Rule: 5180:2-13-03 Inspection Requirements

Code: The program is required to respond to all non-compliances by the date noted in the inspection report.

Findings: During the inspection, it was determined the program had not responded to the non-compliances addressed in the inspection report dated 08/01/2024. The rule requires the program complete and submit a



corrective action plan in OCLQS to address non-compliances detailed in written inspection reports within the timeframe outlined in the report. Submit the program's corrective action plan, which includes a statement that current and future corrective action plans will be submitted timely, to the Department to verify compliance with the requirements of this rule.

Rule: 5180:2-13-18 Attendance

Code: The program is required to maintain a record of the arrival and departure of each child. The program is also required to retain the original attendance record at the program for a period of one year.

Findings: During the inspection, it was determined the program did not meet the requirements for keeping an attendance record as listed in number(s) #1 below:

- 1. No attendance record was being maintained.
- 2. The attendance record was not being consistently completed.
- 3. The record did not include the name of at least one child.
- 4. The record did not include the birth date of at least one child.
- 5. The record did not include the assigned group.
- 6. The record did not include the child's weekly schedule.
- 7. The record did not include the time (hours and minutes) of each child's arrival and departure to the program, including transportation by the program.
- 8. The original attendance record was not kept at the program for a period of one year.

Submit the program's corrective action plan to the Department to verify compliance with the requirements of this rule.

Domain: 02 Safe & Sanitary Environment

Rule: 5180:2-13-12 Safe Environment

Code: The program is required to have running water below the temperature of 120 degrees Fahrenheit.

Findings: During the inspection, it was determined the water temperature was 140 degrees in the following room(s) Restroom. This temperature exceeds the requirement of remaining below 120 degrees Fahrenheit. Correct the violation and submit the program's corrective action plan to verify compliance with the requirement of the rule.

Domain: 02 Safe & Sanitary Environment

Rule: 5180:2-13-12 Safe Environment

Code: The program is required to store cleaning and sanitizing supplies in a place that is inaccessible to children. Cleaning agents, aerosol cans and chemical substances must be stored in their original container or clearly labeled. School-age children may use cleaning supplies and equipment with adult supervision.

Findings: During the inspection, cleaning and sanitizing equipment and supplies were not used or stored properly as noted in number(s) #4 and #15 below:

- 1. Cosmetics were accessible to children in the [] area.
- 2. Disinfecting wipes were accessible to children in the [] area.
- 3. Fish food was accessible to children in the [] area.
- 4. Hand lotion was accessible to children in the restroom area.
- 5. Hand sanitizer (for children under 24 months) was accessible to children in the [] area.
- 6. Laundry detergent was accessible to children in the [] area.
- 7. Powder dish washing soap was accessible to children in the [] area.
- 8. Paint cans were accessible to children in the [] area.
- 9. White out was accessible to children in the [] area.
- 10. Potting Soil was accessible to children in the [] area.
- 11. Other potentially hazardous substance [] was accessible to children in the [] area.
- 12. Cleaning/sanitizing supplies had not been clearly labeled.
- 13. School-age children were using cleaning supplies, agents and/or equipment without adult supervision.
- 14. A spray aerosol was used in the [] group while children were in attendance.
- 15. Other: (In restroom area, the sink cabinet drawers also had a shaving razor and a pair of hair clippers accessible. In kitchen area, air wick aerosol spray was accessible)

Provide staff training. Submit the program's corrective action plan, which includes a statement that the potentially hazardous substance is no longer accessible to children and a statement that training was provided, to the Department to verify compliance with the requirements of this rule.

Rule: 5180:2-13-11 Outdoor Space

Code: The program is required to have an outdoor play space free from immediate risk.

Findings: During the inspection, it was determined that an outdoor play area was used which was not protected from traffic and other hazards by a fence in good repair, or other barrier. Although the fence or natural barrier was not meeting the rule requirements, it was determined to not present an immediate risk for a child to be able to leave the playground. The fence or gate was not in good repair and/or being used inappropriately as noted in number(s) #2 below:

- 1. The fencing had missing slat boards.
- 2. The fencing was broken.
- 3. The fencing was loose.



