playpen Requirements

Code: The program is required to refrain from using a crib that is assigned to a child for storage.

Findings: During the inspection, it was determined that a crib/playpen, assigned to a child, was used for storage. Correct the violation and submit the program's corrective action plan to verify compliance with the requirement of the rule.

Corrective Action Plan Due: 05/12/2023

Domain: 07 Diapering & Infant Care

Rule: 5101:2-13-23 Infant Daily Care

Code: The program is required to provide a daily written record for each infant in care to the parents when picking up the infant each day.

Findings: During the inspection, it was observed that the form used to document infant routines and activities, as required by this rule, was incomplete in that the required information regarding 3 was missing from the form:

- 1. Food intake;
- 2. Sleeping patterns;
- 3. Times and results of diaper changes;
- 4. Information about daily activities.

Submit the program's corrective action plan to verify compliance with the requirements of this rule.

Corrective Action Plan Due: 05/12/2023

Domain: 07 Diapering & Infant Care

Rule: 5101:2-13-23 Infant Bottle and Food Preparation

Code: The program staff is required to have all bottles labeled.

Findings: During the inspection, it was determined that bottles containing formula for a particular infant were not labeled with the child's name and date of preparation. Submit the program's corrective action plan to verify compliance with the requirements of this rule.



Domain: 07 Diapering & Infant Care

Rule: 5101:2-13-20 Crib and Playpen Requirements

Code: The program is required to remove objects from cribs/playpens that could block the child.

Findings: During the inspection, it was determined that a child had been place in a crib or playpen with the following number 4 below which could obstruct a provider or child care staff member's view of the infant:

- 1. Busy box or other toy attached to the side of the crib or playpen.
- 2. A blanket hanging over the side of the crib or playpen.
- 3. Stuffed animal that is not large/soft enough that it could conform to the shape of the child's face.
- 4. Other: diaper changing attachment

Correct the violation and submit the program's corrective action plan to verify compliance with the requirement of the rule.

Corrective Action Plan Due: 05/12/2023

Domain: 07 Diapering & Infant Care

Rule: 5101:2-13-20 Crib and Playpen Requirements

Code: The program is required to ensure that each mattress has a properly fitted sheet.

Findings: During the inspection, it was determined that sheets did not meet the rule requirement as noted in number 3 below.

- 1. At least one crib or playpen did not have a sheet no sheets on crib or two playpens
- 2. At least one sheet was too large.
- 3. At least one sheet was too small.
- 4. Sheet was torn.

Correct the violation and submit the program's corrective action plan to verify compliance with the requirement of the rule.

Corrective Action Plan Due: 05/12/2023

Domain: 07 Diapering & Infant Care

Rule: 5101:2-13-23 Diapering

Code: The program staff is required to have adequate supplies for diapering available.

Findings: During the inspection, it was determined the required supplies were not available for diaper changing as noted in the following number 1 below:

- 1. There was no disposable separation material;
- 2. There was no germicidal solution for sanitizing;

- 3. There were no plastic containers or bags for the storage of soiled clothing;
- 4. There was no clean supply of diapers;
- 5. There was no extra change of clothing;
- 6. Other [].

Submit the program's corrective action plan to verify compliance with the requirements of this rule.

Corrective Action Plan Due: 05/12/2023

Domain: 08 Staff Files

Rule: 5101:2-13-10 Health Training

Code: The program is required to meet the health training requirements.

Findings: In review of records, it was determined the provider did not have current valid documentation for training listed in number 14 below:

- 1. First Aid expired training
- 2. First Aid did not have verification of the completion of First Aid training
- 3. First Aid documentation did not demonstrate the person who provided the training met the trainer qualifications as stated in the rule
- 4. CPR expired training
- 5. CPR had not taken CPR training
- 6. CPR did not have verification of the completion of CPR training
- 7. CPR training taken did not include all age groups and developmental levels of all children in care
- 8. CPR documentation did not demonstrate the person who provided the training met the trainer qualifications as stated in the rule
- 9. CPR- audiovisual or electronic media training taken did not include an in-person component of the training
- 10. Communicable Disease expired training
- 11. Communicable Disease had not taken CD training
- 12. Communicable Disease did not have verification of the completion of CD training
- 13. Communicable Disease documentation did not demonstrate the person who provided the training met the trainer qualifications as stated in the rule
- 14. Child Abuse expired training
- 15. Child Abuse had not taken Child Abuse training
- 16. Child Abuse documentation did not demonstrate the person who provided the training met the trainer qualifications as stated in the rule

Correct the violation and submit the documentation of current certification with the program's corrective action plan to verify compliance with the requirement of the rule.

Domain: 09 Children's Files

Rule: 5101:2-13-15 Child Medical and Enrollment Records

Code: The program is required to have a completed medical on file for each child.

Findings: In review of of the children's records, it was determined that completed medical statements were not on file, as required, for children listed on the JFS Children's Record Review For Child Care as indicated in number 6 below

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- 1. No medical was on file for at least one child
- 2. Medical(s) on file was not updated every 13 months
- 3. Medical(s) were missing child's name and date of birth
- 4. Medical(s) were missing the date of the medical examination
- 5. The date of the exam was more than 13 months prior to the date the form was signed
- 6. Medical(s) were missing a statement that the child has been examined and is in suitable condition for participation in group care
- 7. Medical(s) were missing the signature, business address and telephone number of the physician, physician's assistant(PA), advance practice nurse (APN) or certified

nurse practitioner (CNP) who examined the child

- 8. Medical(s) were missing a record of immunizations the child has had specifying month, day and year
- 9. Medical(s) were missing a statement from the physician, PA, APN, or CNP that the child has been immunized or is in the process of being immunized against the diseases

required by division 5104.014 of the Revised Code and found in appendix A to this rule

10. Medical(s) were missing a statement from the child's parent or guardian that he or she has declined to have the child immunized against the disease for reasons of

conscience, including religious convictions
