#### Moderate Risk Non-Compliances

##### Domain: 07 Diapering & Infant Care

Rule: 5101:2-13-20 Crib and Playpen Requirements

Code: The program staff is required to place infants in a crib or playpen on their back to sleep unless a JFS 01235 "Sleep Position Waiver Statement for Child Care" is on file.

Findings: During the inspection, it was determined that an infant was not placed on their back to sleep and did not have a JFS 01235 "Sleep Position Waiver Statement for Child Care" on file. Correct the violation and submit the program's corrective action plan to verify compliance with the requirement of the rule.

Corrective Action Plan Due: 10/26/2022

##### Domain: 08 Staff Files

Rule: 5101:2-13-09 Background Checks

Code: The program is required to have background checks for all staff and residents over 18 years of age.

Findings: In review of staff records, it was determined that background checks were not requested for the persons listed on the Employee Record Chart as noted in number 1 below:

1. Submitting the request for a background check for child care in the OPR;
2. Submitting fingerprints electronically according to the process established by the BCI.

### Low Risk Non-Compliances

#### Domain: 00 License & Approvals

Rule: 5101:2-13-03 Inspection Requirements

Code: The program is required to respond to all non-compliances by the date noted in the inspection report.

Findings: During the inspection, it was determined the program had not responded to all the non-compliances addressed in the inspection report dated 4/4/2022. The rule requires the program complete and submit a corrective action plan in OCLQS to address non-compliances detailed in written inspection reports within the timeframe outlined in the report. Submit the program's corrective action plan, which includes a statement that current and future corrective action plans will be submitted timely, to the Department to verify compliance with the requirements of this rule.

#### Domain: 01 Ratio & Supervision

Rule: 5101:2-13-18 Attendance

Code: The program is required to have a tracking method for children.

Findings: During the inspection, it was determined that the method for tracking the children in the group did not meet the requirements in rule as noted in the number 5 below:

1. There was no method in place.
2. The method did not include each child's name.
3. The method did not include each child's birthdate.
4. The tracking method did not remain with the group at all times.
5. The tracking method was not updated throughout the day as children entered or left the group.

Submit the program's corrective action plan to verify compliance with the requirements of this rule.

**Domain: 02 Safe & Sanitary Environment**

Rule: 5101:2-13-12 Safe Environment

Code: The program is required to refrain from using and storing outdoor machinery around children.

Findings: During the inspections, a potentially hazardous substance, which was determined to not present a serious risk to a child, was accessible to children as noted in numbers 8 & 11 below:

1. Cosmetics
2. Disinfecting wipes
3. Fish food
4. Hand lotion
5. Hand sanitizer (for children under 24 months).
6. Laundry detergent
7. Powder dish washing soap
8. Paint cans
9. White out
10. Potting soil
11. Plug-in in hallway

The potentially hazardous substance was determined to be accessible to children in the following area: Hallway & basement

Correct the violation and submit the program's corrective action plan to verify compliance with the requirement of the rule.

**Domain: 02 Safe & Sanitary Environment**

Rule: 5101:2-13-12 Safe Environment

Code: The program is required to protect children in care from items and conditions that threaten their health, safety, and well being.

Findings: Children in care shall be protected from any items and conditions which threaten their health, safety, and well being. During the inspection, it was determined that children were not protected from the following item which may threaten their health, safety, or well being as noted in the following number 9 below:

1. Telephone cords;
2. Stacked chairs;
3. Employee(s) purse(s);
4. Diaper bags;
5. Television not securely anchored;
6. Small or lightweight pieces of shelving units are not securely anchored to the wall;
7. Staff member stepped over a barrier/gate while holding a child;
8. Chipping or peeling paint;



9. knife block on counter

Correct the violation and submit the program's corrective action plan to verify compliance with the requirement of the rule.

Corrective Action Plan Due: 10/26/2022

**Domain: 03 Postings & Equipment**

Rule: 5101:2-13-16 Medical, Dental, and General Emergency Plan

Code: The program is required to post the completed JFS 01242 "Medical, Dental, and General Emergency Plan for Child Care" and implement as required by rule.

Findings: During the inspection, it was determined the requirements for the JFS 01242 "Medical, Dental and General Emergency Plan" were not followed as noted in number 7 below:

1. The plan was not posted on each level of the home used for child care.
2. The name, address and telephone number of the program were not complete.
3. The location of the first aid kit, fire extinguisher and fire alarm system, fire alarm pull stations and electrical circuit box were not complete.
4. The telephone number for emergency squad, fire department hospital, poison control program, public children services agency, local health department, local emergency management agency and police department were not complete.
5. Location of children's records was not complete.
6. Emergency information including any medications or supplies needed in the event of an evacuation was not complete.
7. The current version of the prescribed form was not used.
8. The plan was not implemented when necessary in that [ ].

Submit the program's corrective action plan to the Department to verify compliance with the requirements of this rule.

Corrective Action Plan Due: 10/26/2022

**Domain: 03 Postings & Equipment**

Rule: 5101:2-13-16 Medical, Dental, and General Emergency Plan

Code: The program is required to post the completed JFS 01201 "Dental First Aid" and implement as required by rule.

Findings: During the inspection, it was determined the updated JFS 01201 "Dental First Aid" was not completed. Correct the violation and submit the program's corrective action plan to verify compliance with the requirement of the rule.



Corrective Action Plan Due: 10/26/2022

**Domain: 07 Diapering & Infant Care**

Rule: 5101:2-13-23 Infant Daily Care

Code: The program staff is required to provide a daily written record for each infant in care.

