Low Risk Non-Compliances

Domain: 04 Indoor/Outdoor Space

Rule: 5101:2-13-11 Outdoor Space

Code: The program is required to have an outdoor play space free from immediate risk.

Findings: During the inspection, it was determined that an area was used which was not protected from traffic and other hazards by a continuous fence or natural barrier that ensured children were not able to leave the playground area. The fence or natural barrier was determined to not present an immediate risk for a child to be able to leave the program as noted in number10 below:

- 1. The fence, natural barrier, or combination of a fence and natural barrier was not continuous.
- 2. The fencing had missing slat boards through which children could leave the program.
- 3. The fencing was broken.
- 4. The fencing was loose.
- 5. The fencing was rotting.
- 6. The gate was broken and did not close.
- 7. The latch on the gate was broken.
- 8. The latch was easily opened by children on the playground.
- 9. The gate had no latch.
- 10. Other, the fence panel was on the ground giving access to the swimming pool. FCC Provider currently does not go outside due to having an infant.

Discontinue use of the playground and provide a space for outdoor play which is well defined by a continuous fence or natural barrier and protected from other hazards. Submit the program's corrective action plan to the Department to verify compliance with the requirements of this rule.

Rule: 5101:2-13-16 Disaster Plan

Code: The program is required to have a completed written disaster plan.

Findings: During the inspection, it was determined the program's written disaster plan did not meet the requirement or was missing the information in numbers 1-19 below:

Procedures:

- 1. The written disaster plan had not been completed
- 2. The plan was not provided to all child care staff and employees
- 3. Weather emergencies and natural disasters which include severe thunderstorms, tornadoes, flash flooding, major snowfall, blizzards, ice storms or earthquakes
- 4. Emergency outdoor and indoor lockdown or evacuation due to threats of violence which includes active shooter, bioterrorism or terrorism
- 5. Emergency or disaster evacuations due to hazardous materials and spills, gas leaks or bomb threats.
- 6. Outbreaks, epidemics or other infectious disease emergencies
- 7. Loss of power, water, or heat
- 8. Other threatening situations that may pose a health or safety hazard to the children in the program Details:
- 9. Shelter in place or evacuation, how the program will care for and account for the children until they can be reunited with the parent
- 10. Assisting infants and children with special needs and/or health conditions
- 11. Emergency contact information for parents and the program

- 12. Procedures for notifying and communicating with parents regarding the location of the children if evacuated
- 13. Procedures for communicating with parents during loss of communications, no phone or internet service available
- 14. The location of supplies and procedures for gathering necessary supplies for staff and children if required to shelter in place
- 15. What to do if a disaster occurs during the transport of children or when on a field trip or routine trip
- 16. Making the plan available to all child care staff members and employees
- 17. Training of staff or reassignment of staff duties as appropriate
- 18. Updating the plan on a yearly basis
- 19. Contact with local emergency management officials

Add the missing information to the disaster plan. Submit the program's corrective action plan, which includes the missing information, to the Department to verify compliance with the requirements of this rule. During inspection changes were reviewed with provider and update according to rule.

Rule: 5101:2-13-20 Crib and Playpen Requirements

Code: The program is required to remove objects from cribs/playpens that could block the child.

Findings: During the inspection, it was determined that a child had been place in a crib or playpen with the following number 2 below which could obstruct a provider or child care staff member's view of the infant:

- 1. Busy box or other toy attached to the side of the crib or playpen.
- 2. A blanket hanging over the side of the crib or playpen.
- 3. Stuffed animal that is not large/soft enough that it could conform to the shape of the child's face.
- 4. Other []

Correct the violation and submit the program's corrective action plan to verify compliance with the requirement of the rule. During inspection 2 blankets were hanging over the side of the crib and removed during inspection.

Rule: 5101:2-13-23 Infant Bottle and Food Preparation

Code: The program is required to have breast milk labeled and stored appropriately.

Findings: During the inspection, it was determined that breast milk provided by the parent was not stored appropriately as noted in number 1 below.

- 1. Not labeled with infant's name, date pumped, and date bottle was prepared;
- 2. Not immediately refrigerated or frozen;
- 3. Stored at room temperature longer than eight hours;

- 4. Stored at the provider for more than five days after it was expressed;
- 5. Stored longer than two weeks in the freezer compartment of the refrigerator;
- 6. Stored longer than six months in the refrigerator/freezer;
- 7. Stored longer than twelve months in the deep freezer.

Submit the program's corrective action plan to verify compliance with the requirements of this rule.

Domain: 07 Diapering & Infant Care

Rule: 5101:2-13-23 Infant Daily Care

Code: The program is required to provide a daily written record for each infant in care to the parents when

picking up the infant each day.

Findings: During the inspection, it was observed that the form used to document infant routines and activities, as required by this rule, was incomplete in that the required information regarding 1-4 was missing from the form:

- 1. Food intake;
- 2. Sleeping patterns;
- 3. Times and results of diaper changes;
- 4. Information about daily activities.

Submit the program's corrective action plan to verify compliance with the requirements of this rule. Form was incomplete during inspection.

Rule: 5101:2-13-23 Infant Bottle and Food Preparation

Code: The program staff is required to have all bottles labeled.

Findings: During the inspection, it was determined that bottles containing [milk/formula] for a particular infant were not labeled with the child's name and date of preparation. Submit the program's corrective action plan to verify compliance with the requirements of this rule.

Rule: 5101:2-13-15 Child Medical and Enrollment Records



Code: The program is required to have a completed medical on file for each child.

Findings: In review of of the children's records, it was determined that completed medical statements were not on file, as required, for children listed on the JFS Children's Record Review For Child Care as indicated in number 1 below

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- 1. No medical was on file for at least one child
- 2. Medical(s) on file was not updated every 13 months
- 3. Medical(s) were missing child's name and date of birth
- 4. Medical(s) were missing the date of the medical examination
- 5. The date of the exam was more than 13 months prior to the date the form was signed
- 6. Medical(s) were missing a statement that the child has been examined and is in suitable condition for participation in group care
- 7. Medical(s) were missing the signature, business address and telephone number of the physician, physician's assistant(PA), advance practice nurse (APN) or certified

nurse practitioner (CNP) who examined the child

- 8. Medical(s) were missing a record of immunizations the child has had specifying month, day and year
- 9. Medical(s) were missing a statement from the physician, PA, APN, or CNP that the child has been immunized or is in the process of being immunized against the diseases

10. Medical(s) were missing a statement from the child's parent or guardian that he or she has declined to have the child immunized against the disease for reasons of

conscience, including religious convictions
