Domain:01 Ratio & Supervision

Rule: 5180:2-12-19 Supervision

Code: The program staff is required to protect or remove a child from a situation and/or person that are determined to be unsafe or inappropriate.

Allegation: Child care staff members allowing unsafe behaviors

Determination: Substantiated

Findings: During the inspection, it was determined the administrator, child care staff, and/or employees of the program did not protect or remove children from a situation and/or person determined to be unsafe or inappropriate as noted in number(s) 2 below:

- 1. Verbal argument involving adults.
- 2. Staff member(s) allowed child(ren) to do something unsafe. At different times, children were able to climb on furniture, jump off shelves, and throw chairs.
- 3. Staff member(s) did something unsafe.
- 4. Children were exposed to inappropriate [language; conversation; behavior; video; music; DVD] by a [staff member/child/parent].
- 5. Other

While the program did not protect the child(ren) from an unsafe or inappropriate situation and/or person, it was determined the situation would not or did not result in a serious incident or injury to a child. All program employees must take actions to protect children in care. Provide staff training. Submit the program's corrective action plan, which includes a statement that training was provided, to the Department to verify compliance with the requirements of this rule.

Domain:01 Ratio & Supervision

Rule: 5180:2-12-19 Child Guidance

Code: The program staff shall use developmentally appropriate techniques when managing children's behavior. Corporal punishment is prohibited, as well as any cruel, harsh, unusual or extreme techniques.

Allegation: Child care staff member used inappropriate guidance techniques.

Determination: Substantiated

Findings: During the inspection, it was determined that a Child Care Staff Member had used the inappropriate techniques in number(s) 5 below when managing unacceptable behavior in children:

- 1. Utilize cruel, harsh, unusual, or extreme techniques;
- 2. Utilize any form of corporal punishment;
- 3. Delegate children to manage or discipline other children;



- 4. Use physical restraints on a child;
- 5. Restrain a child by prone restraint or any means other than holding children for a short period of time, such as in a protective hug, so that the children may regain control; during nap time, a child care staff member placed their leg over the legs of a child.
- 6. Place children in a locked room or confine children in any enclosed area;
- 7. Confine children to equipment such as cribs or highchairs;
- 8. Humiliate, threaten or frighten children;
- 9. Subject children to profane language or verbal abuse;
- 10. Make derogatory or sarcastic remarks about children or their families;
- 11. Punish children for failure to eat or sleep or for toileting accidents;
- 12. Withhold any food (including snacks and treats), rest or toilet use;
- 13. Punish an entire group of children due to the unacceptable behavior of one or a few;
- 14. Isolate and restrict children from all activities for an extended period of time.

Child Care Staff Members and other employees must always use appropriate guidance and management methods with children. Provide staff training. Submit the program's corrective action plan, which includes a statement that training was provided, to the Department to verify compliance with the requirements of this rule.

Domain:05 Health & Safety

Rule: 5180:2-12-16 Management of Communicable Disease

Code: The program is required to notify the parent of any child who is exhibiting symptoms of an illness.

Allegation: Communicable Disease rules not followed.

Determination: Substantiated

Findings: During the inspection, it was determined that procedures for isolating a child due to a suspected communicable disease were not followed for the requirement(s) listed in number(s) 2 below:

- 1. Within sight and hearing of a staff member at all times
- 2. Cared for in another room or portion of a room away from other children
- 3. Provided with a cot or mat
- 4. After use, cot or mat was not properly sanitized

Low Risk Non-Compliances

Domain:07 Diapering & Infant Care

Rule: 5180:2-12-20 Cribs

Code: The program is required to provide appropriate separation for cribs by using dividers.

Findings: During the inspection, it was determined that the dividers used to separate the cribs did not meet the following requirement in number(s) 1 below:

- 1. Did not provide for at least two feet of space on two of the sides or ends of the crib.
- 2. Constructed so that staff may view children through or around the divider.
- 3. Be unbreakable in normal use situations.
- 4. Be made of a non-porous material that can be easily sanitized.
- 5. Extend up higher than an infant standing in a crib can reach up and shall not impede child care staff member's ability to hear the child.