Findings: During the inspection, it was determined that there was no daily written record filled out for each infant provided to the parent or person picking up the infant on a daily basis. Submit the program's corrective action plan to verify compliance with the requirements of this rule.

Corrective Action Plan Due: 10/26/2022

**Domain: 07 Diapering & Infant Care**

Rule: 5101:2-13-23 Infant Bottle and Food Preparation

Code: The program staff is required to have all bottles labeled.

Findings: During the inspection, it was determined that bottles containing formula for a particular infant were not labeled with the child's name and date of preparation. Submit the program's corrective action plan to verify compliance with the requirements of this rule.

Corrective Action Plan Due: 10/26/2022

**Domain: 08 Staff Files**

Rule: 5101:2-13-07 Provider Responsibilities

Code: The provider is required to have hours of availability to meet with parents posted in a noticeable place.

Findings: During the inspection, it was determined that the provider did not have hours of availability to meet with parents in a noticeable location. Correct the violation and submit the program's corrective action plan to verify compliance with the requirement of the rule.

Corrective Action Plan Due: 10/26/2022

**Domain: 09 Children's Files**

Rule: 5101:2-13-15 Child Medical and Enrollment Records

Code: The program is required to have a completed JFS 01234 "Child Enrollment and Health Information for Child Care" on file on the premises for each child.



Findings: In review of the children's records, it was determined that information had not been secured from the parent or guardian on the JFS 01234 "Child Enrollment and Health Information For Child Care", as required, for the items in numbers 2,4,6,10 & 13 below:

1. No enrollment form was completed for at least one child
2. The current JFS 01234 was not completed for at least one child
3. Complete child information
4. Complete parent information
5. Complete emergency contact information
6. Complete physician information
7. Information regarding the parent list
8. Health information
9. Additional information for all boxes checked "yes"
10. Emergency transportation information
11. Parent/guardian's signature
12. Diapering Statement
13. Acknowledgement of Policies and Procedures
14. Enrollment form for at least one child was not updated by either the parent or the administrator
15. Enrollment form for at least one child was not signed by the administrator
16. The current

**Domain: 10 Written Policies & Procedures**

Rule: 5101:2-13 Written Policies and Procedures

Code: The program's written policies and procedures are to be given to all parents and employees and be available at the program.

Findings: During the inspection, it was determined the updated written policies and procedures were not available at the program as required. A copy must be made available onsite for review. Submit the program's corrective action plan to verify compliance with this rule.

Corrective Action Plan Due: 10/26/2022

**Domain: 10 Written Policies & Procedures**

Rule: 5101:2-13 Written Policies and Procedures

Code: The program is required to have policies and procedures for all items listed in this rule.



Findings: On the day of the inspection, the program's written policies and procedures provided to the parents/guardians and employees was missing item number 15 below:

#### General Information

1. Name, address, email address and telephone number.
2. Description of the provider's program philosophy.
3. Days and hours of operation, scheduled closings and basic daily schedule.
4. Staff/child ratios and group size.
5. Opportunities for parent involvement in activities.
6. Opportunities for parents to meet with the provider regarding their child.
7. Payment schedule, overtime charges and registration fees if applicable.
8. Programs shall have a policy in place describing supports for onsite breastfeeding or pumping for mothers who wish to do so (if the program serves infants or toddlers).

#### Provider Policies and Procedures

9. Enrollment including required enrollment information.
10. Care of children without immunizations.
11. Attendance including procedures for arrival and departure, the program's absent day policy, releasing child to persons other than the parent, releasing a child according to a custody agreement and follow up when a child scheduled to arrive from another program or activity does not arrive.
12. Supervision of children, including a separate supervision policy for school-age children, if applicable.
13. Child guidance.
14. Suspension and expulsion.
15. Ensure compliance with the Americans and Disabilities (ADA) including administering medication to children with disabilities and administering care procedures for children with disabilities.
16. Outdoor play, including limitations placed on outdoor play due to weather or safety issues (considerations may include but are not limited to temperature, humidity, wind chill, ozone levels, pollen count, lightning, rain or ice).
17. Food and dietary policy, including information regarding meeting one-third of the child's recommended daily dietary allowance, policy regarding formula, breast milk, meals, and snacks and policy on providing supplemental food.
18. Management of illness including isolation precautions, symptoms for discharge and return, notification of parent of ill child and whether or not the provider will care for sick children.
19. Summary of procedures taken in the event of an emergency, serious illness or injury.
20. Administration of medication and topical products policy, medical foods, modified diets, and whether school age children are permitted to carry their own medical and ointments.
21. Transportation policy for field trips, routine walks, if applicable, and emergencies including if the provider will provide child care services to children whose parents refuse to grant consent for transportation to the source of emergency treatment.
22. Water activities/swimming.
23. Infant care, if applicable, including feeding, frequency of diaper checks, and information about daily activities.
24. Sleeping, napping and resting.
25. Evening and overnight care, if applicable.
26. Policy on hours of operation, closing due to weather, school delays or closings and any other factors.
27. Use of a substitute child care staff member or child care staff member pursuant to 5101:2-13-08 of the Administrative Code for sick days, vacations or other time off.
28. Situations that may require disenrollment of a child, if applicable.





29. Problem or issue resolution for parents or employees to follow when needing assistance in resolving problems related to the family child care home.  
30. Formal screenings and assessments conducted on enrolled children and if the program reports child level data to ODJFS pursuant to Chapter 5101:2-17 of the Administrative Code.

Correct the violation and submit the program's corrective action plan to verify compliance with the requirement of the rule.