- 4. The fencing was rotting.
- 5. The gate was broken and did not close.
- 6. The gate was locked.
- 7. The latch on the gate was broken.
- 8. The latch was easily opened by children on the playground.
- 9. The latch was not engaged to prevent children from opening the gate.
- 10. The gate had no latch.
- 11. There were bolts with more than two threads exposed along a fence line or gate on a playground.

Findings: During the inspection, it was determined that the program's weekly menu did not meet the requirement as noted in number(s) #1 below.

- 1. The menu was not posted.
- 2. The posted menu was not in a visible place readily accessible to parents.
- 3. The menu was not currently dated.
- 4. The entire menu was substituted.
- 5. At least one item on menu did not match what was served.
- 6. The meal or snack served did not match the posted menu.

Submit the program's corrective action plan to verify compliance with the requirement of the rule.

Corrective Action Plan Due: 03/07/2025

Domain: 07 Diapering & Infant Care

Rule: 5180:2-13-23 Infant Daily Care

Code: The program is required to provide a daily written record for each infant in care to the parents when picking up the infant each day.

Findings: During the inspection, it was determined that the written record used to document infant routines and activities did not meet the requirements as noted in number(s) #1 below:

1. A daily written record was not provided to the parent or person picking up the infant on a daily basis.



- 2. Food intake was missing.
- 3. Sleeping patterns was missing.
- 4. Times and results of diaper changes was missing.
- 5. Information about daily activities was missing.

Submit the program's corrective action plan to verify compliance with the requirements of this rule.

Corrective Action Plan Due: 03/07/2025

Domain: 07 Diapering & Infant Care

Rule: 5180:2-13-23 Infant Bottle and Food Preparation

Code: The program is required to retain and update infant feeding instructions.

Findings: During the inspection, it was determined that written instructions for feeding the infants noted on the Children Record Review form were not on file, as required by this rule. Correct the violation and submit the program's corrective action plan to verify compliance with the requirement of the rule.

Domain: 08 Staff Files

Rule: 5180:2-13-07 Provider Responsibilities

Code: The provider is required to maintain the required liability insurance or have a completed JFS 01933 "Liability Insurance Statement for Family Child Care Providers" on file for each child in care.

Findings: During the inspection, it was determined the provider did not have a completed JFS 01933 "Liability Insurance Statement for Family Child Care Providers" completed for each child in care. Correct the violation and submit proof of insurance with the program's corrective action plan to verify compliance with the requirement of the rule.

Rule: 5180:2-13-10 Health Training

Code: The program is required to meet the health training requirements.

Findings: In review of records, it was determined the provider did not have current valid documentation for training(s) listed in number(s) #1 and #4 below:

- 1. First Aid expired training
- 2. First Aid did not have verification of the completion of First Aid training



- 3. First Aid documentation did not demonstrate the person who provided the training met the trainer qualifications as stated in the rule
- 4. CPR expired training
- 5. CPR had not taken CPR training
- 6. CPR did not have verification of the completion of CPR training
- 7. CPR training taken did not include all age groups and developmental levels of all children in care
- 8. CPR documentation did not demonstrate the person who provided the training met the trainer qualifications as stated in the rule
- 9. CPR- audiovisual or electronic media training taken did not include an in-person component of the training
- 10. Communicable Disease expired training
- 11. Communicable Disease had not taken CD training
- 12. Communicable Disease did not have verification of the completion of CD training
- 13. Communicable Disease documentation did not demonstrate the person who provided the training met the trainer qualifications as stated in the rule
- 14. Child Abuse expired training
- 15. Child Abuse had not taken Child Abuse training
- 16. Child Abuse documentation did not demonstrate the person who provided the training met the trainer qualifications as stated in the rule

Correct the violation and submit the documentation of current certification with the program's corrective action plan to verify compliance with the requirement of the rule.
