- 20. A mercury thermometer was being used to take a child's temperature.
- 21. Methods of ventilation used did not provide protection from rodents, insects, or other hazards.

- 1. The fall surface material had not been properly distributed, turned over or raked as needed.
- 2. The fall surface material was not being used according to manufacturer's guidelines for its use as a fall surface.

Although the fence or natural barrier was not meeting the rule requirements, it was determined to not present an immediate risk for a child to be able to leave the playground. The fence or gate was not in good repair and/or being used inappropriately as noted in number(s) 5 below:

- 1. The fencing had missing slat boards.
- 2. The fencing was broken.

- 5. The gate was broken and did not close.

- 11. There were bolts with more than two threads exposed along a fence line or gate on a playground.

- 6. The written permission was missing the signature of the parent.
- 7. The written permission was missing the date on which the permission was signed.
- 8. The written permission was missing a statement notifying parents how their child will be transported.
- 9. Permission forms for routine trips were not being updated annually.
- 10. Written parental permission forms for field trips and/or routine trips were not being maintained on file for at least one year from the date of the trip.
